PROPOSALS FOR THE FUTURE ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS
FOR THE BOROUGH OF HASTINGS

1. We, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, having carried out our initial review of the electoral arrangements for the Borough of Hastings in accordance with the requirements of section 63 of, and Schedule 9 to, the Local Government Act 1972, present our proposals for the future electoral arrangements for that borough.

2. In accordance with the procedure laid down in section 60(1) and (2) of the 1972 Act, notice was given on 12 August 1974 that we were to undertake this review. This was incorporated in a consultation letter addressed to the Hastings Borough Council, copies of which were circulated to the East Sussex County Council, the Member of Parliament for the constituency concerned and the headquarters of the main political parties. Copies were also sent to the editors of local newspapers circulating in the area and of the local government press. Notices inserted in the local press announced the start of the review and invited comments from members of the public and from interested bodies.

3. Hastings Borough Council were invited to prepare a draft scheme of representation for our consideration. In doing so, they were asked to observe the rules laid down in Schedule 11 to the Local Government Act 1972 and the guidelines which we set out in our Report No. 6 about the proposed size of the council and the proposed number of councillors for each ward. They were asked also to take into account any views expressed to them following their

consultation with local interests. We therefore asked that they should publish details of their provisional proposals about a month before they submitted their draft scheme to us, thus allowing an opportunity for local comment.

4. The Council have passed a resolution under section 7(4)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, requesting a system of elections by thirds.

5. On 31 December 1974, Hastings Borough Council presented their draft scheme of representation. The Borough Council proposed to divide the area into 11 wards, each returning 3 councillors, to form a council of 33.

6. We considered the draft scheme, together with comments which had been made upon it. We noted that the Council's draft scheme was unlikely to be compatible with future electoral arrangements for the county. Accordingly, we invited the Council to review their scheme in the light of this information.

7. The Borough Council submitted a revised draft scheme on 14 January 1977. The scheme provided for 16 wards, each returning 2 members to form a council of 32.

8. We considered the revised draft scheme together with comments suggesting alternative names for some wards. It seemed to us that this scheme provided a reasonable basis for the future electoral arrangements for the borough in compliance with the rules in Schedule 11 to the 1972 Act and with our guidelines.

On the recommendation of Ordnance Survey we made some minor boundary alterations in order to secure boundary lines which were more readily identifiable on the ground. We decided to adopt the ward names proposed by the Council. Subject to the minor boundary realignments suggested to us by Ordnance Survey, we adopted the Council's draft scheme as our draft proposals.

9. On 7 March 1977, we issued our draft proposals and these were sent to all who had received our consultation letter or had commented on the Council's draft scheme. The Council were asked to make a copy of the draft proposals and the accompanying map, which defined the proposed ward boundaries, available for inspection at their main offices. Representations on our draft proposals were invited from those to whom they were circulated and, by public notices, from other members of the public and interested bodies. We asked that comments should reach us by 2 May 1977.

10. Hastings Borough Council requested a further minor realignment of the boundary which had been suggested by Ordnance Survey between the proposed Central St. Leonards and Castle wards in order to include a small area of future development within the Castle ward.

11. We reviewed our draft proposals in the light of this comment, the only one we received. We concluded that the boundary modification proposed by the Council should be accepted. We formulated our final proposals accordingly.

12. Details of these proposals are set out in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this report. Schedule 1 gives the names of the wards and the number of councillors to be returned by each. Schedule 2 shows our proposals for the order of retirement of councillors. A description of the proposed wards as defined on the map is set out in Schedule 3.

PUBLICATION

13. In accordance with Section 60(5)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, a copy of this report and a copy of the map are being sent to Hastings Borough Council and will be available for public inspection at the Council's main offices. Copies of this report (without map) are being sent to those who received the consultation letter and to those who made comments.

Note: Where the boundary is described as following a road, railway, river, canal or similar feature, it should be deemed to follow the centre line of the feature unless otherwise stated.

