PROPOSALS FOR REVISED ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE DISTRICT
OF RUNNYMEDE IN THE COUNTY OF SURREY

1. We, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, having carried out our initial review of the electoral arrangements for the district of Runnymede in accordance with the requirements of section 63 and Schedule 9 to the Local Government Act 1972, present our proposals for the future electoral arrangements for that district.
2. In accordance with the procedure laid down in section 60(1) and (2) of the 1972 Act, notice was given on 31 January 1974 that we were to undertake this review. This was incorporated in a consultation letter addressed to the Runnymede District Council, copies of which were circulated to the Surrey County Council, the Members of Parliament for the constituencies concerned and the headquarters of the main political parties. Copies were also sent to the editors of the local newspapers circulating in the area and to the local government press. Notices inserted in the local press announced the start of the review and invited comments from members of the public and from any interested bodies.
3. Runnymede District Council were invited to prepare a draft scheme of representation for our consideration. In doing so, they were asked to observe the rules laid down in Schedule 11 to the Local Government Act 1972 and the guidelines which we set out in our Report No 6 about the proposed size of the council and the proposed number of councillors for each ward. They were also asked to take into account any views expressed to them following their consultation with local interests.

We therefore asked that they should publish details of their provisional proposals about a month before they submitted their draft scheme to us, thus allowing an opportunity for local comment.

4. On 28 June 1974 the Runnymede District Council presented their draft scheme of representation. In accordance with section 7(4)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, they had exercised an option for elections by thirds and they proposed to divide the area of the borough into 14 wards each returning 3 members to form a council of 42, 2 more than the existing Council.

5. Following publication of their provisional proposals, a few comments were submitted. These suggested a minor change between two wards.

6. We considered the Council's draft scheme together with the suggestion for the small boundary alteration, which we decided to accept. We thought that it might be possible to modify the draft scheme so as to secure greater equality of representation, but we found that any major alteration to proposed ward boundaries would cut local ties or would be undesirable from the point of view of the geography of the area. Having regard to the rules in Schedule 11 to the Local Government Act 1972 and to our own guidelines, we considered that the Council's draft scheme provided as satisfactory a basis for representation in the District as was possible in the circumstances. After consulting Ordnance Survey, we made some minor adjustments to the alignment of some of the boundaries in order to secure boundary lines which were readily identifiable on the ground. We decided to adopt the ward names suggested by the Council. We then formulated our draft proposals accordingly.

7. On 17 October 1974 we issued our draft proposals and these were sent to all who had received our consultation letter or had commented on the Council's draft scheme. The Council were asked to make these draft proposals, and the accompanying map which

defined the proposed ward boundaries, available for inspection at their main offices. Representations on our draft proposals were invited from those to whom they were circulated and, by public notices, from other members of the public and interested bodies. We asked that any comments should reach us by 13 December.

8. The comments recorded local support for the draft proposals and included a proposals by the Runnymede District Council that four ward names should be amended so as to include the name of the town in which they were situated.

9. We considered that the suggested names should be adopted and, subject to this amendment, we decided to confirm our draft proposals as our final proposals.

10. Details of these final proposals are set out in Schedule 1 to this report and on the attached map. Schedule 1 gives the names of the wards and the number of councillors to be returned by each. The boundaries of the new wards are defined on the map.

PUBLICATION

11. In accordance with Section 60(5)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, a copy of this report and a copy of the map are being sent to Runnymede District Council and will be available for public inspection at the Council's main offices. Copies of this report are also being sent to those who received the consultation letter and to those who made comments. A detailed description of the boundaries of the proposed wards, as defined on the map, is set out in Schedule 2 to this report.

