1. On 23 March 1983 South Ribble Borough Council asked us to make proposals for changes to the boundary between the Boroughs of South Ribble and Chorley. The two councils had conducted a thorough going examination of their boundary as a result of a request for change from Hoghton Parish Council. Both boroughs are in the non-metropolitan county of Lancashire.
2. Changes were suggested in five areas; at Hoghton Parish, involving ribbon development; at Clayton Brook involving a housing estate divided by the borough boundary; at Cuerden Bulge, a sparsely inhabited area of land; at Leyland Golf Club/Rose Whittle Farm involving a small area of land east of the M6 motorway and at Moss Side involving new housing development.
3. We considered the Borough Council's request in accordance with section 48(5) of the Local Government Act 1972. We noted that the two councils had been able to agree on a mutually acceptable boundary in three of the five areas concerned. These were Hoghton, Cuerden Bulge and Moss Side. We took note of the views of the local residents and other interested parties and we considered the effect of the suggested changes in terms of effective and convenient local government.
4. On the basis of the information before us we concluded that there was sufficient justification for us to issue draft proposals based on the boundaries agreed between the two councils at Hoghton and Moss Side. We considered that there was evidence to suggest that the Walton Summit Industrial Estate had some affinity with the Clayton Brook Housing Estate and we therefore decided to adopt the boundary suggested by Chorley Borough Council, which included the whole of the Clayton Brook Housing Estate and the Walton Summit Industrial

Estate within the Borough of Chorley. Although the two councils had agreed on a mutually acceptable boundary in the Cuerden Bulge area we thought we should explore the suggestion that the rural hinterland had more in common with Cuerden Parish in Chorley than with the Borough of South Ribble and we therefore decided for the purpose of our draft proposals to adopt a boundary suggested by local residents.

5. We decided not to include in our draft proposals any changes to the boundary in the vicinity of Leyland Golf Club and Rose Whittle Farm, as we did not think there would be any significant benefit in terms of effective and convenient local government. We also decided not to adopt a suggestion put forward by South Ribble Constituency Labour Party which would have involved the transfer of properties in the Gregson Lane area from Chorley to South Ribble; despite the contention that the residents of that area of Chorley aligned themselves with South Ribble we were not given any evidence of administrative difficulties arising from the existing situation.

6. Our draft proposals for changes to the boundary between the Borough of South Ribble and the Borough of Chorley and our interim decision to make no proposals in the Leyland Golf Club/Rose Whittle Farm area were announced on 13 April 1984 in a letter to the two councils. Copies of the letter were sent to Lancashire County Council, the parish councils concerned, the Members of Parliament for the constituencies concerned, the headquarters of the main political parties, the Lancashire Association of Local Councils, the Chorley and South Ribble Health Authority, the North-West Water Authority, the North West Regional Office, Department of the Environment, local newspapers circulating in the area, local radio and television stations serving the area and the local government press. Copies of the draft proposals were deposited for inspection at the main offices of the addressees of our letter. Comments were invited, by 15 June 1984, on our draft proposals from those to whom details were sent and by public notices from other members of the public and interested bodies.

7. In response to our draft proposals we received letters from eighteen sources. The North-West Water Authority had no comments to make on our proposals. South Ribble Borough Council, Chorley Borough Council and South Ribble Constituency Labour Party all supported the proposal relating to the Hoghton area.

7.1. South Ribble Constituency Labour Party, supported by County Councillor T Sharratt, expressed regret that we had not seen fit to adopt the proposal they had put forward regarding the Gregson Lane area of Hoghton.

8. Our proposals regarding the Clayton Brook Housing Estate/Walton Summit Industrial Estate attracted support from Chorley Borough Council, Clayton-Le-Woods Parish Council, a body calling itself Clayton Libs., and Euxton Parish Council.

