Comfort and Safety Call Process

There are occasions when there may be an expected or unexpected delay in either visiting or assessing a patient. A 'Comfort and safety call' is a courtesy call to a patient or patient representative to inform them of a potential delay in providing them with a service and ensure their safety. Our in-house System Adastra allows call handling staff to log details of any comfort and safety calls made on Adastra.

Reason for comfort & safety calls

- 1. Reassure the patient that they have not been forgotten
- 2. Check that the patient's condition has not worsened
- 3. To give the patient an ETA of when they will be visited or contacted by a clinician
- 4. Courtesy

When should a comfort call be made?

Comfort calls should be made at least 5 minutes prior to a case breaching if you are aware that it is going to breach. In all cases no later than 5 minutes after the case priority time ends.
