- To ensure everyone is seen promptly and staff that don't usually work there are informed how the patient queuing system works to ensure patients are seen in the correct order.
- The doctor/nurse who assessed me did not demonstrate sufficient knowledge of urgent medical conditions. He tried to send me home with sickness tablets, despite me explaining that I had a life threatening condition. I would have died if I had agreed to this plan, instead of deciding to seek further medical advice of my own volition and being admitted. It does not appear to be a safe medical service; I would avoid using this service.
- Waited 1:30 hours to be seen after 1 hour find out I wasn't booked in and I did speak to the man at the desk when I came in
- We arrived at 9.30am as we had been told by 111 that if you arrived when it opened there was usually no wait and would be seen quickly. We weren't seen until almost 11am when we went in we saw a nurse prescriber and I explained we had been waiting almost 1.5 hours and she apologised and said she didn't usually work here but wasn't aware we hadn't been waiting so long as we hadn't seen the HCSW and she was seeing patients who had seen here and wasn't aware there was another queue. She said we didn't need to have waited anywhere near that long! With a poorly 17 month old who was already distressed and needed a sleep this was difficult.
