## **Re: Boundary Changes to Coleford Parish Forest of Dean**

I write on behalf of Coleford Town Council which discussed the boundary review at its recent meeting.

The Town Council strongly feels that the Coleford Parish boundary should remain unchanged.

The settlements of Broadwell and Mile End surround Coleford town. Their focus is to Coleford for the majority of their activities, schooling, doctors' dentist etc. To the north of these villages is the forest. The splitting of Broadwell parish seems a clumsy and arbitrary way of creating a boundary.

The Forest of Dean is a rural community which is proud that it has managed to maintain a strong sense of identity. The proposed changes will cause much confusion with many parishioners identifying with Coleford but having to seek help via a parish council several miles away in Bream.

The Town Council would strongly urge you to reconsider your proposals and reinstate the existing boundary.
