Medicines Management Update – 21st May 2014

Driver Briefing

Following a review of the medicines management policy a risk was identified in the management of the home visiting cassettes.

The risk is that drugs/medicines could be taken from the used cassettes in the period when the cassette is returned and stored at the end of a shift.

The same applies when cassettes are stored prior to being checked by Medicines Management Team.

With immediate effect, cassettes used by a clinician during a shift will be sealed with a yellow numbered tag at the end of the shift and before the driver returns to the base location where the car is normally parked in hours.

The tags will be stored in the cars in the wallet

The drivers checklist has been updated and the driver must ask the clinician the questions relating to:

- 1. Has anything being used from the cassettes
- 2. If yes to question 1 above, has a prescription been completed and has the Medicines Administration Sheet (MAS) been completed.
- 3. Check the yellow tag has been fitted and the number recorded and signed by the clinician.

The cassettes are to be returned to the secure storage and will be checked by the Meds Management team.
