PROPOSALS FOR THE FUTURE ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE COUNTY OF NOTTINGHAMSHIRE

1. The last Order under Section 51 of the Local Government Act 1972 in relation to electoral arrangements for districts in the county of Nottinghamshire was made on 8 July 1976. As required by Section 63 and Schedule 9 of the Act we have now reviewed the electoral arrangements for that county, using the procedures we had set out in our Report No. 6.
2. We informed the Nottinghamshire County Council in a consultation letter dated 4 October 1976 that we proposed to conduct the review, and sent copies of the letter to all local authorities and parish meetings in the county, to the MPs representing the constituencies concerned, to the headquarters of the main political parties and to the editors both of local papers circulating in the county and of the local government press. Notices in the local press announced the start of the review and invited comments from members of the public and from interested bodies.
3. On 18 February 1977 the County Council submitted to us a draft scheme, which, following Council elections in May 1977 was withdrawn. On 26 September 1977 a revised draft scheme was submitted in which the County Council suggested 90 electoral divisions for the county, each returning one member in accordance with Section 6(2)(a) of the Act.
4. We considered this revised scheme together with the views expressed by local interests. On 19 December 1979 we issued draft proposals which we sent to all those who had received our consultation letter or commented on the County Council's revised draft scheme. Notices were inserted in the local press announcing that the draft proposals had been issued and could be inspected at the County Council's offices.
5. We incorporated the County Council's revised draft scheme in our draft proposals with certain modifications designed to improve the balance between divisions or districts and to take account of local ties; several of these modifications were derived from local comments made about the county revised scheme.
6. The modifications we made were as follows:
 - (a) Bassetlaw District

We replaced the County Council's revised arrangements for the Worksop area with those in their original draft scheme and, for the Retford area we adopted suggestions made by Bassetlaw District Council Labour Group.

(b) Newark District

We replaced the arrangements in the County Council's revised draft scheme with those suggested by Newark District Council.

(c) Nottingham City District

In order to reflect more accurately the relative size of the electorate in comparison with other districts we reduced the number of divisions in the city from 27 to 25, which had the effect of reducing the size of the County Council from 90 to 88 members.

(d) Rushcliffe District

We transferred the parish of Saxondale from the proposed Radcliffe-on-Trent electoral division to the proposed Bingham electoral division as suggested by Rushcliffe Conservative Association.

(e) Names of electoral divisions

At the request of Mansfield District Council we changed the name of the proposed Mansfield Woodhouse electoral division to Northfield and Manor, and at the request of Gedling Borough Council we changed the name of the proposed Sherwood South electoral division to Gedling North.

7. We received comments in response to our draft proposals from the County Council, the City Council, one borough council, one district council, five parish councils, one town council, a local political party, five political associations and one county councillor. A list of those who wrote to us is given at Appendix 1 to this report.

8. The Nottinghamshire County Council accepted our draft proposals for all districts of the county except those for the City of Nottingham where, though accepting the reduction of two electoral divisions, they suggested an alternative pattern of divisions for the inner area of the City.

9. The other comments we received can be summarised as follows:

(a) Bassetlaw District

Bassetlaw Conservative Association accepted our draft proposals for this district. Hodsock Parish Council objected to the inclusion of their parish in the proposed Blyth and Harworth electoral division rather than in the proposed Worksop North and Carlton electoral division. Styrrup with Oldcotes Parish Council objected to the reduction in the size of the county council and to the inclusion of the parish in the proposed Blyth and Harworth electoral division; they wished to maintain their links with the parish of Harworth Bircotes under the existing electoral arrangements.

(b) Broxtowe District

Brinsley Parish Council and Eastwood Town Council both expressed the wish not to be included with each other in the proposed Eastwood and Brinsley

electoral division and favoured the existing arrangements.

(c) Gedling District

Gedling Borough Council supported our draft proposals. Carlton Constituency Labour Party raised two objections: first, they objected to the proposed Arnold Central, Arnold North and Arnold South electoral divisions but in principle only and without suggesting alternatives; and second, to the linking of the district wards of Netherfield and Burton Joyce and Stoke Bardolph in the proposed Trentside electoral division. The Labour Party suggested an alternative which involved rearranging the district wards forming the proposed Carlton East, Carlton Central, and Trentside electoral divisions in order that Netherfield district ward would, with the district wards of Conway and Priory, form the proposed Carlton East electoral division.