PROPOSED WARD BOUNDARIES

ENGLEFIELD GREEN WEST WARD

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the District being Grid Reference SU9709870076; thence generally northeastwards and southeastwards following the western and northern boundaries of the District to a point opposite the eastern boundary of Parcel No 0055; thence generally southwards to and along said eastern boundary to the drain that leads to Langham's Pond; thence southwards along said drain and across Langham's Pond to the northern most corner of Parcel No 3900 all as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0072-0172 Edition of 1971; thence southwestwards along the northern boundary of said parcel to the road leading to Coopers Hill Lane; thence generally southwards along said road to Coopers Hill Lane; thence generally northwestwards along said lane to Coopers Hill Lodge where it meets the road that connects Coopers Hill Lane with St Judes Road; thence southwestwards along said road and continuing generally southwards along St Judes Road and Bagshot Road to London Road; thence southwards along London Road to a point opposite the stream that forms the southern boundary of Egham Wick Plantations within Windsor Great Park; thence generally southwestwards to and along said stream to the southern boundary of Wick Pond; thence southwestwards and northwards along the southern and western boundaries of Wick Pond to the stream that joins Wick Pond at Eton Bridge; thence northwards along said stream to the track leading to the eastern boundary of Parcel No 3000 as shown on 1:2500 Plan SU9669-9769 Edition of 1971 and SU9869-9969 Edition of 1972; thence northwestwards along said track to the eastern boundary of said parcel; thence northwestwards in a straight line to the point of commencement.

ENGLEFIELD GREEN EAST WARD

Commencing at the point where Prune Hill meets the southern Region Egham to Wokingham Railway at Rusham Crossing; thence southwards along said railway to point where the railway is crossed by the footpath leading to Whitehall Farm; thence northwestwards along said footpath to a point where it meets the north-western boundary of Parcel No 1677 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0069-0169 Edition of 1970; thence southwards and following said northwestern boundary and continuing westwards along the northern boundary of Parcel No 0074 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SU9869-9969 Edition of 1972; thence southwestwards along the western boundary of said parcel and continuing southwestwards and northwestwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of Parcel No 6959 to Bakenham Lane; thence southwestwards along said lane to a point opposite the northern boundary of Parcel No 2854; thence northwestwards to and along said northern boundary to the footpath leading to London Road; thence northwestwards along said footpath to the eastern boundary of Englefield Green West Ward; thence generally northwards following said eastern boundary to a point opposite the northernmost corner of Parcel No 3664 as shown on 1:2500 Plan TQ0071-0171 Edition of 1973; thence southwestwards in a straight line to the said northernmost corner and continuing southwestwards, westwards and generally southwards along the northern and western boundaries of Parcel Nos 3664 and 1763 to a point where it meets the western boundary of Parcel No 3244; thence generally southwestwards following said western boundary to the point where it meets the access road leading to Runnymede Park at Grid Reference TQ0011871505; thence generally southwards along said road to Tite Hill; thence northeastwards along said hill to a point opposite the western boundary of No 2 Alderside Walk; thence generally southwards to and along said western boundary, across Alderside Walk and continuing southwards along the eastern boundaries of the properties No 3 and 5 Alderside Walk; thence westwards and southwards along the southern boundaries of Nos 5 and 7 Alderside Walk and the eastern boundary of No 1 Middle Hill and in prolongation thereof to Middle Hill; thence eastwards along said hill to Egham Hill; thence northeastwards along said hill to a point opposite the access road to the property known as Danehurst End; thence southeastwards to and along said access road to a point opposite the southern boundary of Hill House, Egham Hill;

thence continuing southeastwards in a straight line to a point on the western boundary of No 77 Spring Rise at Grid Reference TQ0035870942; thence southwestwards and southeastwards along the western boundaries of Nos 77 to 1 Spring Rise; thence in a straight line to the eastern boundary of the Library Depository; thence southwestwards along said eastern boundary and the western boundary of the Playing Field which is situated on the north side of Prune Hill; thence southwards along said boundary to Prune Hill; thence southeastwards along said hill to the point of commencement.

