Dear Sir or Madam,

I write as the sitting Whittlesey Town Councillor for St. Mary's Ward to register that I do not agree with the draft recommendations of the LGBCE in respect of Cambridgeshire.

Specifically the proposal by the Commission to split St. Mary's Town Ward between Whittlesey North and Whittlesey South Divisions will create considerable confusion amongst electors in Whittlesey. I believe the splitting of the ward is unnecessary and unwelcome. The commission's proposed new proposed boundary is very poorly defined. The LGBCE, in its response to last year's Corporate Governance Review in Whittlesey, justified retention of the current Town Ward boundaries on the grounds that they would be followed in this year's County Boundary review. The Commission would therefore be inconsistent if it were to decide to split St. Mary's Town Ward between two divisions. Alternative schemes for County division boundaries have been proposed which better satisfy the statutory criteria and which do not involve splitting any Town Ward in Whittlesey.

Please could you place on record my opposition to the Commission's proposed boundaries of St. Mary's Ward, Whittlesey.
