PROPOSALS FOR REVISED ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE  
CITY OF BATH IN THE COUNTY OF AVON

1. We, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, having carried out our initial review of the electoral arrangements for the district of Bath in accordance with the requirements of section 63 and Schedule 9 to the Local Government Act 1972, present our proposals for the future electoral arrangements for that district.
2. In accordance with the procedure laid down in section 60(1) and (2) of the 1972 Act, notice was given on 13 May 1974 that we were to undertake this review. This was incorporated in a consultation letter addressed to the Bath City Council, copies of which were circulated to the Avon County Council, the Member of Parliament for the Bath Constituency and the headquarters of the main political parties. Copies were also sent to the editors of the local newspapers circulating in the area and to the local government press. Notices inserted in the local press announced the start of the review and invited comments from members of the public and from any interested bodies.
3. Bath City Council were invited to prepare a draft scheme of representation for our consideration. In doing so, they were asked to observe the rules laid down in Schedule 11 to the Local Government Act 1972 and the guidelines which we set out in our Report No 6 about the proposed size of the council and the proposed number of councillors for each ward. They were asked also to take into account any views expressed to them following their consultation with local interests. We therefore asked that they should publish details of their provisional proposals about a month before they submitted their draft scheme to us, thus allowing an opportunity for local comment.

4. On 8 October 1974 the Bath City Council presented their draft scheme of representation. In accordance with section 7(4)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, they had exercised an option for elections by thirds and they proposed to divide the area of the district into 16 wards each returning 3 members to form a council of 48; three more than the existing council.

5. Before submitting their proposals the City Council had given notice of their proposals in the local press and circulated details to all organisations who had nominated a candidate for local election in the previous 5 years. Copies of the draft scheme were made available for inspection at the Council's Offices and anyone interested was invited to send their comments either to the Council or direct to us. Only one letter was received in response to this publicity and that supported the Council's draft scheme.

6. We considered the draft scheme and came to the conclusion that it met very well the requirements of Schedule 11 of the Local Government Act 1972 and the guidelines set out in our Report No 6. After consulting Ordnance Survey, we made some minor adjustments to the alignment of some of the boundaries in order to secure boundary lines which were more readily identifiable on the ground. We decided to adopt the ward names suggested by the Council. We then formulated our draft proposals accordingly.

7. On 27 November 1974 we issued our draft proposals and these were sent to all who had received our consultation letter or had commented on the Council's draft scheme. The Council were asked to make these draft proposals, and the accompanying maps which defined the proposed ward boundaries, available for inspection at their main offices. Representations on our draft proposals were invited from those to whom they were circulated and, by public notices, from other members of the public and interested bodies. We asked that any comments should reach us by 31 January 1975.

8. Only the City Council and the County Council responded to the draft proposals. Neither Council offered any objection although the City Council suggested two minor boundary alterations to take account of recently completed dwellings not shown on the maps. Very few electors are affected.

9. We considered that the minor adjustments suggested to us by the City Council should be adopted and, subject to this, we decided to confirm our draft proposals as our final proposals.

10. Details of these final proposals are set out in Schedule 1 to this report and on the attached map. Schedule 1 gives the names of the wards and the number of councillors to be returned by each ward. The boundaries of the new wards are defined on the map.

#### PUBLICATION

11. In accordance with Section 60(5)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, a copy of this report and a copy of the maps are being sent to the City of Bath District Council and will be available for public inspection at the Council's main offices. Copies of this report are also being sent to those who received the consultation letter and to those who made comments. A detailed description of the boundaries of the proposed wards, as defined on the maps, is set out on Schedule 2 to this report.

