CHANGES IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS

The Ellesmere Port and Neston (Parishes) Order 1987

<u>Made</u>	6th February 1987
<u>Coming into force</u> -	
for the purposes described	
in article 2(1)	9th February 1987
for all other purposes	1st April 1987

Whereas the Ellesmere Port and Neston Borough Council, acting pursuant to section 48(8) of the Local Government Act 1972 (a), has made recommendations to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England for proposals about parishes in the borough;

And whereas in consequence of those recommendations the Commission has seen fit, pursuant to sections 47, 48(9) and 51(1) of that Act, to make proposals to the Secretary of State:

And whereas more than six weeks has elapsed since those proposals were made:

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to the proposals with modifications:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of that Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:-

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Ellesmere Port and Neston (Parishes) Order 1986.

2. - (1) 9th February 1987 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into force for any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 (a).

(2) For all other purposes, this order shall come into force on 1st April 1987.

Creation of new parish and parish council

3. - (1) In the borough of Ellesmere Port and Neston there shall be created, without change to any ward of the borough of Ellesmere Port and Neston or electoral division of the county of Cheshire, a new parish of Ince, which shall consist of the area shown outlined in red on the map prepared by the Department of the Environment, marked "Map of the Ellesmere Port and Neston (Parishes) Order 1987", and deposited in accordance with regulation 5 of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976.

(2) There shall be a parish council for the new parish, consisting of 5 parish councillors.

(3) Elections of parish councillors for the new parish shall be held on such day prior to 1st April 1987 as the returning officer shall appoint. The persons elected shall come into office on 1st April 1987, and retire on the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1990.

(4) The proper officer of the Ellesmere Port and Neston Borough Council shall convene -

the first annual meeting of the parish council for the new parish, which shall be held in April 1987; and

the first assembly of the parish meeting for the new parish.

If in the new parish the first assembly of the parish meeting is held before the first annual meeting of the parish council, the parish meeting may appoint a person to take the chair, who shall have, for the purpose of that occasion only, the powers and authority of the chairman.

(5) In the year beginning on 1st April 1987, the Ellesmere Port and Neston Borough Council shall levy rates in the new parish, and make payments to the parish council, as if the parish council had issued a precept to that borough council requiring the payment of a sum equal to the product of a rate of 3 pence in the pound, calculated on the total rateable value of the new parish as set out in the valuation list at the beginning of that financial year.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This order creates a new parish of Ince in the borough of Ellesmere Port and Neston.

The map forming part of this note (page 4) gives a general guide to the areas affected as from 1st April 1987.

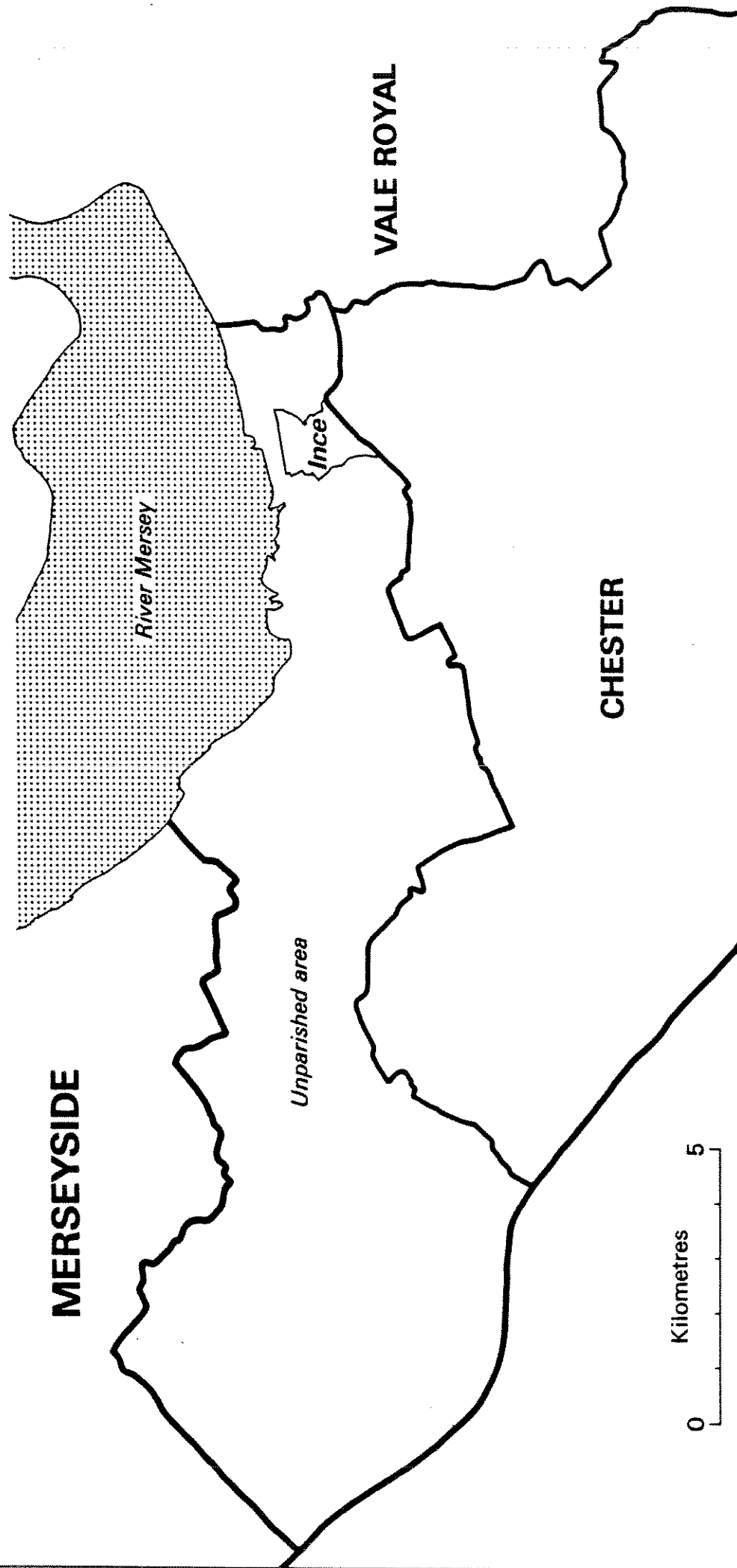
Prints of the detailed boundary map which is referred to in article 3 may be inspected at the offices of the borough council, and may be inspected at or purchased from the Department of the Environment's Map Library, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB.

A parish council is established for the new parish. The new parish will have approximately an area of 145 hectares, a population of 224, and a rateable value of £20,671.

The Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976, mentioned in articles 2(1) and 3, contain further provisions about the effect and implementation of orders such as the present one.
