At this Parish Council's recent PC Meeting, Members decided that they would like – for historical reasons – to retain the current Ward arrangements.

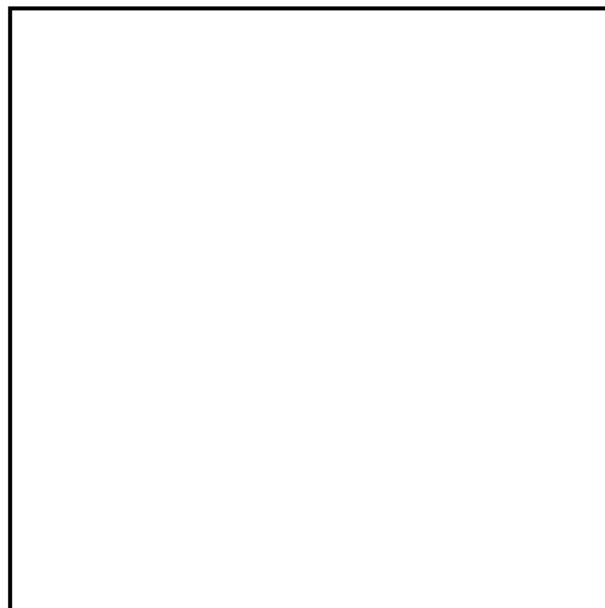
It is hoped that this will be taken into account when considering the Ward Boundaries.

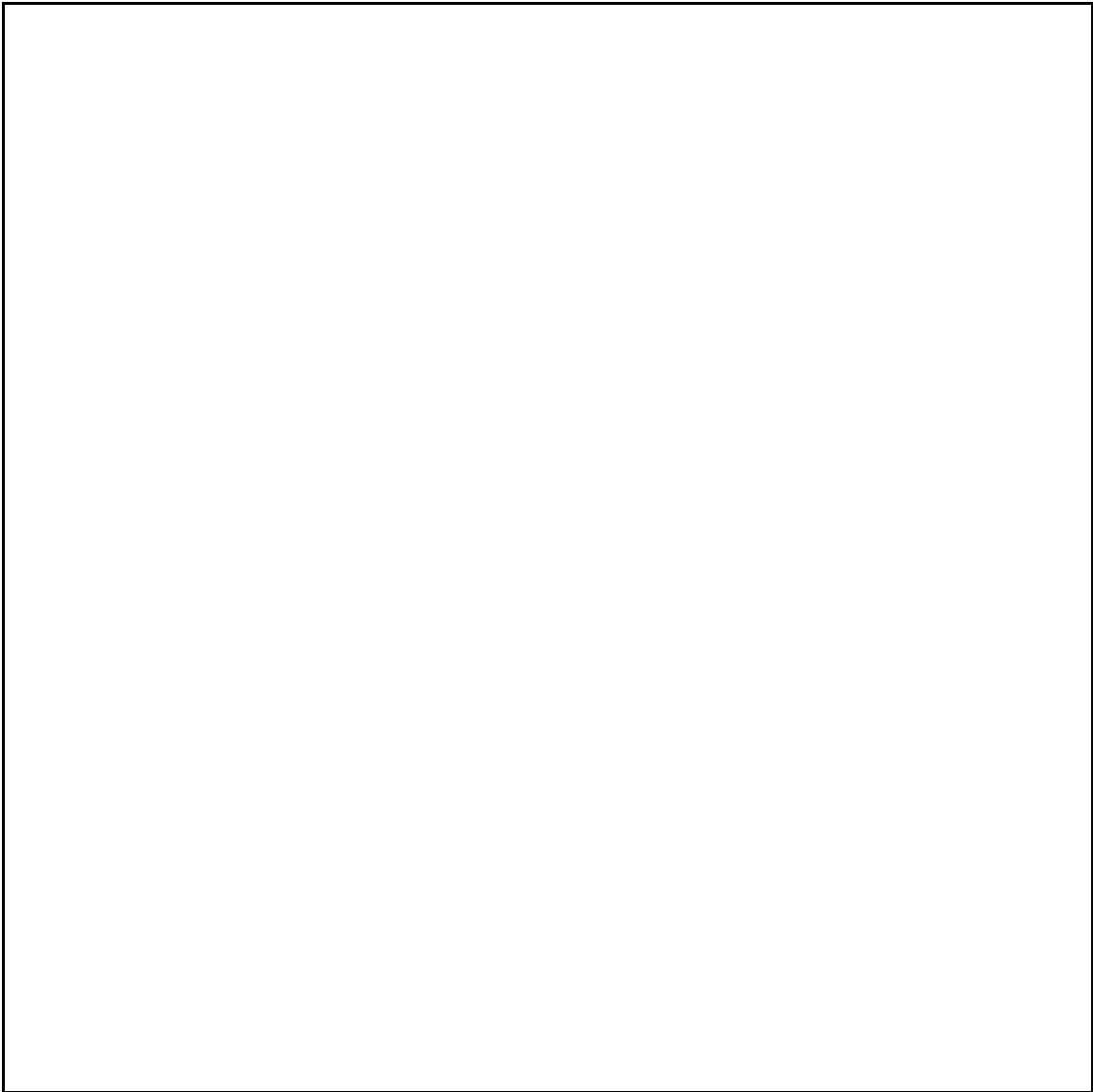

We will weigh each submission against the criteria the Commission must follow when drawing up electoral arrangements:

- To deliver electoral equality where each councillor represents roughly the same number of electors as others across Babergh.
- That the pattern of wards should, as far as possible, reflect the interests and identities of local communities.
- That the electoral arrangements should provide for effective and convenient local government.

It is important that you take account of the criteria if you are suggesting an alternative pattern of wards. You can find additional guidance and information about previous electoral reviews on our website to help you or your organisation make a submission.
