The community have told us they would like projects and initiatives that fall within the following six categories:

- 1 Wellbeing for children, young people or adults
- 2 Educational opportunities to increase skills, knowledge, enterprise and qualifications
- Social and cultural events that bring communities together and provide information to increase connections across the community including initiatives to reduce isolation for older people
- 4 Community safety that increases the safety of everyone
- 5 Activities for young people
- 6 Food Growing/Greening and food-based activities that increase communities coming together and enhances the local environment.

A brand new grants programme supporting communities affected by the Grenfell tragedy.

A £600k grant fund is now available to local groups, new and existing organisations and all residents' associations so they can bid for grants to deliver priority projects for Grenfell-affected communities.

The Grenfell Projects Fund is a brand new grants programme that will support local projects and initiatives that support communities affected by the Grenfell tragedy.

The Fund has been co-designed with the local community following conversations with hundreds of residents in the area earlier this year.

New and existing local organisations, residents' associations and groups who have the sponsor of an established organisation can apply for grants. You can submit a maximum of two bids as long as they do not exceed the total amount you are eligible to apply for. Groups seeking more than £50,000 can submit one bid only.

How much money is available and who can apply

- Up to £10,000 is available for existing tenant and residents' associations (who are formally constituted and actively engaged with residents)
- Up to £10,000 is available for new collectives who are not formally constituted but have the support of an existing organisation who will support the delivery, monitoring and evaluation of projects)
- Up to £50,000 is available for new and existing organisations who have operated for less than three years and are formally constituted
- Over £50,000 is available for existing organisations who have been formally constituted for more than three years with five full time members of staff or more. Groups seeking over £50,000 can submit one bid only

There is £100k available for each of the six categories (see back page). Organisations can submit a maximum of two bids as long as they do not exceed the total amount they are eligible to apply for.