8.1. South Ribble Borough Council supported our proposal to transfer the Clayton Brook housing estate to Chorley, but opposed the transfer of the Walton Summit Industrial Estate, arguing that there was no good reason for wholesale change in the area. They were opposed to the transfer of the Industrial Estate to provide rate income to support the housing which was to be transferred, and rejected the suggestion that the Estate's work force was drawn from the adjacent Clayton Brook housing area.

8.2. Lancashire County Council and County Councillor Sharratt both objected to the transfer on the grounds that it would produce a poor standard of representation in the two county electoral divisions affected.

8.3. South Ribble Constituency Labour Party were opposed to the proposal on the grounds that the Clayton Brook area had more affinity with South Ribble than with Chorley. They forwarded a petition signed by 250 residents in the Clayton Brook area protesting at our proposals.

9. In respect of the 'Cuerden Bulge' area, we had based our draft proposals on a scheme put forward by a group of local residents. Chorley Borough Council and a private individual wrote in support of this.

9.1. South Ribble Borough Council argued cogently and in great detail that the original suggestion put forward was superior to the one which we had adopted, and they were supported by Farrington Parish Council.

9.2. Cuerden Parish Council supported part of our draft proposals but claimed that if the complete proposals took effect their parish would become an agricultural community of little significant size.

9.3. The British Beef Company opposed our proposal on the grounds that they would lose the services of South Ribble Borough Council; services which had evolved over a period of years and which contributed to the efficient and profitable operation of their company in the area.

9.4. South Ribble Constituency Labour Party opposed our decision to adopt the suggestion put forward by local residents - to transfer a reduced area of land from Cuerden Bulge on the grounds that it would be more logical to follow the line of the M6 motorway as the boundary.

10. Both South Ribble Borough Council and Chorley Borough Council supported our proposals for the Moss Side area.

10.1. Ulnes Walton Parish Council opposed the transfer of land to the Moss Side area of South Ribble on the grounds that they would lose electorate and rateable value. They suggested the transfer of a smaller area.

10.2. South Ribble District Councillor Quinn, together with South Ribble Constituency Labour Party and Moss Side Village Residents' Association, felt

that there was a need for increased representation in the Moss Side area, which was already severely under-represented.

10.3. A private individual wrote to object to the transfer of land to the Moss Side area of South Ribble, on the grounds that Chorley Borough Council tended the grassed areas and the bushes on the estate where he lived far better than South Ribble Borough Council.

11. Euxton Parish Council were disappointed at our interim decision to make no proposals for the Leyland Golf Club/Rose Whittle Farm area, but did not put forward any arguments in support of the transfer of the area from South Ribble to Chorley.

12. We have reassessed our draft proposals in the light of the representations we have received, and we have decided to confirm our draft proposals in respect of Hoghton, Moss Side and the Clayton Brook housing estate as our final proposals. With regard to the latter areas we could not accept the arguments advanced by the Lancashire County Council and County Councillor Sharatt as valid; these were misconceived in seeking to use electoral considerations to determine administrative boundaries. If boundary changes that seemed desirable in the interests of effective and convenient local government produced unacceptable electoral effects then the remedy must lie in a review of the electoral arrangements to take account of the boundary changes. We have also decided to confirm our interim decision to make no proposals for the Leyland Golf Club/Rose Whittle Farm area.

12.1. We have considered the carefully prepared case put forward by South Ribble Borough Council in respect of the transfer of the Walton Summit Industrial Estate to the Borough of Chorley. We recognised the major contribution South Ribble Borough Council had made in promoting and establishing the Industrial Estate. We accepted that the A6/M61 link road provided a

distinct boundary between the Industrial Estate and the Clayton Brook housing estate. We have therefore concluded that the arguments put forward by South Ribble Borough Council outweigh those which persuaded us that the Walton Summit Industrial Estate should be transferred to the Borough of Chorley, and we have accordingly decided to amend our draft proposals so that the boundary follows the line originally suggested by South Ribble Borough Council, i.e. the line of the River Lostock, Clayton Brook, the A6 trunk road, the A6/M61 link road and the M61 motorway, leaving the remainder of the original boundary undisturbed.

