REVIEW OF ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS
REPORT OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOUNDARY COMMISSION

PROPOSALS FOR REVISED ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE
BOROUGH OF CREWE AND NANTWICH IN THE COUNTY OF CHESHIRE

1. We, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, having carried out our initial review of the electoral arrangements for the borough of Crewe and Nantwich in accordance with the requirements of section 63 of, and Schedule 9 to, the Local Government Act 1972, present our proposals for the future electoral arrangements for that borough.

2. In accordance with the procedure laid down in section 60(1) and (2) of the 1972 Act, notice was given on 12 August 1974 that we were to undertake this review. This was incorporated in a consultation letter addressed to the Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council, copies of which were circulated to the Cheshire County Council, the Members of Parliament for the constituencies concerned, Parish Councils and Parish Meetings in the borough and the headquarters of the main political parties. Copies were also sent to the editors of local newspapers circulating in the area and to the local government press. Notices inserted in the local press announced the start of the review and invited comments from members of the public and from any interested bodies.

3. Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council were invited to prepare a draft scheme of representation for our consideration. In doing so, they were asked to observe the rules laid down in Schedule 11 to the Local Government Act 1972 and the guidelines which we set out in our Report No 6 about the proposed size of the council and the proposed number of councillors for each ward. They were asked also to take into account any views expressed to them following their consultation with local interests. We therefore asked that they should publish details of their provisional proposals about a month before they submitted their draft scheme to us, thus allowing an opportunity for local comment.

4. In accordance with section 7(4)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972 the Council have exercised an option for a system of elections by thirds.
5. On 12 February 1975, Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council presented their draft scheme of representation. The Council proposed to divide the area into 26 wards each returning 1 or 3 councillors to form a council of 60 members.
6. We considered the draft scheme, together with the comments which we had received and those which had been transmitted to us by the Borough Council. The comments included an alternative scheme submitted on behalf of a minority group on the Council and a local political association. This scheme provided for the division of the borough into 28 wards each returning one or 3 councillors to form a council of 60 members.
7. We noted that the Borough Council's proposed scheme would result in the over-representation of Crewe compared with the rest of the borough and, moreover, that the wards proposed by the Council within Crewe would produce a standard of representation in the town which was numerically uneven. We thought that the wards proposed for Crewe in the alternative scheme offered a better numerical standard but noted that the scheme would lead, overall, to the under-representation of the town compared with the rest of the borough. In the light of this appraisal, we decided to draw up a compromise scheme for 57 members. Using as a basis the wards proposed in the alternative scheme for Crewe and the Council's proposed wards in the rest of the borough we made a number of modifications to secure a better standard of equality of representation, to meet criticisms of the Council's scheme which we thought were justified and, within Crewe, to secure boundary lines which were more readily identifiable on the ground. The resultant scheme appeared to us to offer a proper balance of representation between

Crewe and the rest of the borough and to comply with the rules in Schedule 11 to the 1972 Act and our own guidelines. We decided to formulate our draft proposals accordingly.

8. On 25 September 1975 we issued our draft proposals and these were sent to all who had received our consultation letter or had commented on the Council's draft scheme. The Council were asked to make these draft proposals, and the accompanying maps which defined the proposed ward boundaries, available for inspection at their main offices. Representations on our draft proposals were invited from those to whom they were circulated and, by public notices, from other members of the public and interested bodies. We asked that any comments should reach us by 21 November 1975.

9. Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council informed us that they accepted the draft proposals. However, they suggested a number of boundary realignments within Crewe which they considered would secure better community of interest, technically better boundaries and improved equality of representation. They also suggested the transfer of the parish of Hough from the proposed Shavington ward to the proposed Wybunbury ward and the transfer of the parish of Rope from the latter ward to the Shavington ward. Finally they requested the renaming of the proposed Woolstanwood ward so that it would be known as St Barnabas ward.

10. Cheshire County Council stated that there would be no insuperable difficulty in forming county electoral divisions based on the draft proposals whether as proposed or as modified in accordance with the suggestion of the Borough Council. However, they stated a preference for the alterations which the Borough Council had suggested.

11. The local political association which had sent us the alternative scheme expressed agreement with the draft proposals except for the parishes

of Hough and Rope which they thought should be dealt with in the manner recommended by the Borough Council. Four parish councils, including those for the parishes of Rope and Hough, likewise supported these transfers. However, Wistaston Parish Council thought that the parish of Rope should be included in the proposed Wells Green ward as the Borough Council had proposed in their original draft scheme. They also asked that the proposed Wells Green ward should be renamed "Wistaston". Finally, we heard from Willaston Parish Council who expressed disappointment that the proposed Willaston East ward would be allocated only one councillor and asked us to consider additional representation.

