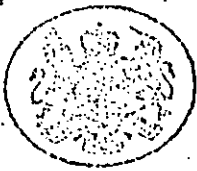

REVIEW OF ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS - COUNTY OF SURREY
COMMISSION'S REPORT NO. 394 - CORRIGENDUM

1. Elmbridge Borough Council have drawn the Commission's attention to certain errors in the description of the proposed Walton-on-Thames electoral division contained in Schedule 2 (pages 2 and 3) of the Commission's Report No. 394.
2. The following descriptions have been agreed by the Borough Council and Ordnance Survey. I would be grateful if you could amend your copies of the report accordingly.

Walton-on-Thames division (page 2, Schedule 2)

Delete from 'and' in line 1 to 'said property and' in line 5, insert:- and that part of Walton Central Ward commencing at the junction of Kings Road and Sidney Road on the southeastern boundary of Walton Central Ward, thence northwestwards along Sidney Road to a point opposite the southeastern boundary of No. 72 Sidney Road, thence southwestwards to and along said southeastern boundary to the northeastern boundary of No.105 Kings Road, thence northwestwards along said northeastern boundary to the rear boundary of the last mentioned property, thence southwestwards along said rear boundary and the rear boundary of No. 103 Kings Road to the rear boundary of No.1 Kings Close, thence northwestwards along said rear boundary and continuing northwestwards along

Walton-on-Thames division (page 3, Schedule 2)

Delete from 'and' in line 24 to 'said street' in line 26, insert:- to the rear boundary of the property known as Elendale, thence northwestwards along said rear boundary and the rear boundaries of the properties known as Restville, Brora, Russets, Cottesmore and Salworthy to the southeastern boundary of Walton-on-Thames Baptist Church, thence southwestwards along said southeastern boundary to Colby Road, thence northwestwards along said road to Winchester Road, thence northeastwards along said road to a point opposite the southwestern boundary of No.1 Winchester Road, thence northwestwards to and along said southwestern boundary and in prolongation thereof to the northwestern boundary of No. 63 High Street, thence southwestwards along said northwestern boundary to the southwestern boundary of the Depot, thence generally northwestwards along said southwestern boundary to Church Walk, thence northeastwards along said Walk to a point opposite the rear boundary of No. 51c High Street, thence northwestwards along said rear boundary and the rear boundary of No. 49 High Street

to the southeastern boundary of No. 47 High Street, thence northeastwards along said southeastern boundary to the northeasternmost point of the last mentioned property, thence northwestwards from said point in a straight line to the rear boundary of No. 45a High Street, thence northwestwards along said rear boundary and the rear boundary of No. 45 High Street to the southeastern boundary of No. 43 High Street, thence northeastwards along said southeastern boundary to the rear boundary of the last mentioned property, thence northwestwards along said rear boundary and continuing generally northwestwards along the rear boundaries of Nos. 41b ^{to} and 41 High Street to and crossing Churchfield Road in a straight line to and generally northwestwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 39 to 1a High Street to Church Street, thence southwestwards along said street.

3. Copies of this letter have been sent to Surrey County Council, all district Councils in the County and the Member of Parliament for the constituency concerned.

PROPOSALS FOR THE FUTURE ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE COUNTY OF SURREY

1. The last Order under Section 51 of the Local Government Act 1972 in relation to electoral arrangements for districts in the county of Surrey was made on 6 August 1979. As required by Section 63 and Schedule 9 of the Act we have now reviewed the electoral arrangements for that county, using the procedures we had set out in our Report No 6.
2. We informed the Surrey County Council in a consultation letter dated 18 September 1979 that we proposed to conduct the review, and sent copies of the letter to all local authorities and parish meetings in the county, to the MPs representing the constituencies concerned, to the headquarters of the main political parties and to the editors both of local papers circulating in the county and of the local government press. Notices in the local press announced the start of the review and invited comments from members of the public and from interested bodies.
3. On 31 January 1980 the County Council submitted to us a draft scheme in which they suggested 76 electoral divisions for the county, each returning one member in accordance with Section 6(2)(a) of the Act.
4. We considered this scheme together with the views expressed by local interests. On 11 April 1980 we issued draft proposals which we sent to all those who had received our consultation letter or commented on the County Council's draft scheme. Notices were inserted in the local press announcing that the draft proposals had been issued and could be inspected at the County Council's offices.
5. We incorporated in our draft proposals certain modifications to the County Council's draft scheme, designed to take account of local ties and based on comments made about the county scheme.