(d) Newark District

Both Newark District Council and Newark Conservative Association accepted our draft proposals. Boughton Parish Council added their objection to that made to the revised draft scheme by Ollerton Parish Council that the earlier proposed Ollerton division involved separation of the two parishes for county electoral purposes. These objections were met by our draft proposals. Collingham Parish Council objected to the urban area of Beacon district ward being included with their rural parish in our proposed Collingham electoral division.

(e) City of Nottingham District

Nottingham City Council informed us that they raised no objection to our draft proposals. They did not support the Nottinghamshire County Council's alternative method of reducing the representation of the City on the county council from 27 members to 25 members, and reaffirmed their support for our proposed Bridge, Lenton, Radford and St Ann's electoral divisions. Councillor J R Green, Leader of the Conservative Group on Nottingham City Council, made comments to the effect that the City should be represented on the county council by 27 members based on the existing electoral arrangements. East Nottingham Conservative Association accepted our proposed reduction in the size of the county council but preferred the County Council's alternative pattern of electoral divisions. North Nottingham Conservative Association supported the County Council's draft scheme for 27 electoral divisions in the City.

(f) Rushcliffe District

Rushcliffe Conservative Association supported our draft proposals for the district.

10. When we came to reassess our draft proposals we took account of all the comments we had received on them and came to the following conclusions:

(a) Bassetlaw District

We found that the possible alternative arrangements to meet the objections of Hodsock Parish Council and Styrrup with Oldcotes Parish Council did not offer any improved standard of representation and would have upset the electoral balance of other divisions.

(b) Broxtowe District

We could see no practicable alternative that would meet the objections by Brinsley Parish Council and Eastwood Town Council without unacceptable disadvantages.

(c) Gedling District

We noted that the objection from Carlton Constituency Labour Party in respect of Arnold Central, North, and South electoral divisions was one of principle only and did not suggest any alternatives. In their second comment their suggested alternative arrangements for Trentside, Carlton Central, and Carlton East electoral divisions, to meet their objection to the linking of Burton Joyce and Stoke Bardolph, and Netherfield district wards in Trentside electoral division, did not improve numerically on our draft proposals which appeared to have a large measure of support from other quarters.

(d) Newark District

The objection by Collingham Parish Council reflected their earlier contention that electoral equality should not be sought at the price of amalgamating urban and rural areas. The rules in the Act for electoral reviews do not however make any distinction between urban and rural areas, and we could see no acceptable alternative to the arrangements we, and the district council, had proposed for this area which would meet the objection.

(e) Nottingham City

Although objections were received to our proposed reduction in the size of the city's representation from 27 to 25 members, and the consequential reduction in the size of the county council from 90 to 88 members, we noted that both Nottingham City Council and Nottinghamshire County Council accepted the proposed reduction. There was however a clear difference of opinions on the

pattern of electoral divisions for the inner area of the City. We carefully weighed the county council's alternative arrangements against our own draft proposals which were supported by the City Council. While there was little to choose between the two using the 1979 electorate figures, on the basis of the projected figures for the future electorate, with which we had been supplied the County Council's alternative suggestions produced a significantly less even standard of representation among the six divisions concerned than did our draft proposals. The County Council argued that the boundaries they suggested had greater regard to local ties and community interest; on the other hand the City Council clearly did not share this view. We decided to confirm our draft proposals as being more closely in conformity with Schedule 11 of the Local Government Act 1972.

11. For the reasons given in paragraph 10 above we decided to confirm our draft proposals as our final proposals for the county as a whole.

12. Details of these final proposals are set out in Schedules 1 and 2 to this report and on the attached map. Schedule 1 gives the names of the electoral divisions. A detailed description of the boundaries of the proposed electoral divisions, as defined on the map, is set out in Schedule 2.

PUBLICATION

13. In accordance with Section 60(5)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, a copy of this report and a copy of the map are being sent to Nottinghamshire County Council and will be available for inspection at the Council's main offices. Copies of this report (without map) are being sent to those who received the consultation letter and to those who made comments.
