To The Review Officer (West Sussex), Local Government Boundary Commission for England,

Dear Sir/Madam,

I was dismayed to be informed that a restructure of Crawley's West Sussex County Council ward boundaries is being considered. I thought these had been agreed, there is nothing wrong with the existing boundaries, so why the additional and unnecessary review?

I live in Pound Hill where we seem most affected by what I can only describe as a peculiar proposal. In our borough elections, Pound Hill is split into two, with these two wards merged together for County elections. This makes perfect sense. But the proposals suggest that part of Pound Hill is joined with Three Bridges, which we are separated from by a railway line and where no residential properties are linked in any way.

What has prompted this additional review? It is totally unnecessary and the Pound Hill/Three Bridges ward proposal is frankly ridiculous.

I urge you most strongly to reject these proposals and keep Crawley's County wards as they are.