6. The modifications we made were as follows:

(a) Elmbridge Borough

We replaced the County Council's arrangements for the Walton and Weybridge area with those suggested by the Chertsey and Walton Labour Party.

(b) Epsom and Ewell Borough

We replaced the 5 electoral divisions proposed by the County Council with 5 divisions proposed by the Cuddington Residents' Association.

(c) Guildford Borough

We transferred the parish of St Martha from the proposed Shalford division to the proposed Shere division.

(d) Tandridge District

We transferred the parish of Horne from the proposed Godstone division to the proposed Lingfield division.

(e) Names of electoral divisions

At the request of the County Council we changed the name of the proposed Heather-park division in the Borough of Surrey Heath to 'Heatherside and Parkside', and at the request of Tandridge District Council we changed the name of the proposed Oxted and Limpsfield division to 'Oxted'.

7. We received comments in response to our draft proposals from the Surrey County Council, two borough Councils, one district council, five parish councils, one town council, three Members of Parliament, five county or district councillors, fifteen political organisations, nine other local associations and fifteen members of the public. A list of those who wrote to us is given at Appendix 1 to this Report.

8. The Surrey County Council supported our draft proposals except in respect of our proposals for the Borough of Epsom and Ewell and the Walton and Weybridge area of the Borough of Elmbridge. They considered that in both boroughs the provisions of **their** original scheme were preferable to those in our draft proposals in that they did not involve the splitting of borough wards or polling districts.

They were wholly opposed to our proposals for the Walton and Weybridge area of Elmbridge but stated that, if we were unwilling to accept their original proposals for Epsom and Ewell, they would accept our proposals for that borough as being next in their order of preference.

9. The other comments we received can be summarized as follows:-

(a) Elmbridge Borough

The majority of comments on our draft proposals were concerned with this district, particularly the proposed arrangements for the Walton and Weybridge area. The Chertsey and Walton Constituency Labour Party (supported by a petition bearing 157 signatures), three local branches of the Labour Party and four members of the public supported our proposals for the area. The Chertsey, Walton and Weybridge Liberal Association, Councillor Curran and a local resident welcomed our proposals as an improvement over the County Council's draft scheme but considered that it was desirable to avoid the splitting of polling districts and submitted identical alternative schemes which were based on a similar grouping of whole or part borough wards but which followed polling district boundaries wherever a ward was divided. The Borough Council, the Chertsey and Walton Conservative Association (who submitted their own alternative), Mr Geoffrey Pattie MP, Councillor Harman and nine members of the public objected to our proposals. The reasons for objecting included the fact that our proposals divided borough wards and polling districts and that they did not reflect local ties. Several objectors, among them the Borough Council, expressed a strong preference for the arrangements proposed by the County Council. The remaining comments concerned other divisions in the Borough. East Molesey Conservative Association and Esher Constituency Conservative Association urged that the existing Molesey and Esher divisions should be retained. The local residents' association considered that Hinchley Wood ward should be placed in the same division as Long Ditton ward. A local resident also thought that a Claygate and Hinchley Wood

division was unlikely to provide a comfortable marriage.

(b) Epsom and Ewell Borough

The Borough Council, Epsom and Ewell Constituency Liberal Association, County Councillor Davison and four residents' associations supported our proposals for the borough. Epsom and Ewell District Labour Party questioned our proposals both on failure to take account of local ties and on standard of representation.