Commencing on the western bdy of the District at Grid Ref ST 7241666426 thence generally northwards and eastwards following the said bdy to the westernmost point of parcel no 3954 as shown on OS 1:2500 plan ST 72/7367 Edn of 1971 thence south-eastwards and following the southern bdy of the said parcel to the western bdy of parcel no 3732 thence southwards along the said bdy and the western and southern bdys of parcels no 2625 and 3732 to the northernmost point of parcel no 4800 thence eastwards and southwards along the ~~northern~~ and eastern bdys of the said parcel to the northern boundary of parcel no 5884 as shown on OS 1:2500 plan ST 72/7366 Edn of 1971, thence eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries of said parcel and continuing southwards along the western boundaries of parcels no 8263 and 7151 to the northern boundary of parcel no 6337, thence northwestwards and southwestwards along the northern and western boundaries of said parcel and the western and southern boundaries of parcel no 5629 to the western boundary of parcel no 7128, thence northeastwards along the western boundary of said parcel to the westernmost corner of parcel no 7943, thence southeastwards and northeastwards along the southern and eastern boundaries of the said parcel to the southern boundary of parcel no 0046 thence eastwards along the said boundary to the western boundary of parcel no 0026 thence southwestwards along the said boundary and the western boundary of No 20 Summerhill Road to the footpath connecting Summerhill Road with Weston Park East, thence northwestwards along the said footpath to a point opposite the western boundary of The Bungalow, thence southwards and eastwards to and along the western and southern boundaries of the said property to the western boundary of No 23 Summerhill Road thence southwestwards along the said boundary to the rear boundary of the latter property thence southeastwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 23 to 7 Summerhill Road to a point opposite the rear boundary of the property known as Cowleas House thence southwards to and along the said boundary and the rear boundaries of the properties on the western side of Sion Hill known as Westhope, Chestnut House and Merrywood to the southern boundary of the last named property thence southeastwards along the said boundary to Sion Hill thence southwards along

Sion Hill to a point opposite the western boundary of No 25 Sion Hill thence to and southwards along the said boundary and continuing southwards and westwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 56 to 65 Cranwells Park and in prolongation thereof to the southern section of Cranwells Park thence southwards along Cranwells Park to Weston Road, thence generally northwestwards along the said road, Weston Lane and Crown Road to a point opposite the northern boundary of Royal United Hospital, thence southwestwards to and along said boundary and continuing to the southeastern boundary of the Community Centre, thence northeastwards and following the southeastern and northeastern boundaries of the Community Centre to Penn Hill Road, thence northeastwards along said road to a point opposite the northeastern boundary to parcel no 5435 as shown on 1:2500 OS plan ST 72/7366 Edn of 1971, thence northwestwards to and following the said boundary and the northern boundary of parcel no 3930 to the point of commencement.

#### LANSDOWN WARD

Commencing on the eastern boundary of Weston ward at the junction of Cranwells Park and Weston Road, thence generally northwards and eastwards following the said ward boundary and the District boundary to the footpath connecting Woolley Lane with Coxley Drive, thence southwards along the said footpath and continuing to Batstone Close thence southeastwards to the northern boundary of the Bath Diocesan School for Girls thence southwestwards and southwards along the northern and western boundaries of the said school to the entrance, thence southwestwards to Bay Tree Road thence southeastwards along said Road to Claremont Road thence westwards along the said road and Eastbourne Avenue to Fairfield Road thence northwards along the said road to Queenswood Avenue thence southwestwards along the said avenue to a point opposite the rear boundary of No 8 Fairfield Road thence northwards to and along the said rear boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 8 to 27

Fairfield Road and in prolongation thereof to the southeastern boundary of No 5 Marshfield Way thence southwestwards along the said boundary and the southeastern and eastern boundaries of Nos 7, 33, 35, 47, 49, 59, 61 and 63 Marshfield Way and continuing to the northeastern corner of the property known as Bellevue thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said property to the footpath known as Jacob's Ladder No 3 thence southwestwards along said footpath to and along the footpath known as Jacob's Ladder No 2 thence southwestwards along the said footpath to Rivers Road thence southwestwards and westwards along the said road and St Stephen's Road to Lansdown Grove thence southwestwards along Lansdown Grove to a point opposite the eastern boundary of the property known as Lansdown Grove Lodge thence northwestwards and southwestwards to and along the eastern and northern boundaries of the said property and the northern boundary of the Lansdown Grove Hotel to a point opposite the eastern boundary of buildings to the east of Lansdown Road Mansions thence northwards to and along the said boundary to the southern boundary of the property known as Sherford House thence eastwards to the rear boundary of the said property thence northwards along the said boundary and the rear boundaries of the properties on the eastern side of Lansdown Road to the southern boundary of No 5 St Stephen's Place thence westwards to the rear boundary of the property known as Madeley House thence northwards along the said boundary to the southern boundary of the property known as Walton thence eastwards and northwards following the southern and eastern boundary of the said property and the eastern boundaries of the properties known as Bonair, Northcote and Novelli to St Stephen's Road thence northwards along the said road to Lansdown Road thence southwards along the said road to a point opposite the southern boundary of Bath High School grounds thence northwestwards and southwestwards following the boundary of the said school and continuing southwards along the western boundary of No 39 St James' Park to Portland Road thence southwestwards along said road to Park Street Mews thence northwestwards and westwards along said mews and Park Place to Cavendish

