Construction Update- Old Oak Common Station

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain.

We are continually reviewing the works on our construction sites in line with Government and Public Health England (PHE) advice on dealing with COVID-19. The Government's current strategy makes it clear that construction activity can continue as long as it complies with this guidance. Please be assured that only sites that can operate within the guidelines are operational. All sites will remain under constant review.

We are continuing with our site establishment work at the Old Oak Common Station site. Over the next few months, we will begin preparing for piling and diaphragm wall activity (ground strengthening to support our deep excavation works for the station). The work will include the activities below through the remainder of December 2020, and into Spring 2021

- Ongoing construction of access roads within the site, including excavation and pouring concrete.
- Soil excavation and removal to lower the level of the ground in preparation for the piling and diaphragm wall activity
- Installation of extra site drainage to remove excess surface water off site ready for the construction of concrete slabs.
- Two temporary parallel beams along the perimeters of the station will be installed in order to guide the deep trench excavations for the concrete walls.

Site arrangements for Christmas 2020

The Old Oak Common Station site will cease work for Christmas on 18 December 2020, and resume on Monday 4 January 2021. Although normal work will not take place, site security will still be on site and essential maintenance work will continue. Other contractors carrying out work for Network Rail will use our site for access to their work areas.

Duration of works

Our current working hours are 8am- 6pm Monday to Friday, and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays.

From January 2021, we will be extending our working hours to 8am -10pm Mondays to Fridays, and 8am-5pm on Saturdays where required.

We may also be on site for an hour at the start and/or end of each shift.

What to expect

Limited works on the Old Oak Common Station Site between 18 December 2020 and 4 January 2021.

What we will do

Only work our extended hours where required for piling and diaphragm wall activity.

Updates to working hours from January 2021

We are applying to the London Borough of Hammersmith & Fulham (LBHF) to extend our working hours to 10pm on Mondays to Fridays, and 5pm on Saturdays. The extended hours are required for large concrete pours and piling (ground strengthening) activity. We will only work during the extended hours when necessary, and we do not anticipate this will be until 10pm every weekday, or 5pm every Saturday. Once agreed with LBHF, the new working hours will be in place from January 2021, however we will not begin working the extended hours until later in the year when the piling activity begins. We will provide local residents with further information about this closer to the time.