12. We reviewed our draft proposals in the light of the comments which we had received and decided that we should adopt, with minor modifications recommended by the Ordnance Survey, the changes to the ward boundaries which the Borough Council had proposed. On ward names, we agreed that the proposed Wells Green ward should be renamed "Wistaston" and that the Woolstanwood ward should be renamed "St Barnabas". We could find no grounds for allocating a second councillor to the proposed Willaston East ward. We resolved to formulate our final proposals accordingly.

13. Details of these final proposals are set out in Schedules 1 and 2 to this report and on the attached maps. Schedule 1 gives the names of the wards and the number of councillors to be returned by each. Schedule 2 shows our proposals for the order of retirement of councillors. The boundaries of the proposed wards are defined on the maps.

PUBLICATION

14. In accordance with Section 60(5)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, a copy of this report and a copy of the maps are being sent to Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council and will be available for public inspection at the Council's main offices. Copies of this report are also being sent to

those who received the consultation letter and to those who made comments.
A detailed description of the boundaries of the proposed wards, as defined
on the maps, is set out in Schedule 3 to this report.

NOTE: Where the boundary is described as following a road, railway, river, canal or similar feature it should be deemed to follow the centre line of the feature unless otherwise stated.

QUEENS PARK WARD

The Wistaston Green Ward of the parish of Wistaston and that area bounded by a line commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Wistaston CP meets the southern boundary of Woolstanwood CP, thence northeastwards and following said southern and the eastern boundary of Woolstanwood CP to Coppenhall Lane, thence northeastwards along said lane and West Street to the Crewe-Chester railway, thence southeastwards along said railway to the spur line at Eagle Bridge, thence southwestwards along said spur line to a point at Grid Reference SJ 6962455614, thence southeastwards in a straight line to the junction of Wistaston Road and Stewart Street, thence southwestwards along said street to Valley Brook, thence generally westwards along said brook to Queen's Park Drive, thence southwestwards along said drive to Alton Street, thence southeastwards along said street to the path that leads to Valley Road, thence southeastwards along said path to said road, thence southwestwards along said road to Dane Bank Avenue, thence southeastwards along said road to a point opposite the northwestern boundary of No 97 Dane Bank Avenue, thence northeastwards to and along said boundary and southeastwards along the rear boundary of said property and the rear boundaries of Nos 95-91 Dane Bank Avenue to the rear boundary of No 1 Flixton Drive, thence northeastwards, eastwards, southeastwards and southwestwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 1-57 Flixton Drive and southwestwards along the southeastern boundary of No 77 Dane Bank Avenue to the northern boundary of Wistaston CP, thence southwestwards and following said CP boundary to the point of commencement.

ST BARNABAS WARD

The parish of Woolstanwood

and that area bounded by a line commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Queens Park Ward meets the eastern boundary of Woolstanwood CP, thence generally northwards along said CP boundary to the southern boundary of Leighton CP, thence eastwards along said parish boundary and continuing eastwards along Leighton Brook to a point opposite the eastern boundary of the Allotment Gardens to the north of No 126 Frank Webb Avenue, thence southwards to and along said eastern boundary to the rear boundary of No 124 Frank Webb Avenue, thence southwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 122 - 104 Frank Webb Avenue, thence westwards along the southern boundary of No 104 Frank Webb Avenue to a point opposite the rear boundary of No 102 in said avenue, thence southwards and southwestwards along said rear boundary, the rear boundary of No 100 in said avenue and the southeastern boundary of No 98 in said avenue, thence southwards in a straight line crossing Timbrell Avenue to the northeastern boundary of No 96 Frank Webb Avenue, thence southeastwards along said boundary to the rear boundary of No 94 Frank Webb Avenue, thence southwards and westwards along the rear and southern boundaries of said property to the rear boundary of No 92 in said avenue, thence southwestwards along said rear boundary and the southeastern boundary of No 90 in said avenue, thence southwards in a straight line crossing Badger Avenue to the northern boundary of No 88 Frank Webb Avenue, thence southeastwards and eastwards along said boundary to the rear boundary of said property, thence southwards along said rear boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 86 - 80 Frank Webb Avenue to the service road at the rear of Nos 78 - 4 Frank Webb Avenue, thence southwards along said service road to West Street, thence southwestwards along said street and the northern boundary of Queens Park Ward to the point of commencement.

