PROPOSALS FOR FUTURE ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE
KERRIER DISTRICT OF THE COUNTY OF CORNWALL

1. We, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, having carried out our initial review of the electoral arrangements for the district of Kerrier in accordance with the requirements of section 63 of, and Schedule 9 to, the Local Government Act 1972, present our proposals for the future electoral arrangements for that district.

2. In accordance with the procedure laid down in section 60(1) and (2) of the 1972 Act, notice was given on 31 December 1974 that we were to undertake this review. This was incorporated in a consultation letter addressed to Kerrier District Council, copies of which were circulated to Cornwall County Council, parish councils and parish meetings in the district, the Members of Parliament for the constituencies concerned and the headquarters of the main political parties. Copies were also sent to the editors of the local newspapers circulating in the area and of the local government press. Notices inserted in the local press announced the start of the review and invited comments from members of the public and from interested bodies.

3. Kerrier District Council were invited to prepare a draft scheme of representation for our consideration. In doing so, they were asked to observe the rules laid down in Schedule 11 to the Local Government Act 1972 and the guidelines which we set out in our Report No. 6 about the proposed size of the council and the proposed number of councillors for each ward. They were also asked to take into account views expressed to them following their consultation with local interests. We therefore asked that they

should publish details of their provisional proposals about a month before they submitted their draft scheme to us, thus allowing an opportunity for local comment.

4. The District Council have exercised an option for a system of whole council elections in accordance with section 7(4)(a) of the Local Government Act 1972.

5. On 20 June 1975, the District Council submitted their draft scheme of representation. The Council proposed to divide the area of the district into 21 wards, each returning 1, 2 or 3 councillors to form a council of 42 members.

6. Copies were sent to us of correspondence between the District Council, parish councils and parish meetings during the period when the scheme was being prepared. The District Council incorporated in their draft scheme all the suggestions they had received except for those from Mabe Parish Council, who wished to allocate an extra councillor to the Mabe and St Gluvias ward; Mawnan and Budock Parish Councils, who wished to allocate an extra councillor to the Mawnan and Budock ward; and Helston Town Council, who proposed the division of the proposed Helston ward into two 2-member wards.

7. We considered the draft scheme submitted by the Council together with the comments received and noted that, with the exception of the Mullion Cury and Gunwalloe, Helston, Wendron and Sithney, Redruth South, and St Day and Lanner wards, it would provide a basis of representation in compliance with the rules in Schedule 11 to the Local Government Act 1972 and the guidelines which we set out in our Report No. 6.

8. We then considered whether the draft scheme could be modified in order to achieve a better standard of representation and we saw scope for improvement by allocating an extra councillor to the Mullion Cury and Gunwalloe ward and dividing the Helston ward into two 2-member wards. The effect of these modifications was to raise the size of council from 42 to 44 members. We also decided to give the name of Mullion to the Mullion Cury and Gunwalloe ward; and the name of Meneage to the Mawgan-in-Meneage with Manaccan, St Martin and St Anthony-in-Meneage ward.

9. Subject to the changes referred to in paragraph 8 above and to a number of minor ward boundary adjustments proposed for technical reasons by Ordnance Survey, we decided that the District Council's draft scheme provided a reasonable basis for the future electoral arrangements for the district in compliance with the rules in Schedule 11 to the 1972 Act and our guidelines and we formulated our draft proposals accordingly.

10. On 28 February 1977 we issued our draft proposals and these were sent to all who had received our consultation letter or had commented on the District Council's draft scheme. The Council were asked to make these draft proposals and the accompanying map, which defined the proposed ward boundaries, available for inspection at their main offices. Representations on our draft proposals were invited from those to whom they were circulated and, by public notices, from other members of the public and interested bodies. We asked for comments to reach us by 29 April 1977.

11. Kerrier District Council supported all the wards in our draft proposals except the Mawnan and Budock ward. In this case, the Council revised their forecast electorate figure and suggested that the ward justified the allocation of an extra councillor. Cornwall County Council supported

the representation submitted by the District Council.

12. Mawnan and Budock Parish Councils also objected to our proposed Mawnan and Budock ward. They supported the District Council's suggestion for the allocation of an extra councillor, but their first preference was for a two member ward linking their parishes with the area of a polling district in Constantine parish.

13. Wendron and Sithney Parish Councils objected to our proposed Wendron and Sithney ward and suggested that the large area of the ward justified the allocation of an extra councillor.

14. We reviewed our draft proposals in the light of the comments which we had received. We noted that the suggestion for an additional councillor for the Mawnan and Budock ward, made by the District Council and supported by the County Council and Mawnan and Budock Parish Councils, and the suggestion for an additional councillor made by the parish councils of Wendron and Sithney, did not provide a better standard of representation than our draft proposals. We also noted that Constantine Parish Council objected to the other suggestion made by the Mawnan and Budock Parish Councils for a polling district from Constantine parish to be incorporated in the Mawnan and Budock ward. We decided that our draft proposals should be confirmed and we formulated our final proposals accordingly.

