HS2 provided technical note on noise monitoring to DA on 24 July. A subsequent meeting has been offered.  This action is being addressed directly with David Auger. Meeting to be arranged with NR.  DA to clarify what noise monitoring data he requires, and for this data to be provided by 20 March 2019.  Feb 2017 – Jan 2018 raw data has been published. Feb 2017 – April 2018 reports published. Meeting took place with DA and NR 18 June 2019.  Further actions were agreed. DA to advise on further information to be provided.

Response sent on 25/ 9/19 advised: the NR works incorporating track laying, power system and signalling installation works was considered in the overall assessment of construction noise in the ES. However, these works were scoped out from further assessment within the ES AP3 noise model. The reasons for this are that based upon the information provided by engineers in terms of plant (type of equipment, number and percentage on-times etc.), programme and working locations it was assessed that such activities were unlikely to result in significant construction noise effects as works of this nature do not generally require large quantities of construction plant and progress at a reasonably rapid rate. As such any adverse noise effects would be of short duration and would be controlled and reduced by the management processes set out in the CoCP.  HS2 is unable to provide anything further for this response. The Chair, the Contact Group and HS2 are agreed that this action is now closed for ECRG but appreciate it may be escalated outside of the group.