Road thence southwards along said road to Weston Road thence westwards along said road to point of commencement.

#### LAMBRIDGE WARD

Commencing on the eastern boundary of Lansdown ward at the junction of Bay Tree Road and Claremont Road thence northwards and following the said ward boundary and the northern and eastern boundaries of the District to a point opposite the southwestern boundary of the Bath Rugby Club ground thence northwestwards to and along the said boundary to London Road, thence southwestwards along the said road to St Saviour's Road thence northeastwards along the said road to Claremont Road, thence northwestwards along said road to the point of commencement.

#### WALCOT WARD

Commencing at Cleveland Bridge on the River Avon thence northwestwards to and along Cleveland Place to London Road thence southwestwards along said road and London Street and Guinea Lane to Lansdown Road thence northwestwards along said road to southern boundary of Lansdown Ward thence generally northeastwards and eastwards following the said ward boundary and southern boundary of Lambridge Ward to the eastern boundary of the District thence southwestwards and following the said boundary and the River Avon to the point of commencement.

#### NEWBRIDGE WARD

Commencing on the footbridge over the River Avon connecting Station Road with Fielding's Road thence generally westwards, northwestwards and northeastwards following the said river and the western boundary of the district to the southern boundary of Weston Ward, thence generally southeastwards along the said ward boundary to a point opposite the western boundary of the property known as Green Haven thence southwards to and along said

boundary to the southern boundary of the said property thence southeastwards along the said boundary and the southwestern boundaries of the properties known as Homelands, Katmandu and Pasudo to the northwestern boundary of No 98 Cedric Road, thence northeastwards along said boundary to the rear boundary of said property, thence southwards along said rear boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 96 to 2 Cedric Road to the northern boundary of Locksbrook Cemetery, thence westwards along said boundary to Combe Park thence southwards along Combe Park crossing Newbridge Hill and continuing southwards along Chelsea Road, Station Road and the footpath leading to Fielding's Road to the point of commencement.

#### KINGSMEAD WARD

Commencing at the southeastern corner of Newbridge Ward on the footbridge from Station Road to Fielding's Road thence northwards and generally eastwards along the eastern boundary of Newbridge Ward and the southern boundaries of Weston and Lansdown Wards to Portland Road, thence southeastwards along said road to Harley Street, thence southwards along said street to Julian Road, thence westward along said road to Upper Church Street, thence southwestwards along said street to Gravel Walk, thence southeastwards along said walk to Queen's Parade Place, thence eastwards along said place to Gay Street, thence southwards along said street, Queen Square (East side), Barton Street and Saw Close to West Gate, thence westward to Avon Street, thence southwards along said street and in prolongation thereof to the River Avon, thence westwards along said river to the point of commencement.

#### ABBAY WARD

Commencing at the southeastern corner of Kingsmead Ward, thence northwards and generally eastwards following the eastern boundary of the said ward and the southern boundaries of Lansdown and Walcot Wards to Cleveland Bridge, thence generally southeastwards and southwards following said bridge,

Bathwick Street and Sydney Place to Great Pulteney Street, thence south-westwards along said street to a point opposite the southwestern boundary of No 77 Great Pulteney Street, thence southeastwards to and along said boundary to the northern boundary of No 2 Johnstone Street thence northeastwards along said boundary to the rear boundary of No 2 Johnstone Street, thence southeastwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 3 to 8 Johnstone Street to the northwestern boundary of the Bath Recreation Ground, thence southwestwards along said boundary and in prolongation thereof to the River Avon, thence southeastwards and following the said river to the point of commencement.