15. Details of these final proposals are set out in Schedules 1 and 2 to this report. Schedule 1 gives the names of the wards and the number of councillors to be returned by each. A detailed description of the boundaries of the proposed wards, as defined on the attached maps, is set out in Schedule 2.

PUBLICATION

16. In accordance with section 60(5)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, a copy of this report and copies of the maps are being sent to Kerrier District Council and will be available for public inspection at the Council's main offices. Copies of this report (without maps) are being sent to those who received the consultation letter and to those who made comments.

Note: Where the boundary is described as following a road, railway, river, canal or similar feature, it should be deemed to follow the centre line of the feature unless otherwise stated.

CAMBORNE SOUTH WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Crowan CP meets the Camborne to Helston road, thence northwestwards and following said road to Pendarves Road, thence northeastwards along said road, South Terrace, Trevenson Street, Centenary Street and Wesley Street to Foundry Road, thence southeastwards along said road to the northern boundary of the Camborne to Redruth railway, thence northeastwards along said northern boundary crossing the road known as Lower Pengegnon to the unnamed road that leads from Chapel Road to Higher Brea, thence southeastwards along said road to Red River, thence southeastwards along said river to the eastern boundary of Parcel No 2680 on Ordnance Survey County Series 1:2500 Sheet 63/14 Edition of 1908, thence southeastwards along said boundary and the eastern boundaries of Parcel Nos 2681, 2683, 2686, 2688, 2760, 2763, 2764, 2765, 2766, 2803, 2822, 3046 and 3046 on Ordnance Survey County Series 1:2500 Sheet 70/2 Edition of 1908, thence southwestwards along the southern boundary of Parcel No 3046, thence southwards in a straight line to and along the eastern boundary of Parcel No 3179 and the eastern boundaries of Parcel Nos 3182 and 3186 and in prolongation thereof to the northern boundary of Crowan CP, thence southwestwards and following said CP boundary to the point of commencement.

CAMBORNE NORTH WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Camborne South Ward meets Cross Street (at the junction known as The Cross), thence northwestwards along said street to Union Street, thence northeastwards along said street to Trelowarren Street, thence south westwards along said street passing through Commercial Square to Fore Street, thence northeastwards along said

street to Tehidy Road, thence northwestwards and northeastwards along said road and continuing northwards, northeastwards and northwestwards along the unnamed road that leads to Roscroghan to Red River, thence southeastwards along said river to Tolgarrick Road, thence southeastwards along said road to a point opposite the northern boundary of No 8 Tolgarrick Road, thence eastwards to and along said boundary to the rear boundary of said property, thence southwards along said boundary, the rear boundaries of Nos 6 to 2 Tolgarrick Road and the northeastern boundary of the Civil Defence HQ and in prolongation thereof to the road known as East Hill, thence southwestwards along East Hill to Chapel Road, thence generally southeastwards along said road to the unnamed road that leads to Higher Brea, thence southeastwards along said unnamed road to the northern boundary of Camborne South Ward, thence southwestwards and following said ward boundary to the point of commencement.

CAMBORNE WEST WARD

Commencing at the point where the western boundary of Camborne South Ward meets the northern boundary of Crowan CP, thence northwestwards along said CP boundary to the western boundary of the District, thence northwestwards and following said District boundary and generally eastwards along the northern boundary of the District at Mean Low Water to a point being the prolongation northwestwards of a line drawn between the northeastern corner of Parcel No 6600 on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SW 626343 Edition of 1973 and a point at Grid Reference SW 62683/43168 thence southeastwards to and along the eastern boundary of the said parcel and the eastern boundaries of Parcel Nos 6600 and 8262 on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SW 62 6342 Edition of 1973 and in prolongation thereof to the footpath that leads to the unnamed road to Downs Farm, thence southwestwards along said footpath to said unnamed road, thence southeastwards along said road to the unnamed road that leads from Magor Farm to Kieve Hill Farm, thence southwestwards along said unnamed road to Red River, thence southeastwards and following said river to the western boundary of Camborne North Ward, thence southwards and following said ward boundary and the western boundary of Camborne South Ward to the point of commencement.

ILLOGAN NORTH WARD

Commencing at the point where the Scorrier to Camborne By Pass meets the north eastern boundary of Camborne North Ward, thence northwestwards along said ward boundary to the Northeastern boundary of Camborne West Ward, thence generally northwestwards along said ward boundary to the northern boundary of the District at Mean Low Water thence generally northeastwards along said northern boundary to the eastern boundary of the District, thence southeastwards and following said eastern boundary to the unnamed road at Grid Reference SW 6986345837, thence southwestwards along said road to the unnamed stream that flows to Bridge, thence southwestwards and following said stream to its junction with the unnamed stream at Bridge, thence southeastwards along said stream to the unnamed road that leads from Vogue Beloth to Sparnon Gate, thence westwards along said road to the road known as Merritts Hill, thence southwestwards along said road to Lower Broad Lane thence southwards along said lane to the unnamed road adjacent to the property known as Wayside, thence southwestwards along said road to the Dismantled Railway, thence southeastwards along said railway to the Scorrier to Camborne By-Pass, thence southwestwards along said by-pass to the point of commencement.

