PROPOSALS FOR THE FUTURE ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE BOROUGH  
OF SCUNTHORPE IN THE COUNTY OF HUMBERSIDE

1. We, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, having carried out our initial review of the electoral arrangements for the borough of Scunthorpe in accordance with the requirements of section 63 of, and schedule 9 to, the Local Government Act 1972, present our proposals for the future electoral arrangements of that borough.
2. In accordance with the procedure prescribed in section 60(1) and (2) of the 1972 Act, notice was given on 3 June 1974 that we were to undertake this review. This was incorporated in a consultation letter addressed to Scunthorpe Borough Council, copies of which were circulated to Humberside County Council, the member of Parliament for the constituency concerned and the headquarters of the main political parties. Copies were also sent to the editors of the local newspapers circulating in the area and of the local government press. Notices inserted in the local press announced the start of the review and invited comments from members of the public and interested bodies.
3. Scunthorpe Borough Council were invited to prepare a draft scheme of representation for our consideration. When doing so, they were asked to observe the rules laid down in Schedule 11 to the Local Government Act 1972, and the guidelines which we set out in our Report No. 6 about the proposed number of councillors for each ward. They were also asked to take into account any views expressed to them following their consultation with local interests. We therefore asked that they should publish details of their provisional proposals about

a month before they submitted their draft scheme to us, thus allowing an opportunity for local comment.

4. The Council have passed a resolution under Section 7(4)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972 requesting a system of election by thirds.

5. On 30 October, Scunthorpe Borough Council presented their draft scheme of representation. The Council proposed to divide the area of the borough into 16 wards, each returning 2 or 3 councillors, to form a council of 40.

6. We received no comments on the Council's draft scheme.

7. We considered the draft scheme submitted by the Borough Council. We noted that the scheme complied with the rules in Schedule 11 to the Local Government Act 1972 and our own guidelines and we considered that it provided a satisfactory basis of representation for the district. We decided to delete the numbers from the proposed ward names and to re-name West No. 1 North and West No. 2 South wards as Brumby Wood West and Brumby Wood East wards respectively. We then formulated our draft proposals accordingly.

8. On 30 June 1975 we issued our draft proposals and these were sent to all who had received our consultation letter. The Council were asked to make those draft proposals, and the accompanying map which defined the proposed ward boundaries, available for inspection at their main offices. Representations on our draft proposals were invited from those to whom they were circulated and, by public notices, from members of the public and interested bodies. We asked that any comments should reach us by 22 August 1975.

9. The Borough Council suggested alternative names for the proposed Brumby Wood East and Brumby Wood West wards, and proposed a slight amendment to the boundary between the Lincoln Gardens East and Ashby Grange West wards to contain the whole of a new housing development in the Lincoln Gardens East ward. We also received comments suggesting

that the boundary between the Brumby East and Brumby West wards should be changed in order to avoid dividing a housing estate. In addition we received comments from a political association suggesting an alternative pattern of wards in the western part of the borough.

10. We reviewed our draft proposals in the light of these comments. We decided to accept the Borough Council's suggestion that Brumby Wood East and Brumby Wood West wards should be renamed Kingsway East and Kingsway West respectively and we also agreed that the boundary between Lincoln Gardens East and Ashby Grange West wards should be realigned. We also decided to accept the suggested realignment of the boundary between the Brumby East and Brumby West wards. We then formulated our final proposals accordingly. With regard to the remaining suggestion, we preferred the wards in our draft proposals.

11. Details of the final proposals are set out in Schedules 1 and 2 to this report and on the attached map. Schedule 1 gives the names of the wards and the number of councillors to be returned by each ward and Schedule 2 shows the order of retirement of councillors. The boundaries of the new wards are defined on the map.

#### PUBLICATION

12. In accordance with Section 60(5)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, a copy of this report and a copy of the map are being sent to Scunthorpe Borough Council and will be made available for public inspection at the Council's main offices. Copies of this report (without map) are also being sent to those who received the consultation letter and to those who made comments. A detailed description of the boundaries of the proposed wards as defined on the map is set out in Schedule 3 to this report.

Commencing on the western boundary of the District at its junction with Doncaster Road; thence northwards and following said District boundary to a point opposite the drain running along the northside of Parcel Nos 2461, 4159 and 5765 on OS 1:2500 Plan SE88/8913 Edition of 1964; thence eastwards to and along said drain, southeastwards along Park Farm Road, southwestwards along Flixborough Footpath and generally westwards along the most northerly and westerly boundaries of properties on the northern and western sides of Buckingham Avenue and Crosby Avenue and the most northerly and westerly boundaries of the properties on the northern and western sides of Skippingdale Road and Portman Road and continuing westwards and southwards along the northern and rear boundaries of Nos 95 to 1 Foxhills Road and the northern and western boundaries of the Cocked Hat Public House, crossing Ferry Road and continuing southwards along Avenue Vivian; southwestwards along Hempdyke Road, northwestwards along the northeastern boundary of No 75 Hempdyke Road, southwestwards and southwards along the rear boundaries of the properties on the west side of Hempdyke Road, the rear boundaries of Nos 11 to 1 Farthing Avenue and Nos 129 and 127 Jackson Road, westwards along the northern boundary of No 29 The Cliff and the property known as Tattras, southwards along Sherwood Vale and westwards along Doncaster Road to the point of commencement.

