The Melton (Parish Electoral Arrangements) Order 2007

Made - - - - *8th February 2007*

Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2)

Melton Borough Council, under section 9(a) of the Local Government and Rating Act 1997(b) (“the 1997 Act”), have made to the Electoral Commission(c) proposals dated January 2007 for electoral arrangements in the parishes of Frisby on the Wreake and Kirby Bellars(d) in the borough(e) of Melton:

The Electoral Commission have decided to give effect to those proposals:

Accordingly, the Electoral Commission, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 14(f) and 23(g) of the 1997 Act, make the following Order:

Citation and commencement

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Melton (Parish Electoral Arrangements) Order 2007.
- (2) This Order comes into force—
 - (a) for the purpose of proceedings preliminary or relating to the elections of parish councillors for the parishes of Frisby on the Wreake and Kirby Bellars, to be held on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2007, on the day after that on which it is made;
 - (b) for all other purposes, on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2007.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“ordinary day of election of councillors” has the meaning given by section 37 of the Representation of the People Act 1983(h); and

(c) The Electoral Commission was established by the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000 (c.41). The functions of the Secretary of State, under sections 13, 14 and 17(4) of the 1997 Act (c.29), to the extent that they relate to electoral arrangements within the meaning of that Act, were transferred with modifications to the Electoral Commission on 1st April 2002 (S.I. 2001/3962).

(d) The parishes of Frisby on the Wreake and Kirby Bellars were created by the Melton (Parishes) Order 2004 (S.I. 2004/2587), as amended by the Melton (Parishes) (Amendment) Order 2005 (S.I. 2005/707).

(e) The non-metropolitan district of Melton has the status of a borough.

“registration officer” means an officer appointed for the purpose of, and in accordance with, section 8(a) of the Representation of the People Act 1983.

Parish elections

3.—(1) The term of office of every parish councillor elected on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2005 for the parishes of Frisby on the Wreake and Kirby Bellars shall be two years.

(2) Elections of all parish councillors for those parishes shall be held on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2007(b).

Numbers of parish councillors for the parishes of Frisby on the Wreake and Kirby Bellars

4.—(1) The number of councillors to be elected for the parish of Frisby on the Wreake shall be five.

(2) The number of councillors to be elected for the parish of Kirby Bellars shall be five.

Electoral register

5. The registration officer for the borough of Melton shall make such rearrangement of, or adaptation of, the register of local government electors as may be necessary for the purposes of, and in consequence of, this Order.

(a) Section 8 has been amended by the Local Government (Wales) Act 1994 (c.19) and the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994 (c.39).

(b) Article 3 provides for parish elections in the parishes of Frisby on the Wreake and Kirby Bellars in 2007. Section 16(3) of the Local Government Act 1972 (c.70) provides for parish elections to take place every four years.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order gives effect to proposals made to the Electoral Commission for electoral arrangements for the parishes of Frisby on the Wreake and Kirby Bellars, created from the existing parish of Frisby and Kirby within the borough of Melton by the Melton (Parishes) Order 2004, as amended by the Melton (Parishes) (Amendment) Order 2005.

The new electoral arrangements apply in respect of parish elections to be held on and after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2007.

Article 3 provides for parish elections in the parishes of Frisby on the Wreake and Kirby Bellars in 2007, and then to continue according to the established system of parish elections every four years.

Article 4 establishes the numbers of councillors for each parish.

Article 5 obliges the Electoral Registration Officer to make any necessary amendments to the electoral register to reflect the new electoral arrangements.