REDRUTH NORTH WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Illogan North Ward meets the eastern boundary of the District thence generally southeastwards along said District boundary to the A30 road, thence southwestwards along said road to Radnor Road, thence westwards along said road to a point being the prolongation northeastwards of the northwestern boundary of Parcel No 9100 on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SW 70 7144 Edition of 1971, thence southwestwards to and along said boundary and the northwestern boundary of parcel No 9100 on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SW 70 7143 Edition of 1971, thence southeastwards along the southwestern boundary of said Parcel and in prolongation thereof to the Redruth-Truro railway, thence southwestwards along said railway to a point being the prolongation northeastwards of the western boundary of Parcel No 3377, thence southwestwards to and along said boundary and southeastwards along the southwestern boundary of said parcel and in prolongation thereof to the Redruth to Truro road, thence southwestwards along said road, the road known as Mount Ambrose, the road known as East End, Higher Fore Street, Fore Street the road known as West End and Blowinghouse Hill to the unnamed stream that flows from Blowinghouse to Bridge, thence northwestwards along said stream and continuing northwestwards and northeastwards along the eastern boundary of Illogan North Ward to the point of commencement.

ST DAY AND LANNER WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Wendron CP meets the western boundary of Parcel No 8087 on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SW68 6938 Edition of 1975, thence northwestwards along said western boundary and the southwestern boundaries of Parcel Nos 8093 and 7100 and in prolongation thereof to the unnamed road that leads from Four Lanes to Trewirgie Farm, thence generally northwards along said road to a

point opposite the northwestern boundary of Parcel No 0045 on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SW 686939 Edition of 1975, thence northeastwards to and along said boundary and the northwestern boundary of Parcel No 0045 on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SW 70 7139 Edition of 1973, and in prolongation thereof to the unnamed road that leads to the property known as Seaview, thence northeastwards along said road to a point opposite the southeastern boundary of Parcel No 3289, thence northwestwards to and northeastwards along said boundary and the southeastern boundaries of Parcel Nos 3695, 4200 and 4700, and Parcel Nos 4700 and 4806 on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SW 70 7140 Edition of 1971, thence generally northwards along the eastern boundary of Parcel No 4711 and in prolongation thereof to the southern boundary of Parcel No 5325, thence eastwards and northeastwards along the southern and southeastern boundaries of said parcel, thence northwards along the eastern boundaries of Parcel Nos 5838, 3334 and 5955, thence eastwards, northeastwards and northwestwards along the southern, southeastern and northeastern boundaries of Parcel No 6661, and northwestwards along the northeastern boundary of Parcel No 5168, thence northwards and northwestwards along the eastern and northeastern boundaries of Parcel No 3300 to the southeastern boundary of No 7 Clijah Close thence northeastwards along said boundary and in prolongation thereof to the southeastern boundary of the property known as Scrivroc, thence northeastwards along said boundary and the southeastern boundary of the property known as Amble Side and in prolongation thereof to the access road to the property known as The Dingle, thence northeastwards along said road to a point opposite the southern boundary of Parcel No 6200 on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan SW 70-7141 Edition of 1971, thence northwards to and eastwards along said boundary and the southern boundary of Parcel Nos 6703 crossing Parcel No 7200 and continuing along the southern boundary of Parcel No 7303 and in prolongation thereof to the unnamed road that leads to Carnmarth Farm, thence northeastwards along said road to a point opposite the northeastern

northwestwards in a straight line to the northeastern boundary of Parcel No 2416, thence northwestwards along said boundary to the unnamed road from Carnkie to Buller Hill, thence eastwards along said road to the access road to Glenvale Cottage, thence northwestwards and following said road to the unnamed stream to the west of Glenvale Cottage, thence northwards along said stream to the southeastern boundary of Redruth North Ward, thence northeastwards along said ward boundary to the point of commencement.

ILLOGAN SOUTH WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Wendron CP meets the eastern boundary of Camborne South Ward, thence northwestwards along said ward boundary and the eastern boundary of Camborne North Ward to the southern boundary of Illogan North Ward, thence generally northeastwards along said ward boundary to the southwestern boundary of Redruth North Ward, thence generally southwards along said boundary and the western boundaries of Redruth South Ward and St Day and Lanner Ward to the northern boundary of Wendron CP, thence generally southwestwards along said CP boundary to the point of commencement.
