- High risk criteria 1 or more, or if <17yo and impaired immunity (drugs or illness) with any modhigh risk criteria</li>
  - Refer all people with suspected sepsis for emergency medical care by "most appropriate means of transport" (usually 999):
    - UK Sepsis Trust also recommends 1) pre-alert paramedics this is red flag sepsis, 2) administer O2 to keep sats >94% (88-92% if COPD), 3) if estimated transfer time >1hr give IV antibiotics, and 4) write concise, clear handover for medical teams
  - If meningococcal disease is suspected give benzyl penicillin in the community
  - o Suspect neutropenic sepsis in patients on anticancer treatment who become unwell
    - Refer for immediate secondary care assessment
- Moderate to high risk criteria 1 or more
  - Identify the source; use clinical judgment to decide whether to treat in the community
  - If a clinical diagnosis is not reached or the patient cannot be safely treated in the community refer them urgently for emergency care
- <u>Low risk but suspected sepsis</u> careful safety netting, explain how and when to seek further medical review (e.g. mod>high risk feature call 111/see GP urgently), signpost of information