12.2. As far as the Cuerden Bulge area was concerned, we were originally persuaded that the arguments put forward by the residents of the predominantly rural hinterland of the Cuerden Bulge proved that that part of the area had more affinity with Cuerden parish in Chorley than with South Ribble; we accordingly adopted the alternative boundary suggested by the residents for the purposes of our draft proposals. However, on reassessing the matter in the light of the comments we have received from both Chorley and South Ribble Borough Councils and from other sources we have decided that the original, mutually agreed proposal, which entailed the use of the M6 motorway as the new boundary between the boroughs provides a more viable long term boundary. We have accordingly decided to amend our draft proposal in respect of this area, and to use the line of the M6 motorway for the boundary.

12.3. We considered a suggestion put forward by Ulnes Walton Parish Council to adopt a revised boundary in the Moss Side area, entailing the transfer of a smaller area of land from Chorley to South Ribble; although we had some sympathy with the views expressed by the Parish Council, we remained unconvinced that the transfer of a smaller area of land would be in the interests of effective and convenient local government.

12.4. Following the issue of our draft proposals South Ribble Constituency Labour Party reiterated their request for the transfer of a number of houses from Chorley to South Ribble in the Gregson Lane area; consultation with both councils had elicited the response that no administrative problems had ever arisen in the area. The two councils had examined this stretch of the boundary as a preliminary to submitting their joint scheme and had concluded that there was no need for change. We saw no reason to depart from our original decision on this matter.

13. We were aware that, as a result of our proposals, the standard of district electoral representation in both boroughs would be worsened. We have concluded that, in announcing our final proposals, there is need for further reviews of the electoral arrangements for both boroughs. We hope that we shall be able to deal with these reviews expeditiously. As far as county electoral arrangements are concerned, our proposals produce a marginally better standard of representation in South Ribble Borough, and an exacerbation of an already poor entitlement for one division in Chorley Borough. We are prepared to consider undertaking a further electoral review of the county to deal with this.

14. Details of our proposals are set out in Schedules 1-3 to this report: Schedule 1 specifies the proposed changes in local authority areas and Schedules 2 and 3 the consequential adjustments to the existing district and county electoral arrangements. The proposed boundaries are shown on the large scale map being sent separately to your Department.

15. Separate letters, enclosing copies of this report and of the large scale map, are being sent to the South Ribble Borough Council asking them to place copies of this report on deposit at their main offices and to put notices to this

effect on public notice boards and in the local press. The text of the notices will refer to your power to make an Order implementing the proposals, if you think fit, after the expiry of six weeks from the date they are submitted to you; it will suggest that any comments on the proposals should therefore be addressed to you, in writing, preferably within six weeks of the date of the letter. Copies of this report, which includes a small scale sketch plan, are also being sent to all those who received the consultation letter or who commented on the draft proposals.

PRINCIPAL AREA BOUNDARY REVIEW - FINAL PROPOSALS

BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIBBLE/BOROUGH OF CHORLEY

NOTE: Where a boundary is described as following a road, railway, river canal or similar feature, it shall be deemed to follow the centre line of the feature, unless otherwise stated.

SCHEDULE 1

AREA A: description of an area proposed to be transferred from the Borough of South Ribble to Hoghton CP in the Borough of Chorley.