**PARK EAST WARD**

Commencing at the southeast corner of Park West Ward, northwards and following the eastern boundary of said ward, southwards along Crosby Avenue, crossing Ferry Road and continuing southwards along Spencer Avenue, westwards along the southern boundary of No 1A Spencer Avenue, southwards along the prolongation northwards of the eastern boundary of the garage west of No 61 Smith Street and the eastern boundary of the said garage and the Old Show Ground, westwards along Doncaster Road to the point of commencement.

#### CROSBY TOWN WARD

Commencing on the eastern boundary of Park East Ward at its junction with Berkeley Street, thence northwards and following said ward boundary, eastwards and following the eastern and northern boundaries of Park West Ward, northwards and following the northern boundary of the District, southwestwards along Winterton Road, westwards along Glebe Road, crossing Normandy Road and continuing westwards along Berkeley Street to the point of commencement.

#### CROSBY TOWN SOUTH WARD

Commencing at the southeastern corner of Park East Ward, northwards and following the eastern boundary of said ward, eastwards and following the southern and eastern boundaries of Crosby Town North Ward, southeastwards and following the eastern boundary of the District, westwards along Dawes Lane, southwestwards along the Grimsby to Scunthorpe railway, southeastwards along Main Approach Road, westwards along Brigg Road, southwestwards and following Rowland Road, northwards along Ashby Road and Oswald Road, westwards along Doncaster Road to the point of commencement.

#### KINGSWAY WEST WARD

Commencing on the western boundary of the District at NG reference SE8711610018, northwards and following District boundary, eastwards along the southern boundaries of Park West Ward and Park East Ward and continuing eastwards and southwards along the south western boundary of Crosby Town South Ward, westwards along Cliff Gardens, southwards along the eastern boundary of No 90 Cliff Gardens, the rear boundaries of Nos 1 to 35 Auckland Road, eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries of No 78 Church Lane, crossing Church Lane and continuing southwards along the eastern boundary of No 91 Church Lane, westwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 91 to 205 Church Lane and continuing westwards in a straight line to Kingsway, southeastwards along Kingsway, southwards along Glover Road, westwards and southwards along the northern and rear boundary of No 2 Glover Road and continuing southwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 2 to 112 Glover Road, westwards along

West Common Lane, northwards and westwards along Plymouth Road, crossing Bristol Road and Scotter Road and continuing due west to the point of commencement.

#### KINGSWAY EAST WARD

Commencing at the southeast corner of Brumby Wood West Ward, northwards and following the eastern boundary of said ward, southwards along the southwestern boundary of Crosby Town South Ward and continuing southwards along Ashby Road, westwards along West Common Lane to the point of commencement.

#### FRODINGHAM NORTH WARD

Commencing on the eastern boundary of Brumby Wood East Ward at the junction of Ashby Road and Queensway, northwards and following said ward boundary, eastwards and following the southern boundary of Crosby Town South Ward, southwards along the eastern boundary of the District to NG reference SE9244609413, westwards to NG reference SE9149409412 being a point in Brigg Road, northwestwards along said road, southwestwards along the footpath leading from Brigg Road to Lilac Avenue, northwestwards along the rear boundaries of properties on the northeastern side of Lilac Avenue, southwards along the rear boundaries on the eastern side of Warwick Road and the eastern boundary of All Saints' Church, westwards along East Common Lane, northwestwards along Queensway to the point of commencement.

#### FRODINGHAM SOUTH WARD

Commencing at NG reference SE9035209185 being a point in Queensway, northwestwards along Queensway eastwards and following the southern boundary of Frodingham North Ward, westwards along the un-named road joining Brigg Road and Grange Lane North, southwards along said lane, westwards along Warley Road, southwards along Healey Road, westwards along Warley Road, southwestwards and southwards along the un-named road to the east of Nos 1 and 2 Tetley Road to NG reference SE9036809209, southwestwards in a straight line to the point of commencement.