EGHAM WARD

Commencing at a point where the eastern boundary of Englefield Green West Ward meets the northern boundary of the District; thence northeastwards and following said northern boundary to a point opposite the eastern boundary of No 26 Woodhaw; thence southwestwards to and along said eastern boundary and continuing along the eastern boundary of the property known as Formentor to a point where it meets the northern boundary of the properties known as Stanford Cottages; thence southeastwards along said northern boundary to where it meets the eastern boundary of said properties; thence southwestwards along the said eastern boundary to the Causeway; thence southeastwards along the Causeway to Hawthorne Road and in prolongation thereof to the Egham to Staines Railway; thence eastwards along said railway to a point opposite the western boundary of No 11 Century Road; thence southwestwards to and along said western boundary to Mullens Road; thence southwestwards along said road to Rowan Avenue; thence southwestwards along said avenue to Pooley Green Road; thence southeastwards along said road to a point opposite the cul-de-sac between Nos 82 and 84 Pooley Green Road; thence southwestwards to and along said cul-de-sac and continuing along the drain that runs from the southern end of the cul-de-sac to Mead Lake Ditch; thence southwestwards and southwards along said ditch to a point opposite the northeastern corner of Parcel No 0062 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0070-0170 Edition of 1970; thence westwards to and along the northern boundary of said parcel

to its northwest corner; thence northwestwards in a straight line to the southeastern corner of Parcel No 8576; thence westwards along the southern boundary of Parcel No 8576 to the southwestern corner of said parcel; thence southwestwards in a straight line to the southernmost corner of Parcel No 2866 and in prolongation thereof to Stroude Road; thence northwestwards along said road to Whitehall Lane; thence southwestwards along said lane to the northeast corner of Milton Park Cottages; thence southeastwards along the eastern boundary of No 1 Milton Park Cottages and generally southwestwards along the southwestern boundaries of Nos 1 and 2 Milton Park Cottages and Nos 1 and 2 Crown Cottages to the southern boundary of No 2 Crown Cottages; thence westwards along said southern boundary to Whitehall Lane; thence generally southwards along said lane to the southeastern corner of Parcel No 3994 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0069-0169 Edition of 1970; thence southwestwards following the southern boundary of said parcel and Parcel No 3114 to the eastern boundary of Virginia Water Ward; thence generally northwards following the eastern boundary of said ward, Englefield Green East Ward and Englefield Green West Ward to the point of commencement.

HYTHE WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Egham Ward meets the northern boundary of the District; thence generally southeastwards along the northern boundary of the District to a point opposite the northern boundary of River Cottage; thence southwestwards to and along said northern boundary to Timsway; thence northwestwards and southwestwards along Timsway to a point opposite the northeastern boundary of the property known as Fenbrook, Timsway; thence generally northwestwards to and along the said northeastern boundary and southwestwards along the northern boundary of said property to the rear boundary of No 11 Coopers Close; thence generally southwestwards along the said rear boundary and southeastwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 17 and 18 Coopers Close and continuing southwestwards along the southern boundary of Nos 18 and 19 Coopers Close and No 43 Chertsey Lane to the southernmost corner; thence southwestwards in a straight line to the drain situated between Parcel Nos 9849 and 1600 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0270-0370 Edition of 1964; thence continuing southwestwards along the said drain to Mead

Lake Ditch; thence northwestwards along said ditch to the eastern boundary of Egham Ward; thence generally northwards along said eastern boundary to the point of commencement.

