I feel there was no risk assessment done at this venue and it therefore felt the doctor was asking my mother to move onto the examination couch in an unsafe manner. When I asked if there was another couch in the building the doctor said no and so I said that I would complain as a doctor shouldn't have to work without safe equipment. Doctor said no point in complaining as NHS has no money!! I am a community nurse and I know from experience that the treatment room would not be deemed safe when risk assessed for use by patients who are elderly or disabled.