GROSVENOR WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Queens Park Ward meets the southeastern boundary of St Barnabas Ward, thence northeastwards

along said southeastern boundary, thence northwards and northwestwards along the eastern and northern boundaries of St Barnabas Ward to the drain that runs from Leighton Brook northeastwards between the rear of the properties in Rolls Avenue and Sandiway Road, thence northeastwards along said drain to a point being the prolongation northwestwards of Windsor Avenue, thence southeastwards to and along said Avenue to Underwood Lane, thence southwestwards along said lane to Leighton Brook, thence southeastwards along said brook to Ford Lane, thence southwards along said lane to Badger Avenue, thence southeastwards along said avenue to Broad Street, thence southwards along said street and the road known as Hightown to Victoria Street, thence westwards along said street and Richard Moon Street to Stanley Street, thence southwards along said street to the service road to the rear of Nos 34 - 76 Flag Lane, thence southwards along said service road crossing Delamere Street to Chester Street West, thence westwards along said street to Flag Lane, thence southwards along said lane to the Crewe - Chester railway, thence northwestwards along said railway and the northern boundary of Queens Park Ward to the point of commencement.

COPPENHALL WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of St Barnabas Ward meets the southeastern boundary of Leighton CP, thence generally northeastwards and northwards along said parish boundary and the eastern boundary of Minshull Vernon CP to the southern boundary of Warmingham CP, thence generally southeastwards along said parish boundary to the western boundary of Parcel No 4927 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 plan SJ 70/7158 Edition of 1962, thence southwards along said western boundary and the western boundaries of Parcel Nos 5215, 6100 and 6100 and 5681 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 plan SJ 70/7157 Edition of 1959 to the southern boundary of Parcel No 4483, thence westwards and following the said boundary and the southern and western boundaries of Parcel No 4187 to the track that leads to Groby Road, thence westwards along said track to said road, thence northwestwards along said road to a point opposite the southern boundary

of No 180 Groby Road, thence southwestwards to and along said southern boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 357 - 301 Stoneley Road to Stoneley Road, thence southwestwards along said road to a point opposite the eastern boundary of Stoneley Farm, thence southeastwards to and along said boundary and southwestwards and northwestwards along the southern and western boundaries of said farm to the southeastern boundary of Parcel No 8166, thence southwestwards and northwestwards along the southeastern and southwestern boundaries of said parcel to Stoneley Road, thence southwestwards along said road to a point opposite the northeastern boundary of Ironstile Farm, thence westwards to and westwards and northwards along said boundary to the eastern boundary of Parcel No 5259 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 plan SJ 70/7157 Edition of 1959, thence generally westwards, southwards and westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of said parcel to the rear boundary of No 44 Broughton Road, thence southwards along said boundary, the rear boundaries of Nos 42 - 12 Broughton Road and the eastern boundary of No 88 North Street to North Street, thence northwestwards along said street to the Crewe - Liverpool railway, thence southeastwards along said railway to the footbridge on the path from Singleton Avenue to Roedean Walk, thence southwestwards along said footbridge and path to a point opposite the northern boundary of Crewe Cemetery, thence southwards to and generally southwards and westwards along said boundary to Broad Street, thence southwestwards along said street to the northern boundary of Grosvenor Ward, thence generally northwestwards and southwestwards along said boundary to the northern boundary of St Barnabas Ward, thence westwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

MAW GREEN WARD

Commencing at the point where the southeastern boundary of Coppenhall Ward meets the southern boundary of Warrington CP, thence southeastwards and northeastwards along said parish boundary and generally southeastwards along the southern boundary of Moston CP to the western boundary of

Haslington CP, thence southwestwards and southeastwards along said parish boundary to the southeastern boundary of Parcel No 0017 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 plan SJ 72/7357 Edition of 1962, thence southwestwards and northwestwards along the southeastern and southwestern boundaries of said parcel to the northwestern boundary of Parcel No 0004, thence southwestwards along said boundary and continuing southwestwards along the northwestern boundary of said parcel number as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 plans SJ 70/7157 Edition of 1959 and SJ 70/7156 Edition of 1959 to the footpath that leads to Maw Green Road, thence northwestwards along said path to the Crewe - Manchester railway, thence southwestwards along said railway to a point being a point opposite the northern boundary of the Builder's Yard in Lime Tree Avenue, thence westwards to and southwestwards along said boundary, thence northwestwards in a straight line crossing said avenue to the northeastern boundary of the Air Training Corps Centre, thence northwestwards and southwestwards along the northeastern and northwestern boundaries of said Centre to the access road to the rear of the properties on the northwestern side of Lime Tree Avenue and Queen Street, thence generally southwestwards along said access road to the northeastern boundary of No 20 Hillside Drive, thence northwestwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 18 - 12 Hillside Drive to the rear boundary of No 61 Newfield Drive, thence northeastwards along said boundary and continuing northeastwards, westwards and southwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 59 - 29 Newfield Drive to the path which leads to Coronation Street, thence northwestwards along said path to said street, thence northwards along said street to a point being the prolongation southeastwards of the rear boundary of No 65 Coronation Street, thence northwestwards to and along said rear boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 67 - 69 Coronation Street, thence northwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 69 - 71 Coronation Street, thence northwestwards along the rear boundaries of Nos 40 - 38 and 32 - 2 Elm Drive and the northern boundary of No 100 Middlewich Street to Middlewich Street, thence southwards along said street to Sherborne Road, thence westwards along said road to a point opposite the southern boundary