THORPE WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Virginia Water Ward meets the southern boundary of Egham Ward; thence generally northeastwards and following said southern boundary and the southern and eastern boundary of Hythe Ward to the eastern boundary of the District; thence generally southwards along said eastern boundary to a point opposite Abbey River; thence southeastwards to and along said river to Mixnam Lane; thence westwards along said lane to Chertsey Lane; thence southeastwards along said lane to a point opposite the drain that constitutes the southern boundary of parcel No 0054 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0468-0568 Edition of 1970; thence westwards to and along said drain to the most southerly point of Parcel No 0054; thence southwestwards in a straight line through Grid Reference TQ0364868400 to the stream that flows between the Fleet and the Bourne; thence generally southwards along said stream to the Bourne; thence generally northwestwards and following the Bourne to Trumps Mill Lane; thence northwards along said lane to the Chertsey to Egham Railway; thence northwestwards and northwards along said railway to the eastern boundary of Englefield Green East Ward; thence northwards along said eastern boundary to the point of commencement.

VIRGINIA WATER WARD

Commencing at the point where the western boundary of the District meets the southern boundary of Englefield Green West Ward; thence generally southeastwards and following the southern boundaries of said ward and Englefield Green East Ward and the western boundary of Thorpe Ward to the point where the Bourne crosses Trumps Mill Lane; thence southwards along said lane to Harrow Bottom Road; thence southeastwards along said road to a point opposite the path east of Parcel No 5200 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0067-0167 Edition of 1970; thence generally southwards to and along said path to the east of Parcel Nos 5200, 3069,⁰⁰³²/0019 as shown on TQ0066-0166 Edition of

1970 and continuing generally southwestwards along said path to the south of Parcel No 0019 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SU9866-99 Edition of 1972 to Grid Reference SU9990066108; thence generally southwestwards along the bank north of Parcels Nos 7500 and 5400 to the western boundary of Parcel No 5400; thence southwestwards in a straight line to the bank at Grid Reference SU9927165999; thence continuing generally southwestwards following the said bank to the south of Parcel Nos 1400 5485 and the east of Parcel Nos 4578, 3870, 2557, 1348 and 0039 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SU9865-9965 Edition of 1972 to a point where it meets the north eastern boundary of the property known as Fairfields, Longcross Road; thence generally southeastwards along said boundary to the northwestern boundary of the property known as Heathlands, Longcross Road; thence generally southwestwards along said northwestern boundary and the northwestern boundary of the property known as Heathlands Cottage, Longcross Road to Longcross Road; thence northwestwards along said road to the western boundary of the District; thence generally northwards along said District boundary to the point of commencement.

TQ0264-0364 Edition of 1967 to Bittams Lane; thence southeastwards in a straight line to the easternmost point of Parcel No 1025; thence southeastwards in a straight line to the easternmost corner of the Property known as Mount Pleasant, Spratts Lane; thence generally southwards along the western boundaries of Parcel Nos 3379 and 3257 and westwards along the southern boundary of Parcel No 2150 to a point opposite the western boundary of Parcel No 2337; thence generally southwards and southeastwards to and along the western boundaries of Parcels Nos 2337 and 3600 all as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plans TQ0263-0363 Edition of 1968 and TQ0262-0362 Edition of 1970 to Brox Lane; thence southwestwards along said lane to a point opposite the western boundary of Parcel No 2172; thence southeastwards northeastwards and southeastwards to and along the western and southern boundaries of said parcel to the Bourne; thence generally southwestwards and following the Bourne to the southern boundary of the District; thence generally northwestwards following the District boundary to the point of commencement.

CHERTSEY ST ANN'S WARD

Commencing at a point where the eastern boundary of Foxhills Ward meets the southern boundary of Thorpe Ward; thence generally eastwards following the southern and eastern boundaries of Thorpe Ward to the eastern boundary of the District; thence generally southeastwards along said eastern boundary to a point opposite the northern boundary of Parcel No 9955 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0467-0567 Edition of 1970; thence southwestwards to and along said northern boundary to Burway Ditch; thence southeastwards along said ditch to a point opposite the drain that constitutes the boundary between Parcel No 6146 and 8732; thence southwestwards to and along said drain and continuing due southwards in a straight line across Abbey River to the western boundary of Parcel No 5900; thence southwestwards along the western boundary of said parcel to Willow Walk; thence northwestwards along that part of Willow Walk that bounds the

southern side of the grounds of Abbey Barn Youth Club; thence northwards in a straight line to and along the southwestern boundaries of the properties known as The Old Parsonage, and Kilree Cottage, Abbey Green and No 2 Church Walk to Church Walk; thence southwestwards along said walk crossing Windsor Street to Guildford Street; thence westwards along said street and Guildford Road to the eastern boundary of Foxhills Ward; thence generally northwards along said eastern boundary to the point of commencement.

