## Introduction

Registered Medical Practitioners (RMPs) in England and Wales have a statutory duty to notify the 'proper officer' at their local council or local health protection team (HPT) of suspected cases of certain infectious diseases.

Forms for notifying the local authority are available on Adastra, Web Communications – Badger Standard Forms - External Forms – <u>UKHSA West Midlands HPT - NOIDs Form</u>.

## Procedure

Complete a notification form (NOIDs) immediately on diagnosis of a suspected notifiable disease. Make a note in the patients case 'NOIDS form completed and emailed to PHE/HPT'. Pass the completed form to the Team Leader / Receptionist who will send via secure email to the Local West Midlands HPT: phe.wmnoids@nhs.net
