

BBC ACADEMY HOSTS FILE DELIVERY EVENTS FOR INDIES

Over the coming 12 months, the main UK Broadcasters will be switching from video tape to file-based delivery of programmes in a revolution described as the biggest change in television since the introduction of colour.

In parallel with this change, QC (Quality Control) will now be performed before delivery using Automatic Quality Check (AQC) devices, backed up by "Eyeball Checks" – an editorial viewing of the programme to also include spelling or any visual imperfections. This process has been planned by the Digital Production Partnership (or DPP) which consists of BBC, ITV, Channel 4, BSkyB, Channel 5, S4C, UKTV and BT Sport.

"File Delivery Made Real" is a series of training events organised by the BBC Academy to prepare the industry for these changes. The events will build on the forums that have been held by the DPP, and "File Delivery Made Real" will include a practical zone where the techniques for creating, reviewing and delivering the files will be demonstrated on state-of-the-art equipment. There will be interactive hands-on exercises to familiarise both production, post-production and technical staff with the skills required to successfully build DPP file delivery into their production workflows.

The first series of events will take place during June and July in Salford, Glasgow, Belfast, Cardiff and London. They are aimed at staff working within UK broadcasters, independent production companies, post-production houses and freelancers. A second series of events later in the year will be hosted for BBC staff as teams start to migrate across to file delivery.

There will be two streams; one for producers, production managers and heads of production; the other will be for editors, technical operators and engineers.

Course content:

- File mastering, QC and delivery overview
- Advantages of file delivery
- Producers' responsibility to deliver a technically compliant programme
- Preparing your programme for file delivery
- "Eyeball" checks that everyone can do
- Encoding your file and supplying descriptive metadata
- Automatic Quality Checking in practice and QC reporting to the broadcaster
- Uploading your programme to the broadcaster
- Additional Q&A session for producers and production managers will include:
- The impact of file delivery on the production workflow and scheduling.
- Top-tips for efficient file mastering and delivery
- Additional technical presentations for operational and engineering personnel will include:
- The AS-11 DPP file format, the theory behind AQC and techniques for securely transferring very large files across IP networks.



The events are free of charge but eligibility criteria apply:

- Delegates should be in one of the following roles: Director, Producer, Production Manager, Head of Production, Dubbing Mixer, Post-production Supervisor, Editor, QC operator, MCR technician, Post-production Facility Manager, Head of Resource, Senior Engineer, and Engineer.
- Delegates should meet any of the following criteria:
 - 1. Two recent and relevant broadcast credits OR
 - 2. Working in a facility engaged in UK broadcast work (either permanent or freelance) OR
 - 3. Working in an independent production co. with recent/current UK broadcast commissions (either permanent or freelance)