CHERTSEY MEADS WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Foxhills Ward meets the southeastern boundary of Chertsey St Ann's Ward; thence generally north-eastwards along said southeastern boundary to the eastern boundary of the District; thence southeastwards following said District boundary to a point opposite the road which is included within Parcel No 4316 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0666-0766 Edition of 1965; thence westwards to and along said road to a point opposite the eastern boundary of Parcel No 3300; thence southeastwards to and along said eastern boundary and the eastern boundary of Parcel No 3300 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0665-0765 Edition of 1965 to The Bourne; thence generally westwards and northwards along the Bourne to a point opposite the footpath that forms the western boundary of Brackendene Caravan Site; thence southwards to and along said footpath to a point opposite the northern boundary of The Meads County Secondary School; thence generally southwestwards to and along said northern boundary and in prolongation thereof to a point opposite the eastern boundary of the property known as Oak Cottage at Clays Corner; thence southeastwards and westwards to and along the eastern and southern boundaries of said property to Chertsey Road; thence southwards along said road to a point opposite the northern boundary of No 239 Chertsey Road; thence northwestwards, southwards and northwestwards to and along the northern and western boundaries of said property and the northern boundary of No 237 Chertsey Road and southwards along the western boundary of the last mentioned property to the southern boundary of the properties No 216 to No 140

Eastworth Road; thence northwestwards along said southern boundary to the eastern boundary of the allotment gardens which adjoin the Chertsey Cemetery; thence generally southwestwards along the eastern boundary and in prolongation thereof to the Chertsey to Addlestone Railway; thence northwestwards along said railway to the footbridge on the said railway; thence generally southwestwards and southwards along said footbridge and continuing along the footpath adjoining the footbridge to where it meets the proposed new road which runs 100 metres south of Bittams Lane; thence southwestwards along said proposed road to the eastern boundary of Foxhills Ward; thence generally northwestwards along said eastern boundary to the point of commencement.

ADDLESTONE ST PAUL'S WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Foxhills Ward meets the southern boundary of Chertsey Meads Ward; thence generally northeastwards along the southern boundary of Chertsey Meads Ward to a point opposite the access road leading to Addlestone Cemetery; thence southeastwards and southwards to and along said access road to a point opposite the northern boundary of Addlestone Cemetery Lodge; thence eastwards and southwards to and along the northern and eastern boundaries of said Lodge to Green Lane; thence southeastwards along said lane to School Lane; thence southwestwards and southeastwards along said lane to Church Road; thence northeastwards along said road to The Grove; thence southeastwards along The Grove to Liberty Lane; thence eastwards along said lane to a point opposite the western boundary of No 29 Liberty Lane; thence southwestwards and southeastwards to and along the western boundary of said property and continuing southeastwards along the western boundaries of the properties known as Sayes House, Loose Chippings, Norgestacks and Nos 1 to 21 Sayes Court; thence southeastwards in a straight line to the northwestern corner of Parcel No 0175 as shown on 1:2500 Plan TQ0463-0563 Edition of 1968; thence southeastwards in a straight line through Grid Reference TQ0504263825 to The Bourne; thence generally southwestwards and following the Bourne to the eastern boundary

of Foxhills Ward; thence generally northwards along said ward boundary to the point of commencement.