They resubmitted their alternative scheme which provided for a different grouping of whole borough wards. Councillor Mrs Storer favoured the retention of the existing arrangements or failing that the adoption of a scheme which had been proposed by the Borough Council at an earlier stage in this review.

(c) Mole Valley District

The Leatherhead Society supported our proposed Leatherhead and Fetcham East division.

(d) Runnymede Borough

Addlestone Conservative Association welcomed our proposed Addlestone division. Chertsey and Walton Conservative Association, Chertsey Town Conservative Association, Chertsey Chamber of Commerce, Mr Geoffrey Pattie MP and County Councillor Payne commented that our proposed Chertsey division was too small and suggested ways in which it could be enlarged. One of these suggestions concerning the transfer of Thorpe East polling district to Chertsey division was opposed by Mr Michael Grylls MP.

(e) Spelthorne Borough

Spelthorne Conservative Association supported our draft proposals. The Shepperton Residents' Association objected to our proposed Shepperton, and Laleham and Shepperton Green divisions and requested that the two Shepperton borough wards be placed in the same division.

(f) Tandridge District

Chelsham and Farleigh, and Tatsfield Parish Councils objected to the inclusion

of their parishes in the proposed Warlingham division. Both Parish Councils suggested alternative arrangements whereby their parish would be grouped with other rural parishes rather than with a largely urban area. Limpsfield Parish Council objected to the name of Oxted division and suggested that we should revert to the original draft scheme name 'Oxted and Limpsfield'.

(g) Waverley District

Elstead and Witley Parish Councils supported our proposals. Waverley District Council, Godalming Town Council, the Farncombe and Godalming branch of the Farnham Conservative and Unionist Association, Godalming and District Chamber of Commerce and the Rt Hon Maurice Macmillan MP objected to our proposed Godalming North and Godalming South **and Rural divisions**.

Mr Macmillan took the view that the two divisions were unbalanced since Godalming North comprised the residential area of Godalming while Godalming South and Rural comprised the commercial area and a number of parishes. He considered that a different grouping of town wards and parishes should be found. Waverley District Council and the three other objectors requested that the whole of the town of Godalming form one division while the parishes formed another.

(h) Woking Borough

Woking Constituency Labour Party objected to our proposals for the borough and submitted a variant of the alternative scheme which they had previously put forward. They considered this scheme to be better than our proposals both in terms of community of interest and standard of representation.

10. When we came to reassess our draft proposals we took account of all the comments we had received on them. Among those comments there were some requests that the issues raised should be argued before an Assistant Commissioner at a local meeting. We were satisfied, however, that we had sufficient information before us to reach a final decision on the arrangements for all parts of the county.

We came to the following conclusions:

(a) Elmbridge Borough

Our draft proposals for this borough gave rise to considerable comment, particularly in relation to the three Walton and Weybridge divisions. We noted however that there was also continued opposition to the proposed changes to the existing arrangements in the area of the former urban district of Esher. Retention of the existing arrangements would have provided a significantly less even standard of representation than our draft proposals and there was no new evidence to suggest that we should reverse our former decision that this would not be acceptable. With regard to the Walton and Weybridge area, much of the opposition stemmed from the view that it was undesirable and confusing to propose an electoral division boundary which followed neither a borough ward nor a polling district boundary. Many of those objecting to our proposals supported the arrangements which had formed part of the County Council's draft scheme. We therefore re-examined our proposals together with the draft scheme and the alternative schemes which had been submitted. We noted that neither the draft scheme nor the alternative scheme suggested by the Chertsey and Walton Conservative Association produced a more even standard of representation than our proposals and that there was no clear indication that they had more regard for local ties and community interests.

