



## DNA PROFILES (CCRC GENERATED) LOADED ONTO THE NATIONAL DNA DATABASE

### CASEWORK POLICY

1. Where the CCRC has submitted samples for DNA profiling and the results shown do not match the DNA profile of the applicant the new DNA profile must be checked against the National DNA database (NDNAD).
2. In the event that an individual or crime scene sample is identified the police should be informed and the CCRC will consider the significance of the new evidence to the applicant's case.
3. Where an initial check against the NDNAD does not result in a 'hit' on any individual or crime scene sample, the CCRC would wish to have the new DNA profile loaded onto the NDNAD. This is so that the profile can be compared with all new individual and crime scene profiles as they are loaded onto the NDNAD. This must be arranged by the Head of Investigations, who will record relevant details in an appropriate Log.
4. Where a DNA profile loaded onto the NDNAD at the request of the CCRC at any time results in a match, the CCRC will be notified.