#### BATHWICK WARD

Commencing at a point in Claverton Down Road opposite the western boundary of parcel no 6600 as shown on OS 1:2500 plan ST 76/7762 Edn of 1970 thence northwards to and along said boundary to the western boundary of parcel no 8046 as shown on 1:2500 OS plan ST 76/7763 Edn of 1970, thence northwards and eastwards along the western and northern boundaries of said parcel to the western boundary of parcel no 7869, thence northwards and eastwards along said boundary and northern boundary of said parcel to the western boundary of parcel no 8469, thence northwards along said western boundary and the western boundary of parcel no 8978 to the northeastern boundary of the property known as Springwoods, thence northwestwards along said boundary to the access road from Widcombe Hill to above named property, thence generally northwards along said road to a point opposite the southern boundary of the property known as Walden Lodge, thence eastwards and northwards along the southern and eastern boundaries of said property to Widcombe Hill, thence southwestwards along Widcombe Hill to a point opposite the southwestern boundary of Smallcombe Wood, thence northwestwards to and along said boundary to the southern boundary of Bathwick Cemetery thence generally northwards along said boundary to the access road to Bathwick Cemetery, thence northwestwards along said road to Horseshoe Walk, thence northwestwards

along Horseshoe Walk and Pulteney Gardens to Lime Grove, thence northwards along Lime Grove to the unnamed road between Pulteney Road and Lime Grove thence westwards along said road to Pulteney Road, thence northwards along said road to North Parade Road, thence westward along said road to the eastern boundary of Abbey Ward, thence northwards and following said boundary and the southern boundary of Walcot Ward to the eastern boundary of the District, thence southwards and following said boundary to the western boundary of parcel no 0178 as shown on 1:2500 OS plan no ST 76/7762 Edn of 1970, thence northwards along said boundary to Claverton Down Road, thence westwards along said road to point of commencement.

#### TWERTON WARD

Commencing on the western boundary of the District at the southwestern corner of parcel no 7700 as shown on 1:2500 OS plan no ST 70/7163 Edn of 1970 thence northwards and following said boundary and the southern boundary of Newbridge Ward to a point in the River Avon opposite the eastern boundary of the works at the rear of the property known as The Hollies, thence southwards to and along said boundary and in prolongation thereof across Lower Bristol Road to High Street (Twerton), thence southwestwards along said street to Shophouse Road, thence southwards along said road to a point opposite the southern boundary of the access road to Innox Park, thence southwestwards to and along said boundary and continuing along the eastern boundary of Innox Park to the southern boundary of No 46 Shophouse Road, thence eastwards along said boundary to a point opposite the northwestern boundary of No 8 Innox Road, thence southwestwards and southeastwards to and along said boundary and the rear boundary of the said property and the rear boundaries of Nos 10 to 16 Innox Road, Nos 3 to 7 Highfield Close and No 9 to 18 North View Close to the western boundary of No 54 The Hollow, thence southeastwards along said boundary to the rear boundary of No 56 The Hollow, thence southwestwards and southeastwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 56 to 60 and western boundary of the latter property

to The Hollow, thence southwestwards along The Hollow to the section of Haycombe Drive between Nos 144 and 146 The Hollow, thence northwestwards along said drive to a point opposite the southeastern boundary of the Salvation Army Hall, thence northeastwards to and along said boundary and in prolongation thereof to the southwestern boundary of No 13 East Close, thence northwestwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 14 to 20 East Close to the northwestern boundary of No 217 Haycombe Drive, thence southwestwards along said boundary to the southern boundary of No 16 East Way, thence westwards along the said boundary and northwestwards in a straight line to the western boundary of No 15 East Way, thence northwards along the said boundary to the southeastern boundary of No 211 Haycombe Drive, thence northeastwards, northwestwards and westwards along the northeastern and northwestern boundaries of the said property and the rear boundaries of Nos 209 to 183 Haycombe Drive to the northwestern boundary of the latter, thence southwestwards along said boundary and westwards in a straight line to the easternmost point of No 177 Haycombe Drive, thence northwestwards and westwards along the northeastern and northern boundaries of the said property and continuing along the rear boundaries of Nos 175 to 139 Haycombe Drive to the western boundary of the latter, thence southwards along said boundary and southwestwards in a straight line to the northern boundary of No 137 Haycombe Drive, thence westwards and southwards along the northern and rear boundaries of the said property and continuing generally southwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 135 to 97 Haycombe Drive, thence southwestwards along a prolongation of the southeastern boundary of the latter to Whiteway Road, thence northwestwards along the said road to a point opposite the southern boundary of parcel no 7700, thence westwards to and along said boundary to the point of commencement.