WEST ST LEONARDS WARD

Commencing at a point where the western boundary of the Borough meets the southern boundary of the Borough at Mean Low Water thence generally north-eastwards along said western boundary to Crowhurst Road thence generally northeastwards and southeastwards along said road and the roads known as Ironlatch Hill, Wishing Tree Road and Gillsman's Hill to the road known as The Green, thence southwestwards and southwards along said road to Filsham Road, thence southwestwards along said road to the Battle to Hastings Railway, thence southeastwards along said railway to the footbridge which leads southwestwards to St Vincents Road, thence southwestwards along said footbridge to St Vincents Road, thence southwards along said road to West Hill Road, thence southwestwards and southwards along said road to Bexhill Road, thence eastwards along said road to the road known as Grosvenor Gardens, thence southwards along said road and in prolongation thereof to the Mean Low Water Mark being the southern boundary of the Borough, thence southwestwards along said Borough boundary to the point of commencement.

HOLLINGTON WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of West St Leonards Ward meets the western boundary of the Borough, thence generally northeastwards along said Borough boundary to Hastings Road, thence southeastwards along said road to Battle Road, thence southeastwards along said road to the footpath adjacent to the northwest boundary of the Rising Sun Public House, and leading to Hollington Old Lane thence southwestwards along said path to Hollington Old Lane, thence northwestwards along said lane to Coventry Road, thence westwards and southwestwards along said road to Oxford Road,

thence northwestwards along said road to Bristol Road, thence westwards and southwestwards along said road to Bristol Way, thence northwestwards along Bristol Way to the eastern carriageway of Blackman Avenue, thence southwestwards along said avenue to a point being in prolongation southeastwards of Dymond Road, thence northwestwards along said prolongation and road to Wishing Tree Road, thence northeastwards along said road to the road known as Church Wood Drive, thence generally westwards, and southwards along said road to the northern boundary of West St Leonards Ward, thence westwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

WISHING TREE WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of West St Leonards Ward meets the southeastern boundary of Hollington ward, thence northwards, and generally eastwards, southwards and eastwards along said ward boundary to the eastern boundary of said ward, thence northwestwards along said boundary to Ashbrook Road, thence northeastwards along said road and Old Harrow Road, to Sedlescombe Road North, thence southeastwards and southwards along said road to Paynton Road, thence westwards along said road to Battle Road, thence southeastwards along said road to Sedlescombe Road South, thence southwestwards along said road to the northern boundary of West St Leonards Ward, thence northwestwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

ASHDOWN WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Wishing Tree Ward meets the eastern boundary of Hollington Ward at the junction of Battle Road and Ashbrook Road, thence northwestwards along said eastern boundary to the northern boundary of the Borough, thence generally eastwards and southeastwards along said Borough boundary to Beaney's Lane, thence southwestwards along said lane to and crossing the road known as The Ridge, to Hillside Road, thence southeastwards along said road to Parkstone Road, thence south-

westwards along said road to Old Roar Road, thence northwestwards along said road to Ghyllside Avenue, thence generally southwestwards and southwards along said avenue to the road known as Ghyllside Drive, thence southwestwards along said road to St Helen's Road, thence northwestwards and westwards along said road to the northern boundary of Wishing Tree Ward, thence northwestwards and southwestwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

SILVERHILL WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Wishing Tree Ward meets the southern boundary of Ashdown Ward, thence generally eastwards along said southern boundary to the river known as Old Roar Gill, thence generally southeastwards along said river to the pond to the west of Buck's Hole, thence generally southeastwards along the northeastern boundary of said pond to Vale Road, thence southwards along said road to the footpath to the northeast of Buckshole Reservoir, thence southeastwards along said footpath to the entrance to Alexandra Park situated opposite No 122 St Helens Road, thence northeastwards in a straight line to St Helens Road, thence southeastwards and eastwards along said road to Park Cross Road, thence southwestwards along said road to Lower Park Road, thence northwestwards along said road to a point opposite the northwestern boundary of No 108 Lower Park Road, thence southwestwards to and along said boundary to the rear boundary of said property, thence southeastwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of Nos 107 to 101 Lower Park Road to the southeastern boundary of No 101 Lower Park Road, thence northeastwards along said boundary to the footpath which leads southeastwards from Lower Park Road to Amherst Road, thence southeastwards along said footpath to Amherst Road, thence northwestwards along said road to a point opposite the western boundary of St Paul's School, thence southwards to and generally southeastwards along said boundary to and crossing Horntyne Road in a straight line to the southeastern boundary of No 1 Horntyne Road, thence southwestwards along said boundary,

the rear boundaries of Nos 41 to 26 St Paul's Road and the southeastern boundary of the Sports Centre to Bohemia Road, thence northwestwards along said road to Tower Road, thence southwestwards along said road to London Road, thence northwards along said road to the road known as Springfield Valley, thence westwards along said road to Combermere Road, thence northwards along said road to Springfield Road, thence westwards along said road to the eastern boundary of Wishing Tree Ward, thence generally northeastwards along said ward boundary to the point of commencement.