The alternative scheme suggested by the Chertsey, Walton and Weybridge Liberal Association, Councillor Curran and a local resident, however, was very similar to our draft proposals in terms of both standard of representation and grouping of communities. It met one of the main criticisms that had been levelled at our draft proposals in that it did not split polling districts. Whilst we see no objection in principle to boundaries that divide polling districts, we accept that there are advantages of administrative convenience in avoiding them unless other considerations are overriding. This alternative scheme was, however, still open to the other major criticism that it did not follow ward boundaries completely. The provisions of the Local Government Act 1972 require us to have regard to these boundaries as we must to the desirability of fixing boundaries

that will be readily identifiable, and to any local ties that would be broken by any particular divisional boundary. These considerations are however subject to others, in particular the numerical balance between divisions. With this in mind we concluded that in this instance the balance of advantage lay with this alternative scheme rather than with the County Council's draft scheme.

(b) Epsom and Ewell Borough

Our draft proposals produced a markedly more even standard of representation in the Borough than either the County Council's draft scheme or the alternatives which had been suggested. In addition, the draft scheme had attracted considerable opposition whereas our draft proposals were supported not only by various local organisations but also by the Borough Council, who had withdrawn their own proposals in favour of ours. Again, the principal objection by the County Council to our draft proposals was that they considered divisions should consist of whole borough wards wherever possible. For the reasons explained earlier we did not accept their objection as overriding and decided that we should adhere to our draft proposals.

(c) Runnymede Borough

Our draft proposals in respect of this borough were identical with the County Council's draft scheme and the objections received were similar to those made in response to the draft scheme. We noted that the alternative suggestions which had been made to enlarge the Chertsey division had attracted opposition from other quarters. We concluded as the County Council had done before us, that there was no completely satisfactory arrangement for the Chertsey area. On balance we considered that our draft proposals which were acceptable to both the County Council and the Borough Council were to be preferred.

(d) Spelthorne Borough

We found that the possible alternative arrangements to meet the objection raised by the residents' association would have necessitated a complete reorganisation of all the divisions in the borough if a reasonable standard of representation were to be achieved. The resulting arrangements did not seem to us to offer any advantage over our proposals, which appeared to be generally acceptable.

(e) Tandridge District

We noted that the Parish Councils of Chelsham and Farleigh, and Tatsfield had not been able to agree on an alternative arrangement of divisions which would meet their wish to be included in a rural division. Furthermore neither of the suggestions put forward would have secured the even standard of representation achieved by our draft proposals. We considered the objection raised by Limpsfield Parish Council but we were not convinced that there were sufficient grounds to change our original decision to rename Oxted and Limpsfield division as 'Oxted'.

(f) Waverley District

Our draft proposals were identical with the County Council's draft scheme and most of the objections we received reiterated views expressed on that scheme. We noted that the proposal to place the whole of the town of Godalming in a single division would result in that division being seriously under-represented and that there would be a lack of balance between urban and rural representation. We could see no satisfactory alternative arrangement.

(g) Woking Borough

We considered the Woking Constituency Labour Party's alternative scheme for the whole borough but concluded that, in terms of standard of representation and community ties, it offered no appreciable improvement over our draft proposals which had not attracted opposition from any other quarter.

11. In the light of the conclusions set out in paragraph 10 above we decided to confirm our draft proposals as our final proposals for the county, subject to the

amendment to the Walton and Weybridge divisions of Elmbridge Borough indicated in paragraph 10(a) above.

12. Details of these final proposals are set out in Schedules 1 and 2 to this ~~draft~~ report and on the attached map. Schedule 1 gives the names of the electoral divisions. A detailed description of the boundaries of the proposed electoral divisions, as defined on the map, is set out in Schedule 2.

PUBLICATION

13. In accordance with Section 60(5)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, a copy of the report and a copy of the map are being sent to the Surrey County Council and will be available for inspection at the Council's main offices. Copies of this report (without the map) are being sent to all those who received the consultation letter and to those who made comments.