## BRUMBY WEST WARD

Commencing at the point where the stream on the south side of Parcel No 2400 on OS 1:2500 Plan SE86/8708 Edition of 1968 meets the District boundary; thence northwards along said boundary, eastwards and following the southern boundary of Kingsway West Ward, southwards along Herrick Road, eastwards along Bridges Road, northwards along the prolongation southwards of the eastern fork of Ridge Walk, continuing northwards along said walk to the northern boundary of Langland House, eastwards and following the northern and eastern boundaries of said house, westwards and following the northern, western and southern boundaries of Thomas Sumpter Secondary School Playing Field, westward and southward along the rear boundaries of the properties numbered 107-37 Merlin Road, then southeast to the northwest corner of No 229 Burringham Road, thence east along the existing ward boundary to the eastern boundary of 187 Burringham Road, thence southwards along said boundary to Burringham Road, thence southwestwards along said road, northwards along Dryden Road, westwards along Meredith Avenue, southwards along Scotter Road, westwards along the stream running along the south side of Parcel No 2400 to the point of commencement.

## BRUMBY EAST WARD

Commencing at the southeastern corner of Brumby West Ward, thence northwards and following the eastern boundary of said ward, eastwards along the southern boundaries of Kingsway West Ward and Kingsway East Ward, southwards along Ashby Road, westwards along Burringham Road to the point of commencement.

## LINCOLN GARDENS WEST WARD

Commencing at a point opposite the southern boundary of No 354 Ashby Road on the eastern boundary of Brumby East Ward, thence northwards and following said ward boundary and the eastern boundary of Kingsway East Ward, southeastwards along the southwestern boundaries of Frodingham North and Frodingham South Wards, southwestwards along Stockhill Road, westwards along Ashby High Street, northwards along the western boundary of the Wesley Methodist Church, westwards along the rear boundaries of the properties on the southern side of

Springfield Close, continuing westwards along the southern boundary of the Ashby Institute and School Road, southwards and westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of Nos 14 and 16 Collum Lane, crossing said lane and continuing westwards along the rear boundaries of the properties on the northern side of Ashby High Street, crossing Collum Gardens, Modder Street, Lindley Street and Belmont Street and continuing westwards in a straight line from the rear boundary of No 295 Ashby High Street to and along the southern boundary of No 354 Ashby Road to the point of commencement.

#### LINCOLN GARDENS EAST WARD

Commencing at the southeastern corner of Lincoln Gardens West Ward, thence northwards and following said ward boundary, southeastwards and following the southern boundaries of Frodingham South Ward and Frodingham North Ward, southwards along the eastern boundary of the District, northwestwards and following the A18 road (Queensway), southwestwards along Grange Lane South, westwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 1 to 67 Ashby High Street, southwards along the western boundary of No 67 Ashby High Street, then westward along Ashby High Street to the eastern boundary of No 95 Ashby High Street, then northward and westward along the rear boundaries of Nos 95 to 111 Ashby High Street, southwards along the western boundary of No 111 Ashby High Street, westwards along Ashby High Street to the point of commencement.

#### RIDDINGS WEST WARD

Commencing on the southern District boundary where it meets Willoughby Road, thence westwards and following the southern and eastern District boundaries eastwards along the southern boundaries of Brumby West Ward and Brumby East Ward, southwards along Willoughby Road to the point of commencement.

#### RIDDINGS EAST WARD

Commencing where the southern boundary of the District meets the eastern boundary of Riddings West Ward, thence northwestwards and following said ward boundary, eastwards along the southern boundary of Brumby East Ward, southwards along Messingham Road, eastwards along the southern boundary of No 110 Messingham Road and continuing eastwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 2 to

88 Rochdale Road, the southern boundary of No 2 Covert Road and the southern boundaries of 60 and 59 Third Avenue, 40 and 39 Second Avenue and 20 and 19 First Avenue, southwards along Bottesford Road, westwards along the southern District boundary to the point of commencement.

#### ASHBY GRANGE WEST WARD

Commencing on the southern boundary of the District where it meets the eastern boundary of Riddings East Ward, thence northwards and following the eastern boundary of said ward, eastwards and following the southern boundaries of Brumby East Ward, Lincoln Gardens West Ward and Lincoln Gardens East Ward, southwestwards along Grange Lane South and continuing southwestwards and southwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 1 to 55 Grange Lane South, eastwards along the southern boundary of No 55 Grange Lane South, southwards along Grange Lane South, westwards along Cornwall Road, southwards and westwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 63 to 177 Grange Lane South, crossing Marshfield Road and continuing westwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 179 to 217 Grange Lane South, crossing Everest Road and continuing generally westwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 219 to 225 Grange Lane South and continuing generally westwards along the southern boundaries of Nos 9 to 19 Shipton Road, southeastwards along the eastern boundary of No 237 Grange Lane South, westwards along the southern boundary of the District to the point of commencement.

#### ASHBY GRANGE EAST WARD

Commencing on the southern boundary of the District at the junction with the southern boundary of Ashby Grange West Ward, thence generally eastwards and northwards along the southern and eastern boundaries of said ward, northeastwards and eastwards along the southern boundary of Lincoln Gardens East Ward, southwards and following the District boundary to the point of commencement.