of No 1 Sharborne Road, thence westwards to and along said boundary and in prolongation thereof to the eastern boundary of the Allotment Gardens situated to the south of Cranbourne Road, thence northwards along said boundary and westwards along the northern boundary of said Allotment Gardens and in prolongation thereof to the Crewe - Liverpool railway, thence northwestwards along said railway to the southeastern boundary of Coppenhall Ward, thence northwestwards and generally northeastwards along said ward boundary to the point of commencement.

DELAMERE WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Grosvenor Ward meets the southeastern boundary of Coppenhall Ward, thence northeastwards and eastwards along the said southeastern boundary to the southern boundary of Maw Green Ward, thence generally eastwards along said ward boundary to the Crewe - Manchester railway, thence southwestwards along said railway to its junction with the Crewe - Chester railway, thence northwestwards along said railway to Edleston Road, thence southwards along said road to Valley Brook, thence generally westwards along said brook to Flag Lane, thence northwards along said lane and continuing generally northwards along the eastern boundary of Grosvenor Ward to the point of commencement.

WALDRON WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Basford CP meets the Crewe - Euston railway, thence northwestwards along said railway and the Crewe - Manchester railway (passing through Crewe Station) to the eastern boundary of Delamere Ward, thence northeastwards along said Ward boundary and the eastern boundary of Maw Green Ward to the western boundary of Haslington CP, thence generally southwards along said parish boundary and the western boundary of Crewe CP to the northern boundary of Weston CP, thence westwards along said parish boundary and the northern boundary of Basford CP to the point of commencement.

ST JOHNS WARD

Commencing at the point where the southern boundary of Grosvenor Ward meets the western boundary of Delamere Ward, thence southwards along said western boundary and generally eastwards along the southern boundary of said ward to the western boundary of Waldron Ward, thence southeastwards along said boundary to Nantwich Road, thence southwestwards along said road to the point where the access road adjacent to the eastern boundary of No 217 Nantwich Road meets said road, thence northwards along said access road to the rear of the properties Nos 2 - 208 Ruskin Road to Gainsborough Road, thence westwards along said road to the access road adjacent to the eastern boundary of No 1 Gainsborough Road, thence southwards and westwards along said access road to the rear of properties No 1 - 129 Gainsborough Road to the road known as Kingsway, thence northwards along said road and Jubilee Avenue to a point opposite the southern boundary of No 74 Jubilee Avenue, thence eastwards to and along said southern boundary and northwestwards along the rear boundary of said property, the rear boundaries of Nos 72 - 2 Jubilee Avenue and the northern boundary of All Saint's Church Hall to Stewart Street, thence northeastwards along said street and the eastern boundary of Queens Park Ward to the southern boundary of Grosvenor Ward, thence southeastwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

ALEXANDRA WARD

Commencing at the point where the northwestern boundary of Wistaston CP meets Nantwich Road, thence northeastwards along said road and the southern boundary of St Johns Ward to the western boundary of Waldron Ward, thence southeastwards along said western boundary to the northern boundary of Basford CP, thence generally westwards along said parish boundary and the northern boundary of Shavington cum Gresty CP to the northeastern boundary of Wistaston CP, thence generally northwestwards along said parish boundary to the point of commencement.

RUSKIN PARK WARD

Commencing at the point where the northeastern boundary of Wistaston CP meets the eastern boundary of Queens Park Ward, thence generally northwestwards and eastwards along said ward boundary to the western boundary of St Johns Ward, thence generally southeastwards and southwards along said boundary to the northwestern boundary of Alexandra Ward, thence southwestwards along said boundary to the northeastern boundary of Wistaston CP, thence generally westwards along said parish boundary to the point of commencement.