## WESTMORELAND WARD

Commencing on the eastern boundary of Twerton Ward at a point in The Hollow opposite the southwestern boundary of No 60 The Hollow, thence northwards and eastwards following the said ward boundary and the southern boundaries of Newbridge and Kingsmead Wards to Victoria Bridge, thence southwards to and along Victoria Bridge Road to Lower Bristol Road, thence westwards along said road to a point opposite the eastern boundary of St Peter's Church and Hall, thence southwards to and along said boundary, the eastern boundary of East Twerton Infants School and the eastern boundaries of Nos 8 and 9 Dorset Street and continuing in a straight line to the western boundary of No 17 Victoria Terrace, thence southwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 16 to 1 Victoria Terrace and continuing southwards across the main railway line and along the footpath west of No 25 Stanley Road West to Stanley Road West, thence eastwards along said road to Crandale Road, thence southwestwards along said road and Maybrick Road to the rear boundary of No 28 Cynthia Road, thence southeastwards and southwestwards along said boundary and the eastern boundary of said property to Cynthia Road, thence southeastwards along said road to a point opposite the eastern boundary of No 27 Cynthia Road thence southwestwards and westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of said property and continuing westwards in a straight line to and along the rear boundaries of Nos 20 to 17 Cynthia Road to the eastern boundary of No 16, thence southwestwards along said boundary to and across the dismantled railway and along the track at the rear of Nos 57 to 35 Claude Avenue and the church of the Ascension and in prolongation thereof to the northern boundary of South Twerton Junior School, thence generally southwestwards along the northern, eastern and southern boundaries of the said school to the path at rear of Nos 7 to 12 Lymore Terrace, thence southwestwards along said path and continuing southwestwards to and along the access road to the rear of Nos 3 to 133 Coronation Avenue and continuing to Chestnut Grove, thence northwestwards along said grove to Coronation Avenue, thence northeastwards

along said avenue to a point opposite the footpath south of the Trowbridge House (PH), thence northwestwards to and along said footpath to Ivy Avenue, and continuing along the southeastern boundary of No 90 Ivy Avenue to the rear boundary of that property, thence northeastwards to and along the rear boundaries of said property and of Nos 88 to 66 Ivy Avenue and in prolongation thereof to the rear boundary of No 2 Ivy Grove, thence generally northwestwards along said boundary, and the rear boundaries of Nos 3 to 19 Ivy Grove to Teddington Close, thence southeastwards along said close to a point opposite the southern boundary of No 15 Teddington Close, thence eastwards and northwards to and along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 15 and 14 Teddington Close to the southern boundary of No 12 Teddington Close, thence generally eastwards and following the southern, eastern and northern boundaries of Nos 12 and 11 Teddington Close and continuing northwards along the eastern and rear boundary of No 10 Teddington Close to the southern boundary of the building contractors yard, thence westwards along said boundary to the rear boundary of No 185 Southdown Road, thence northwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 187 to 203 Southdown Road and continuing northwestwards along the northeastern boundaries of Nos 203 to 207 Southdown Road to Lymore Avenue, thence northwestwards along said avenue to The Hollow, thence southwestwards along The Hollow to the point of commencement.