That area bounded by a line commencing on the existing Borough boundary on the southern side of Hoghton Lane, thence southwestwards and westwards along said Borough boundary to the unnamed road leading from Brindle Lodge to Lodge Cottage and Hoghton Lane, thence northwestwards along said unnamed road to a point opposite the westernmost point of the property known as Lodge Cottage, thence eastwards to said westernmost point and southeastwards and eastwards along the northern boundary of Parcel No 0004, as shown on OS 1:2500 Microfilm (B) SD 5927, date of publication 1980, to the eastern corner of Parcel No 8607, thence due north from said corner, across the A675 road, to the southern boundary of Parcel No 9909, thence westwards along said parcel boundary to the southeastern boundary of Parcel No 0014, thence northeastwards along said parcel boundary, continuing on OS 1:2500 Microfilm (A) SD 6027, date of publication 1968, to the southwestern boundary of Parcel No 0026, thence southeastwards along said parcel boundary to the western boundary of Parcel No 1612, thence southwards along said parcel boundary and generally southeastwards along the southern boundary of the last-mentioned parcel to its eastern boundary, thence northwards along said eastern boundary to the northwestern boundary of Parcel No 2812, thence northeastwards along said parcel boundary and southeastwards along the northeastern boundary of said parcel to the southeastern boundary of Parcel No 3531, thence northwards and eastwards along said parcel boundary to the existing Borough boundary, thence southwards and southwestwards along said Borough boundary to the point of commencement.

AREA B: description of an area proposed to be transferred from the Borough of South Ribble to Clayton-le-Woods CP in the Borough of Chorley.

That area bounded by a line commencing at the point where the existing Borough boundary crosses the eastern boundary of the A6 (Preston Road), thence northwestwards along said eastern boundary to the southeastern boundary of the eastern carriageway of the proposed roundabout junction between the said road and the proposed A6-M61 Link Road, thence northeastwards along said southeastern boundary to the southern boundary of the Link Road, thence northeastwards and southeastwards along the said southern boundary to the existing Borough boundary, thence generally southwestwards and northwestwards along said Borough boundary to the point of commencement.

AREA C: description of an area proposed to be transferred from Cuerden CP in the Borough of Chorley to the Borough of South Ribble.

That area bounded by a line commencing at a point where the existing Borough boundary crosses the southern boundary of the proposed Lostock Lane Extension road, thence northwestwards along said southern boundary and westwards along the southern boundary of Lostock Lane to NG Ref 55066 25088, as shown on OS 1:1250 Microfilm (B1) SD 5525 SW, date of publication Feb 1983, thence northwestwards in a straight line from said reference to NG Ref 54985 25126, as shown on OS 1:1250 Microfilm (B3) SD 5425 SE, date of publication Feb 1984, being a point on the southwestern boundary of Watkin Lane, thence northwestwards along said southwestern boundary to the existing Borough boundary, thence generally northeastwards and generally southeastwards along said Borough boundary to the point of commencement.

AREA D: description of an area proposed to be transferred from Cuerden CP in the Borough of Chorley to Farington CP in the Borough of South Ribble.

That area bounded by a line commencing at a point where the easternmost point of Area C, as described above, meets the existing Borough boundary, thence generally southeastwards along said Borough boundary to the M6 Motorway, thence southwestwards along said motorway to the southern boundary of Cuerden CP, thence westwards and southwards along said CP boundary to that part of Bristol Avenue containing the properties Nos 62-72, thence westwards along said avenue and southwards along that part of Bristol Avenue leading to St David's Road, to the centre of the junction of Bristol Avenue and St David's Road, thence southeastwards from the centre of said junction to the western boundary of Clayton-le-Woods CP, thence southwards along said CP boundary to the existing Borough boundary, thence westwards, generally northwards and northeastwards along said Borough boundary to the westernmost point of Area C as described above, thence generally eastwards along the southern boundary of Area C as described above to the point of commencement.

AREA E: description of an area proposed to be transferred from Clayton-le-Woods CP in the Borough of Chorley to Farington CP in the Borough of South Ribble.

That area bounded by a line commencing at the southeastern corner of Area D, as described above, in the M6 Motorway, thence southwards along said motorway to a point due east of the northeastern corner of Leverhouse County Primary School, thence due west to said corner and westwards along the northern boundary of said school to the eastern end of that part of Bristol Avenue containing Nos 62-72, thence northwards along the end of said avenue and westwards along said avenue to the southern boundary of Area D, as described above, thence northwards and westwards along said southern boundary to the point of commencement.

