The Vale Royal (Parishes) Order 1988

Made	8th February 1988
Coming into force-	
for the purposes referred	
to in article 1(2)	10th February 1988
for all other purposes	1st April 1988

The Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of the Local Government Act 1972 (a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order which gives effect to proposals submitted to him under sections 47, 48(9) and 51(1) of that Act, more than six weeks before the making of this Order, by the Local Government Boundary Commission for England following recommendations made to them under section 48(8) of that Act by the Vale Royal District Council for proposals about parishes in the district:

Citation and commencement

1.-(1) This Order may be cited as the Vale Royal (Parishes) Order 1988.

(2) This Order shall come into force on 10th February 1988 for any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 (b).

(3) For all other purposes this Order shall come into force on 1st April 1988.

Interpretation

2. In this Order -

"boundary map" means one of the 11 maps prepared by the Department of the Environment, marked "Maps of the Vale Royal (Parishes) Order 1988", duly numbered for reference, and deposited in accordance with regulation 5 of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976;

"county electoral division" means an electoral division of the county of Cheshire;

"district ward" means a ward of the district of Vale Royal.

Creation of new parishes

3.-(1) There shall be created in the district of Vale Royal 2 new parishes, to be known as Anderton with Marbury, and Whitegate and Marton.

(2) The parish of Anderton with Marbury shall consist of the areas of the parishes of Anderton and Marbury as existing immediately before 1st April 1988.

(3) The parish of Whitegate and Marton shall consist of the parts of the parishes of Cuddington, Hartford, Marton, Oakmere, Weaverham and Winsford which are marked on the boundary maps as indicated on the table below, and shall form part of the Cuddington and Marton district ward and the Eddisbury county electoral division.

Transfers between parishes

4.-(1) The areas marked on the boundary map as shown in columns 1 and 2 of the Schedule to this Order shall be transferred from the relevant parish named in column 3 to that named in column 4.

(2) Where in column 5 there is mentioned in relation to any area -

- (a) a parish ward;
- (b) a district ward; or
- (c) a county electoral division

that area shall in addition be transferred to that ward or division.

Parish councils for the new parishes

5.-(1) There shall be a parish council for each parish created by article 3, each parish council to consist of 8 parish councillors.

(2) Elections for the parish councils of each new parish shall be held on such day before 1st April 1988 as the returning officer shall appoint, and those councillors elected shall come into office on 1st April 1988 and shall retire on the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1991.

(3) The proper officer of the Vale Royal District Council shall convene -

(a) the first annual meeting of each council of a new parish, which shall be held in April 1988; and

(b) the first assembly of the parish meeting for each parish.

(4) If in either parish the first assembly of the parish meeting is held before the first annual meeting of the parish council, that parish meeting may appoint a person to take the chair who shall have, for the purpose of that meeting only, the powers and authority of the chairman.

(5) In the financial year beginning on 1st April 1988, the Vale Royal District Council shall levy rates in the parishes created by article 3, and make payments to the councils of those parishes, as if those parish councils had issued precepts to the district council requiring the payment of a sum equal to the product of a rate in the pound as shown below, calculated on the total rateable value of the parish as set out in the valuation list at the beginning of that financial year -

Anderton with Marbury	2p
Whitegate and Marton	1.5p.

Abolition of parishes

6. The parishes of Anderton, Marbury, Marton, and Whatcroft shall cease to exist, and their parish authorities shall be dissolved. Each dissolved parish shall have as its residuary successor the council of the relevant parish named below, which shall also have custody of the public books and documents of the relevant dissolved parish -

Anderton	Anderton with Marbury
Marbury	Anderton with Marbury
Marton	Whitegate and Marton
Whatcroft	Davenham.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order affects parishes in the district of Vale Royal. It-

- (a) creates 2 new parishes and parish councils of Anderton with Marbury, and Whitegate and Marton;
- (b) transfers areas between parishes; and
- (c) abolishes the parishes of Anderton, Marbury, Marton, and Whatcroft.

Consequential changes to local government electoral areas are made.

The map forming part of this note (page 10) gives a general guide to the areas affected. Prints of the detailed boundary map (described in article 2) may be inspected at all reasonable times at the office of the Vale Royal District Council and at the office of the Secretary of State for the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB.

The new parish of Anderton with Marbury will have approximately an area of 369 hectares, a population of 384 and a rateable value of £53,594.

The new parish of Whitegate and Marton will have approximately an area of 1,573 hectares, a population of 992 and a rateable value of £112,953.

The Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 (S.I. 1976/246, amended by S.I. 1978/247) contain general provisions regarding the effect of orders such as this one.