#### OLDFIELD WARD

Commencing at a point in Englishcombe Lane opposite the western boundary of No 202 Englishcombe Lane, thence northwards to and along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 43 to 19 Sladebrook Avenue and 224 to 132 Coronation Avenue and in prolongation thereof to the southern boundary of Westmoreland Ward, thence eastwards and following the said ward boundary to the main railway line, thence eastwards along said railway to Brougham Hayes, thence southwards along Brougham Hayes to Lower Oldfield Park at its intersection with Stanley Road West, thence westwards along the latter road to

Livingstone Road, thence southwestwards along the said road to Arlington Road, thence southeastwards along the said road to a point opposite the footpath on the northwestern side of No 1 Arlington Road thence northeastwards and following said footpath along the rear boundaries of Nos 1 to 8 Arlington Road and continuing eastwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 24 to 1 Shaftesbury Road to Junction Road, thence southwards along said road to Oldfield Road, thence southeastwards along said road to Bloomfield Avenue, thence southwestwards along said avenue to a point opposite the northern boundary of No 40 Bloomfield Road, thence westwards, southwards and eastwards to and along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 39 to 11 Maple Gardens and continuing eastwards along the southern boundary of No 35 Maple Grove and in prolongation thereof to the western boundary of the property known as Avonleigh, thence southwards along the said boundary, the western boundary of the property known as Old Orchard and the western boundaries of Nos 2 to 24 Maple Grove to the northern boundary of the dismantled railway, thence southeastwards along said boundary to the path between Maple Grove and Chantry Mead Road, thence southwestwards along said path and in continuation thereof to Chantry Mead Road, thence southwestwards along said road to Bloomfield Park, thence southwestwards along said park crossing Englishcombe Lane to and along Westfield Close to a point opposite the northern boundary of No 40 Westfield Close, thence westwards to and along said boundary to the eastern boundary of No 29 Englishcombe Lane, thence southwards and westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said property to the eastern boundary of No 31 Englishcombe Lane, thence southwards and westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said property and continuing westwards along the southern boundaries of Nos 33 to 155 Englishcombe Lane, The Englishcombe Inn (PH), the properties known as Bay Trees and The Firs to the eastern boundary of No 159 Englishcombe Lane, thence southwards and northwestwards along the eastern and western boundaries of Nos 159 to 169 Englishcombe Lane to the southern boundary of Nos 171 and 173 Englishcombe Lane, thence southwestwards along

said boundary to the footpath at the rear of No 1 to 11 Kingsway, thence northwestwards and southwestwards along said path to Kingsway, thence northwards along Kingsway to Englishcombe Lane, thence southwestwards along said lane to the point of commencement.

#### WIDCOMBE WARD

Commencing in Fox Hill at a point opposite the northern boundary of the MOD property, thence northwards along Fox Hill to a point opposite the footpath immediately south of the property known as Foxhill Grove, thence westwards to and along said footpath to a point opposite the western boundary of parcel no 2113 as shown on OS plan ST 7563 Edn of 1951, thence northwards to and along said boundary and the western boundaries of parcels no 1326 and 2029 and continuing across the dismantled railway to the southern boundary of parcel no 1543, thence westwards along said boundary and continuing to Lyncombe Vale Road, thence westwards along said road to a point opposite the eastern boundary of the property known as Roans thence northwards to and along said boundary and the eastern boundary of Hillside to Greenway Lane, thence westwards along said lane to a point opposite the footpath west of the property known as Greenway Lodge, thence northwards to and along said footpath to the northern boundary of the City of Bath Boys School, thence eastwards along said boundary to the western boundary of Alexandra Park, thence northwards along said boundary to the footpath on the eastern side of No 107 Shakespeare Avenue, thence northwards along said footpath to the footpath bordering the southern side of Beechen Cliff, thence westwards along said footpath and continuing westwards, northeastwards and northwestwards along the footpath bordering the southern and western sides of Magdalen Gardens to Holloway, thence southwestwards along Holloway to Wells Road, thence westwards along said road to Hayesfield Park, thence northwestwards along Hayesfield Park to Wells Road, thence southwards along said road to Oldfield Road, thence westwards along said road to the eastern boundary of Oldfield Ward, thence generally northwestwards and following said boundary and the eastern, southern

and western boundaries of Westmoreland, Kingsmead, Abbey and Bathwick Wards to Claverton Down Road, thence westwards along said road to Ralph Allen Drive, thence northwards along said Drive to Priory Close, thence westwards to and along said close to a point opposite the eastern boundary of No 61 Priory Close, thence northwards to and along the said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 60 to 56 Priory Close and continuing to the rear boundary of No 45 Priory Close, thence northwestwards and westwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 44 to 41 Priory Close and continuing westwards to and along the northern boundary of the MOD property and in prolongation thereof to the point of commencement.