AREA F: description of an area proposed to be transferred from Cuerden CP in the Borough of Chorley to the Borough of South Ribble.

That area bounded by a line commencing at the southwestern corner of Area E, as described above, on the western boundary of Clayton-le-Woods CP, thence southwestwards along said CP boundary to the southern boundary of Area D, as described above, thence generally northwards and eastwards along said southern boundary to

the southwestern corner of Area E, being the point of commencement.

AREA G: description of an area proposed to be transferred from Clayton-le-Woods CP in the Borough of Chorley to Farington CP in the Borough of South Ribble.

That area bounded by a line commencing at the southernmost point of Area F, as described above, thence southwards along St David's Road to NG Ref 55262 23213, as shown on OS 1:1250 Microfilm (D) SD 5523 SW, date of publication 1971, thence due west from said reference to the southern boundary of Area D, as described above, thence northeastwards along said southern boundary to the point of commencement.

AREA H: description of an area proposed to be transferred from Clayton-le-Woods CP in the Borough of Chorley to the Borough of South Ribble.

That area bounded by a line commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Area F, as described above, meets the southern boundary of Area E, as described above, thence eastwards along said southern boundary to the M6 Motorway, thence southwards along said motorway to the existing Borough boundary, south of the Leyland Road interchange, thence generally northwestwards and northwards along said Borough boundary, to the southern boundary of Area G, as described above, thence eastwards along said southern boundary and northwestwards along the eastern boundary of Area G, thence northeastwards along the eastern boundary of Area F to the point of commencement.

AREA J: description of an area proposed to be transferred from Ulnes Walton CP in the Borough of Chorley to the Borough of South Ribble.

That area bounded by a line commencing on the existing Borough boundary at the northern boundary of Parcel No 7730, as shown on OS 1:2500 Microfilm (B1) SD 5121, date of publication March 1982, thence westwards along said parcel boundary and northwestwards and westwards along the field boundaries leading from the last-mentioned parcel boundary to the eastern boundary of Ulnes Walton Lane, thence northwards along said eastern boundary, continuing on OS 1:1250 Microfilm (A) SD 5121 NW, date of publication 1982, to NG Ref 51393 21500, thence due west in a straight line to NG Ref 51379 21500, being a point on the eastern boundary

of the area of woodland lying to the west of said lane, thence southwards along said eastern boundary to the southern boundary of said area, thence generally westwards and generally southwestwards along the southern boundary of said area, continuing southwards and northwestwards on OS 1:2500 Microfilm (B1) SD 5121, date of publication March 1982, and continuing northwestwards along said southern boundary on OS 1:1250 Microfilm (A) SD 5121 NW, date of publication 1982, to the westernmost point of said area, thence westwards along the southern boundary of the adjoining area of woodland, continuing on OS 1:2500 Microfilm (B) SD 5021, date of publication 1970, as the southern boundary of Parcel No 9863, thence westwards along said parcel boundary, to the western boundary of said parcel, thence northwards along said western boundary, and the field boundary leading northwards across Nixon Lane to the western boundary of Parcel No 9485, thence northwestwards along said western boundary and the western boundary of Parcel No 9100, continuing on OS 1:2500 Microfilm (B) SD 5022, date of publication 1983, as the western boundary of Parcel No 8600 to the existing Borough boundary, thence generally eastwards and generally southeastwards along said Borough boundary to the point of commencement.

SCHEDULE 2: Consequential effects upon the Wards of Clayton-le-Woods CP in the Borough of Chorley.

It is proposed that the parish wards, as defined in the Parish of Clayton-le-Woods (Wards) Order 1975, shall be altered as described below.

Clayton-le-Woods East Ward shall be extended by the addition of Area B, as described in Schedule 1.

Clayton-le-Woods West Ward shall be diminished by the subtraction of Areas E, G and H as described in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 3 Revised Borough electoral arrangements, consequent upon the proposals described in Schedule 1.