MAZE HILL WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of West St Leonards Ward meets the southern boundary of Silverhill Ward, thence eastwards and southwards along said southern boundary and continuing southwards along Combermere Road to Tower Road West, thence southwestwards along said road to Charles Road, thence southeastwards along said road to Brittany Road, thence southwestwards along said road to the road known as Upper Maze Hill, thence southeastwards along said road to the road known as Maze Hill, thence southeastwards and generally southwards along said road to the road known as East Ascent, thence eastwards along said road to the road known as Gardner Way, thence southwards along said road and in prolongation thereof to the Mean Low Water Mark being the southern boundary of the Borough, thence generally westwards along said Borough Boundary to the eastern boundary of West St Leonards Ward, thence generally northwards and northeastwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

GENSING WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Maze Hill Ward meets the southern boundary of Silverhill Ward, thence generally eastwards along said southern boundary to a point opposite the rear boundary of No's 30 and

28 Linton Road, thence generally southwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of No's 27 to 13 Linton Road, thence southwestwards in a straight line to the rear boundary of No 12 Linton Road, thence southeastwards along said boundary and the rear boundaries of No's 11 to 1 Linton Road to the southeastern boundary of Parcel No 0477, as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ 8109, Edition of 1956, thence southwestwards along said boundary and in prolongation thereof to Briscoe's Walk, thence generally southwards along said path to a point due north of the northeast corner of the Museum and Art Gallery, thence due south to said corner and westwards and southwards along the northern and western boundaries of said museum and gallery to Bohemia Road, thence northwestwards along said road to the easterly junction of Magdalen Road, thence southwestwards along said road to St John's Road, thence southwestwards along said road to a point on the road being the prolongation eastwards of the footpath to the north of the Sorting Office, thence westwards to and along said footpath to the road known as Station Approach, thence southwards along said road to London Road, thence southeastwards along said road to Silchester Road, thence southwestwards along said road to Stockleigh Road, thence generally northwestwards along said road to Carisbrooke Road, thence northwestwards along said road to Pevensy Road, thence westwards along said road to the eastern boundary of Maze Hill Ward, thence generally northwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

CENTRAL ST LEONARDS WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Maze Hill Ward meets the southern boundary of Gensing Ward, thence generally eastwards along said southern boundary and continuing along Bohemia Road and White Rock Road to the eastern boundary of the White Rock Pleasure Gardens, thence generally southwards along said said boundary to White Rock Road, thence southwestwards and southeastwards along said road to the road known as Verulam Place, thence southwestwards along said road to a point opposite the western boundary of

the Pier, thence southeastwards to and along said boundary and in prolongation thereof to the Mean Low Water Mark being the southern boundary of the Borough, thence generally southwestwards along said Borough boundary to the eastern boundary of Maze Hill Ward, thence northwards and northwestwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

CASTLE WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Central St Leonards Ward meets the southeastern boundary of Gensing Ward, thence northeastwards along said southeastern boundary to the Hastings to Rye Railway, thence northeastwards along said railway to the Subway footpath which leads southeastwards to Waterworks Road, thence southeastwards along said footpath to Waterworks Road, thence northeastwards along said road, crossing Queen's Road, and continuing northeastwards along Nelson Road to and crossing Stonefield Road, to the footpath situated to the south of No 2 Nelson Road, thence eastwards and southeastwards along said footpath, crossing Milward Road to the unnamed road to the west of St Mary's Terrace, thence southwards and southeastwards along said unnamed road to Priory Road, thence southwestwards along said road and Castle Hill Road to a point opposite the footpath which leads generally southwards to the rear boundary of No 42 George Street, thence southeastwards to and generally southwards along said footpath to the rear boundary of No 42 George Street, thence generally southwestwards along said rear boundary, the rear boundaries of No's 41 to 39 George Street and the rear boundaries of Nos 10 to 1 Sturdee Place and in Prolongation thereof to the eastern boundary of the De Luxe Club, thence southwards along said boundary, thence due south in a straight line to the Mean Low Water Mark being the southern boundary of the Borough, thence generally southwestwards along said Borough boundary to the eastern boundary of Central St Leonards Ward, thence northwestwards northeastwards and northwestwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