ADDLESTONE NORTH WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Addlestone St Paul's Ward meets the southern boundary of Chertsey Meads Ward thence generally northwards along the said southern boundary to Woburn Park Stream; thence generally southwestwards along said stream to Weybridge Road; thence northwestwards along said road to Station Road; thence southwestwards along said road and Church Road to the eastern boundary of Addlestone St Paul's Ward; thence generally southwestwards and following said ward boundary to the point of commencement.

ADDLESTONE BOURNESIDE WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Addlestone St Paul's Ward meets the southeastern boundary of Addlestone North Ward; thence generally northeastwards along the southeastern and eastern boundaries of Addlestone North Ward and the southern and eastern boundaries of Chertsey Meads Ward to the District boundary; thence generally southwards along the District boundary to the Weybridge to Chertsey Railway; thence northwestwards along said railway to the River Wey Navigation; thence southwestwards along said navigation passing through Coxes Lock for a distance of 167 yards or thereby to a point opposite the eastern boundary of Parcel No 0002 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0664-0764 Edition of 1967; thence generally northwestwards and southwestwards to and along the eastern and northern boundaries of said parcel and continuing in a straight line to the northeastern corner of Parcel No 8000 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ0464-0564 Edition of 1967; thence westwards and southwestwards along the northern boundaries of Parcel Nos 8000, 6400 and 5200 and continuing in a straight line to the access road to Crockford Bridge Farm;

thence southwestwards and northwestwards along said access road to New Haw Road; thence northwestwards along said road to The Bourne; thence generally southwestwards along The Bourne to the eastern boundary of Addlestone St Paul's Ward; thence generally northwards along said eastern boundary to the point of commencement.

WOODHAM WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Foxhills Ward meets the southern boundary of Addlestone St Paul's Ward; thence generally eastwards along said southern boundary to a point opposite the northwestern boundary of Grange Farm; thence southwestwards to and along said northwestern boundary and in prolongation thereof to the northeastern boundary of Nos 74 to 82 Grange Road; thence northwestwards along said property boundary to the northwestern boundary of No 82 Grange Road; thence southwestwards along said northwestern boundary to Grange Road; thence southeastwards along said road to King Georges Drive; thence southwestwards along said drive to a point opposite the northeastern boundary of No 48 King Georges Drive; thence southeastwards and southwestwards along said boundary and the southeastern boundaries of Nos 48 to 4 King Georges Drive to the southwestern boundary of No 15 Warren Road; thence southeastwards along the western boundaries of the properties Nos 15 to 3 Warren Road to the northwestern boundary of No 7 Holly Avenue; thence southwestwards along the said property boundary and southeastwards along the western boundaries of Nos 7 to 1 Holly Avenue to Holly Avenue; thence southwestwards along said avenue to the Broadway; thence southeastwards along the Broadway to Woodham Lane; thence northeastwards along said lane to a point opposite the southwestern boundary of No 245 Woodham Lane; thence southwestwards to and along said southwestern boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 1 to 85 Kings Road to the northwestern boundary of No 93 Broomfield Road; thence southwestwards along the northern boundaries of

Nos 93 to 91 Broomfield Road to Kings Road; thence southeastwards along Kings Road to Braeside; thence southwestwards along Braeside to a point opposite the northeastern boundary of No 32 Braeside; thence southeastwards to and along said northeastern boundary and in prolongation thereof to the southern boundary of the District; thence generally southwestwards and northwestwards along said southern boundary to the southern boundary of Foxhills Ward; thence generally northeastwards along the southern and eastern boundaries of said ward to the point of commencement.

NEW HAW WARD

Commencing at the point where the southern boundary of the District meets the eastern boundary of Woodham Ward; thence generally northwestwards along said eastern boundary to the southern boundary of Addlestone St Paul's Ward; thence eastwards and northeastwards along the southern and eastern boundaries of said ward to the southern boundary of Addlestone Bourneside Ward; thence generally eastwards along said southern boundary to the eastern boundary of the District; thence generally southwards along said eastern boundary and the southern boundary of the District to the point of commencement.