It is proposed that the Borough Wards, as defined in the Borough of South Ribble (Electoral Arrangements) Order 1975 and the Borough of Chorley (Electoral Arrangements) Order 1975, shall be altered as described below.

AREA A, as described in Schedule 1 shall be transferred from the All Saints Ward of the Borough of South Ribble to the Brindle and Hoghton Ward of the Borough of Chorley.

AREA B, as described in Schedule 1, shall be transferred from the Walton-le-Dale South Ward of the Borough of South Ribble to the Clayton-le-Woods East Ward of the Borough of Chorley.

The said Clayton-le-Woods East Ward shall return one additional member to Chorley Borough Council.

AREA C, as described in Schedule 1 shall be divided into two areas, as described below.

Area C1, to be transferred from Clayton-le-Woods West and Cuerden Ward of the Borough of Chorley to the Walton-le-Dale South Ward of the Borough of South Ribble:

that area bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the eastern and southern boundaries of Area C, as described in Schedule 1, thence westwards along said southern boundary to a point opposite the unnamed road leading from Lostock Lane to Lostock Hall Continuation Hospital, thence northwards to and northwestwards along said unnamed road to the River Lostock, thence generally northeastwards along said river to the northeastern boundary of Area C, as described in Schedule 1, thence generally southeastwards along said northeastern boundary and the eastern boundary of said Area C to the point of commencement.

Area C2, to be transferred from the Clayton-le-Woods West and Cuerden Ward of the Borough of Chorley to the Walton-le-Dale West Ward of the Borough of South Ribble:

that part of Area C as described in Schedule 1, not included in Area C1, as described above.

Areas D, E and G, as described in Schedule 1, shall be transferred from the Clayton-le-Woods West and Cuerden Ward of the Borough of Chorley to the Farington Ward of the Borough of South Ribble.

Areas F and H, as described in Schedule 1, shall be transferred from the Clayton-le-Woods West and Cuerden Ward of the Borough of Chorley to the St Ambrose Wesley Ward of the Borough of South Ribble.

Area J, as described in Schedule 1, shall be transferred from the Lostock Ward of the Borough of Chorley to the St James Moss Side Ward of the Borough of South Ribble.

AREA K description of an area in the Borough of South Ribble, proposed to be transferred from Walton-le-Dale South Ward to Walton-le-Dale West Ward.

That area bounded by a line commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Walton-le-Dale West Ward meets the northwestern boundary of Walton-le-Dale South Ward, thence eastwards along said northwestern boundary to the Path leading from Browndge Road to Lostock Fold Farm, thence southwards along said path to the southwestern boundary of Walton-le-Dale South Ward, thence northwards and south-westwards along said ward boundary and northwards along the eastern boundary of Walton-le-Dale West Ward to the point of commencement.

SCHEDULE 4: Revised County electoral arrangements, consequent upon the proposals described in Schedules 1 and 3.

It is proposed that the County Electoral Divisions, as defined in the County of Lancashire (Electoral Arrangements) Order 1981, shall be altered as described below.

Areas A and B, as described in Schedule 1, shall be transferred from the South Ribble East ED to the Chorley Rural North ED.

Area C1, as described in Schedule 3, shall be transferred from the Chorley Rural North ED to the South Ribble East ED.

Area C2, as described in Schedule 3, shall be transferred from the Chorley Rural North ED to the South Ribble North ED.

Areas D, E and G, as described in Schedule 1, shall be transferred from the Chorley Rural North ED to the South Ribble Central ED.

Areas F and H, as described in Schedule 1, shall be transferred from the Chorley Rural North ED to the South Ribble South ED.


Area J, as described in Schedule 1, shall be transferred from the Chorley Rural West ED to the South Ribble South West ED.

Area K, as described in Schedule 3, shall be transferred from the South Ribble East ED to the South Ribble North ED.