the Pier, thence southeastwards to and along said boundary and in prolongation thereof to the Mean Low Water Mark being the southern boundary of the Borough, thence generally southwestwards along said Borough boundary to the eastern boundary of Maze Hill Ward, thence northwards and northwestwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

CASTLE WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Central St Leonards Ward meets the southeastern boundary of Gensing Ward, thence northeastwards along said southeastern boundary to the Hastings to Rye Railway, thence northeastwards along said railway to the Subway footpath which leads southeastwards to Waterworks Road, thence southeastwards along said footpath to Waterworks Road, thence northeastwards along said road, crossing Queen's Road, and continuing northeastwards along Nelson Road to and crossing Stonefield Road, to the footpath situated to the south of No 2 Nelson Road, thence eastwards and southeastwards along said footpath, crossing Milward Road to the unnamed road to the west of St Mary's Terrace, thence southwards and southeastwards along said unnamed road to Priory Road, thence southwestwards along said road and Castle Hill Road to a point opposite the footpath which leads generally southwards to the rear boundary of No 42 George Street, thence southeastwards to and generally southwards along said footpath to the rear boundary of No 42 George Street, thence generally southwestwards along said rear boundary, the rear boundaries of No's 41 to 39 George Street and the rear boundaries of Nos 10 to 1 Sturdee Place and in Prolongation thereof to the eastern boundary of the De Luxe Club, thence southwards along said boundary, thence due south in a straight line to the Mean Low Water Mark being the southern boundary of the Borough, thence generally southwestwards along said Borough boundary to the eastern boundary of Central St Leonards Ward, thence northwestwards northeastwards and northwestwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

BRAYBROOKE WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Castle Ward meets the eastern boundary of Gensing Ward, thence northwards along said eastern boundary to the southern boundary of Silverhill Ward, thence southeastwards along said boundary to the eastern boundary of said ward, thence northwestwards, generally southeastwards and northeastwards along said boundary to St Helen's Road, thence eastwards along said road to a point opposite the footpath which leads northeastwards to St Helen's Crescent, thence northeastwards to and along said footpath to St Helen's Crescent, thence generally northeastwards along said crescent, crossing St Helen's Park Road, to Laton Road, thence southeastwards and eastwards along said road to Elphinstone Road, thence southeastwards along said road to Hughenden Road, thence northeastwards, eastwards and southwestwards along said road to Mount Pleasant Road, thence eastwards along said road to Calvert Road, thence southeastwards along said road to St George's Road, thence southwestwards along said road to a point opposite the footpath to the northeast of No 75 Vicarage Road, thence northwestwards to and along said footpath to Manor Road, thence southwestwards along said road to St Mary's Road, thence southeastwards along said road and St Mary's Terrace to a point opposite the southern boundary of No 31 St Mary's Terrace, thence westwards in a straight line to the northern boundary of the vacant plot to the north of the property known as The Beacon, thence westwards along said boundary and in prolongation thereof to the rear boundary of No 108 Milward Road, thence generally southwards along said boundary, the rear boundaries of Nos 106 to 90 Milward Road and the western boundary of the property known as The Beacon to the northern boundary of Castle Ward, thence generally westwards and southwestwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

ST HELENS WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Ashdown Ward meets the northern boundary of the Borough, thence generally southeastwards along

said Borough boundary to the northwestern boundary of Hastings Borough Cemetery, thence southwestwards along said boundary to the road known as The Ridge, thence southeastwards along said road to Elphinstone Road, thence southwestwards along said road to a point opposite the northeastern boundary of No 33 Friar's Way, thence northwestwards to and along said boundary and the northeastern boundaries of No's 31 to 27 Friar's Way to the northeastern boundary of Parcel No 9287 as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ 8111, Edition of 1956, thence northwestwards along said boundary, the northeastern boundary of Parcel No 9388 and the northern boundary of Parcel No 9287 and in prolongation thereof to Dunclutha Road, thence northwards along said road to St Helen's Park Road, thence generally southwestwards along said road to the northern boundary of Braybrooke Ward, thence generally southwestwards along said boundary to the eastern boundary of Silverhill Ward, thence generally northwestwards along said boundary to the southern boundary of Ashdown Ward, thence southeastwards along said boundary to the eastern boundary of said ward, thence generally northeastwards and northwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

