- Telephone advice
- · Home visiting service
- Medical admissions clerking
- Ward rounds

Service Response Times

(Excludes ward rounds)

- Telephone advice 30 minutes
- Home visit 1 hour
- Medical admissions 1 hour

Times are taken from initial contact with Badger

St Giles Expectations of Clinicians

Badger clinicians must:

- · Work within St Giles policies and procedures
- · Remote prescribing "Do"s and Don"ts"
- MED-002 Anticipatory medication guidelines
- Work within the West Midlands Palliative Care Guidelines and have access to an electronic version

On Arrival

Clinicians must:

- Sign in and out in the Visitors book
- Discuss the rationale for the visit with the Nursing Team Leader

- Review the previous entries on the patients record on the Crosscare system (Lichfield only)
- · Consult with St Giles 2nd on consultant where necessary
- Lichfield record the details of the visit on the Crosscare system
- <u>Walsall</u> -Record the details of the visit on the Daily Assessment sheet within the patient record

Transfer of Patients to Hospital

- If a life-threatening situation that requires urgent attention occurs call 999 or instruct a nurse to do so
- The Badger Clinician will provide a written referral letter as well as speaking to the receiving doctor in the local A & E dept
- The patients drug chart will accompany the patient to hospital
- If, following review of patient, clinician is concerned that the patient may require acute intervention that cannot be given in the hospice setting, the Clinician must discuss with the 2nd on call consultant prior to making a decision
- Following decision to transfer, Badger Clinician must write a brief referral letter detailing the present complaint, medication and reason for transfer together with the drug chart
- Any treatment plans or decisions to transfer should be discussed with the patient and family where appropriate

Medical Clerking

Badger Clinician will undertake Medical Clerking for end of life admissions for patients known to St Giles

- Clinician to arrive within 1 hour of contact with Badger
- Clinician to use St Giles EOL template together with appropriate medication prescribing
- Clinician to ensure DNAR in place

Crosscare will only allow you access to one patient record at a time. When you have

finished reviewing and updating actions close Crosscare down by clicking on system. If you have any queries or concerns please ask a nurse to assist you.

Process for out of hours ward rounds and adhoc reviews

Consultant final ward round for week must include treatment / management plan which has been discussed with patient and relative, where appropriate.



If Clinician has any concerns or is unsure of treatment plan they should seek advice from 2nd on call St Giles Consultant.

Transfer of patients to hospital

 If life threatening situation that requires urgent attention call 999 or instruct a nurse to do so and then inform 2nd on call Consultant.

The patient's drug chart will accompany the patient to hospital

 If, following review of patient, Clinician is concerned that patient may require acute intervention that cannot be given in hospice setting – Clinician must discuss with 2nd on call Consultant prior to making decision.

Following decision to transfer, Clinician must write brief referral letter detailing present complaint, medication and reason for transfer together with drug chart

Any treatment plans or decisions to transfer should be discussed with the patient and family where appropriate

Remote Prescribing Do's and Don'ts

Whittington and Walsall

- 1. What can be remotely prescribed and follow up action required
 - A verbal order is not acceptable on its own
 - The nurse will print off email and transcribe drug in red pen onto the 'Once Only Drugs' section of the IPU or Care Unit Prescription sheet and administer drug accordingly. This transcription must be countersigned by medic within 24 hours (72 hours maximum bank holidays and weekends). The changes must have been authorised (via email) by a registered prescriber before the new dosage is administered.

Exemptions

- No Controlled Drugs to be prescribed remotely
- Drugs not already prescribed. If a new drug is required 1st on call will need to come into the hospice to prescribe.
- 2. Template for prescription
 - Badger clinician and St Giles nurse to discuss case. Decision to alter prescription made and communicated verbally. Nurse to give Badger clinician patient's Crosscare/NHS number.
 - Badger clinician will then confirm details by email (only use NHS.net see below) using the following template:
 - ✓ Patient name or initials
 - ✓ Date of Birth
 - ✓ Crosscare/NHS number
 - ✓ Name of drug (generic not trade)
 - ✓ Dose of drug (words not symbols)
 - ✓ Route of drug (abbreviation acceptable here)
 - √ Frequency
 - ✓ Medic name and GMC/NMC registration number
