Subject: RBWM Boundary change proposals



From the Fisheries Residents Association - a private estate of 113 houses on the banks of the Thames, to the South of Maidenhead, bounded by the River Thames, Bray Road, and the village of Bray.

After many years of representations to RBWM, it was agreed last year that, as from the local elections in May 2019, the Fishery Estate would be included in the lay Parish of Bray (it has for at least a century been part of the parish of St Michael's Church in Bray).

I believe that I have already submitted my response via the online comment form, but there was no clear indication that it had been transmitted, so I am repeating my comments.

It seems anomalous to leave the Fisheries in the Oldfield Ward for RBWM electoral purposes, when it would logically become part of the Bray Ward under the new boundary recommendations. Oldfield itself is due to expand by up to 80% in terms of new housing proposed in the recently submitted Borough Local Plan, and will become disproportionately large, demanding a split under ward size recommendation figures.
