At our last public meeting, we were informed by Duncan Crow that the Boundary Commission wished to make Crawley election wards all 3 councillor wards. One proposal was to split the Tilgate ward into two. This, it was claimed, would keep the voter numbers fair. Tilgate East would be joined to Furnace Green and Tilgate West would be joined to Broadfield.