#### SOUTHDOWN WARD

Commencing on the western boundary of the District at Padleigh Hill thence westwards and following said boundary to the southern boundary of Twerton Ward, thence eastwards and following said ward boundary and the southern and western boundaries of Westmoreland and Oldfield Wards to Englishcombe Lane, thence southwestwards along said lane and continuing along Padleigh Hill to the point of commencement.

#### BLOOMFIELD WARD

Commencing on the southern boundary of the District at the southwestern corner of the playing field east of Cranmore Place and adjoining Wansdyke thence generally northwestwards and following said district boundary to the southern boundary of Southdown Ward, thence northeastwards and following said ward boundary and the southern boundary of Oldfield Ward to the eastern boundary of parcel no 7700 as shown on OS 1:2500 ST 72/7363 Edn of 1963, thence southwards along said boundary and continuing southwards to and along the western boundary of no 264 Bloomfield Road to Bloomfield Road, thence southwestwards along said road to Frome Road, thence southeastwards along said road to the A367 (Wellsway), thence southwestwards along Wellsway to the southwestern boundary of Wansdyke School, thence southeastwards along said boundary and continuing along the southwestern boundary of the playing

field and in prolongation thereof to the western boundary of the playing field east of Cranmore Place and adjoining Wansdyke, thence southwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

#### LYNCOMBE WARD

Commencing on the southern boundary of the District at the junction with the eastern boundary of Bloomfield Ward, thence northwards and following said ward boundary and the eastern/southern and western boundaries of Oldfield and Widcombe Wards to the southeastern boundary of parcel no 0713 (1:2500 OS ST 7563 Edn of 1951), thence southwestwards along said boundary, the eastern boundary of parcel no 0703 and the western boundary of No 48 Axbridge Road and continuing along the western boundary of Axbridge Road to a point opposite the footpath north of Nos 32 to 38 Meare Road, thence northwestwards and southwestwards to and along said footpath and the footpath west of Nos 38 to 50 Meare Road to Meare Road, thence northwestwards and southwestwards along said road to a point opposite the footpath north of No 52 Meare Road, thence northwestwards and generally southwestwards along said footpath and the footpath to the west and north of Nos 54 to 90 Meare Road and continuing southwestwards along the footpath west of No 71 Meare Road to the footpath north of Nos 45 to 47 Drake Avenue, thence northwestwards, southwestwards and southeastwards along said footpath to a point opposite the western boundary of the garages west of Drake Avenue, thence southwestwards along said western boundary to Drake Avenue, thence southeastwards along Drake Avenue to a point opposite the footpath to the west of 48 to 53 Drake Avenue, thence southwestwards and southeastwards along said footpath to Drake Avenue, thence southeastwards along said avenue to a point opposite the rear boundary of No 16 Oakhill Road, thence southwestwards to and along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 15 to 8 Oakhill Road and continuing southwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 23 to 3 Sedgemoor Road and the western boundary of No 35 Hawthorn Grove to Hawthorn Grove, thence westwards along said grove to a point opposite the eastern boundary of No 33 Hawthorn Grove, thence northwards and westwards along said boundary and the rear

boundaries of 33 to 1 Hawthorn Grove to Entry Hill, thence southwards along said hill to Bradford Road, thence westwards along said road to a point opposite the western boundary of No 36 Bradford Road, thence southwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 38 to 20 Southstoke Road and of the unnumbered house immediately to the south of No 20 and of the property known as Talgourie and the western boundary of the Cross Keyes (PH) and in prolongation thereof to the southern boundary of the District, thence westwards along said district boundary to the point of commencement.

#### COMBE DOWN WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Lyncombe Ward meets the southern boundary of the District thence northwards and following said eastern boundary and the southern boundaries of Widcombe and Bathwick Wards to the southern boundary of the District, thence southwestwards along said district boundary to the point of commencement.
