Zeyad's words are completely right and very timely and in that spirit this is what the NHS offers you, when you need it.

The NHS Grenfell Health and Wellbeing Service supports people affected by the Grenfell Tower fire. The service is delivered by psychologists, nurses, social workers, therapists, and other staff.

We provide a range of talking therapies and support to help you feel better if you or your children have been affected by Grenfell, unable to sleep, having memories or pictures of the event unexpectedly popping into your mind, or feeling anxious, low, stressed or depressed. The service is for people of any age, and works with families and individuals.

Why are we knocking on doors?

Our staff have been visiting people in their homes, going door to door, to make sure that survivors, bereaved people and local residents affected know that they can talk to and see a psychologist if they wish.



We have a brief chat to discuss your needs and refer any people who need support to the talking therapies service. If people are not ready or don't want to use talking therapies services we can discuss other options for support.

We also need to understand the full psychological impact that the fire has had so we can plan and deliver the most relevant service.

Although Grenfell Health and Wellbeing Service is an emotional wellbeing service you can tell us about any physical health concerns you have, or need further advice about, or where to find physical health care, our staff can guide you on this, and contact relevant services, like your GP.

 - We respect your beliefs, culture and backgrounds
 - We will provide interpreters for your preferred languages
 - You can use the service as many times as is needed
 - We will make changes if you tell us your views
