Work between Euston Station and Primrose Hill tunnels 20 February 2021 – 30 May 2021

Over the coming months, we're continuing to help prepare the way for Britain's new High Speed 2 (HS2) railway.

This is an update on HS2 enabling work as well as some essential Network Rail resilience work that will be taking place in your area over the next three months.

The maps and tables at the end of this letter will help you to identify the work planned near to your property.

Why we need to do this work:

We're improving the existing operational railway and preparing for HS2 to be constructed. This work is vital to provide a safe, reliable and efficient railway for our passengers and for the future.

When we need to do this work:

To keep our staff safe, we need to work at times that cause the least disruption to train services and passengers. This often means carrying out work during weeknights and weekends.

How this work may affect you:

The machinery that we use does mean that some noise will be unavoidable. We'll make every effort to reduce disturbance where we can. We'll put noise barriers up where it is safe to do, use silenced generators and have continuous noise monitoring to ensure that noise levels are kept within agreed limits.

All vehicles have to sound an alarm before they move on site. We'll also be using temporary lighting overnight and during overcast weather conditions.

Our staff are regularly briefed on the importance of working responsibly in the local community.

We work closely with Camden Council to reduce the impact of our work. All HS2 enabling work that we carry out is agreed with HS2 Ltd and Camden Council. It also complies with Section 61 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974, which requires noise levels to be controlled to as low a level as practically possible.

We'll advise you of any work changing at short notice via the **HS2** in **Camden** website and will remind residents of work we think is going to be particularly disruptive. Please sign up to receive news alerts at: www.HS2inCamden.co.uk





Other work in your area:

HS2 are continuing with work in the area, but we wanted to make sure you're aware in advance of their planned piling work between Mornington and Granby Terrace road bridges as it's taking place on the railway.