ELPHINSTONE WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Braybrooke Ward meets the eastern boundary of St Helens Ward, thence generally northeastwards, southeastwards and northeastwards along said eastern boundary to the road known as The Ridge, thence southeastwards along said road to Pilot Road, thence southeastwards along said road to Parker Road, thence southwestwards along said road to the northern boundary of Braybrooke Ward, thence generally westwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

BROOMGROVE WARD

Commencing at the point where the northern boundary of Braybrooke Ward meets the eastern boundary of Elphinstone Ward, thence generally northeastwards,

northwestwards and northeastwards along said boundary to the northern boundary of the Borough, thence generally northeastwards and southeastwards along said Borough boundary to National Grid reference 8319112140, thence southwestwards to and along Burgess Road to Ivyhouse Lane, thence southeastwards and southwestwards along said lane to the road known as The Ridge, thence southeastwards along said road to Old London Road, thence southeastwards, southwards and southwestwards along said road to Frederick Road, thence northwards along said road to a point opposite the northern boundary of Parcel No 0392, as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ 8310, Edition of 1956, thence southwestwards to and along said boundary and continuing southwestwards northwestwards and southwestwards along the northern boundary of Parcel No 9490, as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ 8210, Edition of 1956, to and northwestwards along the southwestern boundary of Parcel No 8998, and in prolongation thereof to the Rye to Hastings Railway, thence southwestwards along said railway to the footbridge to the southwest of Ore Station, thence northwestwards along said footbridge to the footpath which leads southwestwards to Hughenden Road, thence southwestwards along said footpath to the northern boundary of Braybrooke Ward, thence westwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

MOUNT PLEASANT WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Braybrooke Ward meets the southern boundary of Broomgrove Ward, thence generally northeastwards along said southern boundary to Alfred Road, thence eastwards along said road to Athelstan Road, thence generally southwards, southwestwards and southeastwards along said road to Harold Road, thence southwestwards along said road to Godwin Road, thence generally westwards along said road to Ashburnham Road, thence southwestwards along said road to Old London Road, thence southwestwards along said road to a point opposite the footpath which leads generally westwards to Croft Road, thence generally westwards to and along said footpath to Croft Road, thence northwards and northwestwards

along said road and Whitefriars Road to the eastern boundary of Braybrooke Ward, thence northeastwards and generally northwestwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.

OLD HASTINGS WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Braybrooke Ward meets the southern boundary of Mount Pleasant Ward, thence southeastwards and generally northeastwards along said southern boundary to a point opposite the footpath situated between No's 180 and 188 Harold Road, thence southeastwards and generally eastwards to and along said footpath to Barley Lane, thence southwestwards along said lane to a point opposite the northeastern boundary of Parcel No 6630, as shown on Ordnance Survey 1:2500 Plan TQ 8310, Edition of 1956, thence southeastwards to and along said boundary and the northeastern boundary of Parcel No 6619 and in prolongation thereof to the stream which runs southwestwards through Ecclesbourne Glen, thence southwestwards along said stream to it's end, thence due south in a straight line to the Mean Low Water Mark being the southern boundary of the Borough, thence generally southwestwards along said Borough boundary to the eastern boundary of Castle Ward, thence generally northwards along said boundary and the eastern boundary of Braybrooke Ward to the point of commencement.

ORE WARD

Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Broomgrove Ward meets the northern boundary of the Borough, thence generally northeastwards and generally southeastwards along said Borough boundary to the Mean Low Water Mark being the southern boundary of the Borough, thence southwestwards along said Borough boundary to the eastern boundary of Old Hastings Ward, thence generally northeastwards and northwestwards along said boundary to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant Ward, thence generally northeastwards and westwards along said boundary to the eastern boundary of Broomgrove Ward,

thence generally northeastwards, northwestwards and northeastwards along said boundary to the point of commencement.
