Notice of utility surveys in Long Drive/Station Approach

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. From 6 January we will be carrying out utility surveys in your area. The surveys will help us understand the condition and location of utility services and how best protect them while we are building HS2.

What we are doing - Ground Penetrating Radar

We will be carrying out utility surveys on Long Drive and Station Approach over a short period within the next three months. First, we will put small studs in the ground to set up the survey area. Then nonintrusive scanning equipment will be used to create a map of the utility services below ground and they will be marked out using biodegradable spray paint. We will use cameras to take site photos of the completed work.

What we are doing - CCTV surveys of the sewer system

We will also be carrying out surveys to investigate the condition of the drainage. Should we find a blockage we may need to flush the drainage system using a high-pressure water jet to carry out our investigations.

How this might affect you

A temporary lane closure will be in place for a very short period to protect staff carrying out the surveys. Some of the surveys will take place on the footway. You will still be able to travel and walk through the area but may be asked to wait for a short time. Your utility services will not be affected during the surveys.

If any parking restrictions are needed it will be indicated on road furniture in the area in the week before activity begins

Duration of works

From 6 January the works will take place for a short period within a three month window

The stud work will happen during the day and then the surveys at night

What to expect

Mondays to Fridays 8pm to 6am (although the stud work preparation will happen during the dayWe may be on site for an hour before the start and/or the end of the shift but please note that these works are very short in duration

Survey equipment includes tripods and trolley mounted vehicles A Jetting lorry and drainage survey van will be present for the CCTV surveys should a blockage be found

Temporary markings in the road/footway are completely harmless to the environment and will wash away
