

## Notice of revised traffic rerouting around Northway Island from 24 May

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Early works for HS2 are being carried out by a joint venture between Laing O'Rourke and J. Murphy & Sons, known as LM. In your area, we are working near the A452, A45 and M42, which surround the site of the future HS2 Interchange Station.

### We're improving the local road network

We are remodelling and improving sections of the existing road network in the area and creating new routes on HS2 land. These road improvements will ensure that when the future station is operational, the local road network is fit for purpose. Upon completion, a new T-junction will replace Northway Island. A new 'longabout' is already in operation outside the Holiday Inn Express NEC, on the way to the National Exhibition Centre (NEC).

To date, we have connected parts of the existing road network to some of the new routes we created, and installed new pedestrian footpaths, kerb lines and central reservations in the area. We started the creation of the new T-junction in April. This programme will continue with some changes to the existing traffic rerouting around Northway Island which commenced on Monday 26 April.

### Revised traffic rerouting will begin on Monday 24 May

From Monday 24 May, one of the short sections of Northway Island that was closed on Monday 26 April will reopen, whilst the other section remains closed. Depending on your direction of travel, road users will no longer be able to travel around the whole of the Island and you may be redirected from Northway Island, along the B4438, and back (see map on page 2).

**You will still be able to access all routes**, there will just be a short diversion from some parts of Northway Island. Direction of travel along the B4438, A452 and Northway will be unaffected.

In conjunction with the traffic measures outlined above, we will also install temporary 24-hour traffic lights on a short section of the A452 from Monday 24 May for one week (see map on page 2).

### **Duration of works**

From Monday 24 May traffic travelling around Northway Island will be rerouted.

From Monday 24 May for one week, temporary 24-hour traffic lights will be installed along the A452.

### What to expect

Depending on your direction of travel, you will no longer be able to travel around the whole of Northway Island and you may be redirected from the Island, along the B4438, and back.

#### What we will do

Maintain access to all buildings, businesses and travel routes in the area.

Install directional signage for road users.

Keep all sites safe and secure.

### New direction of travel around Northway Island from Monday 24 May

The map below outlines the new direction of travel for road users from Monday 24 May around Northway Island. Direction of travel along the B4438, A452 and Northway will be unaffected, and you will still be able to access all routes in the area.

These traffic measures will be reviewed around July 2021. We'll keep you informed of any changes to the direction of travel around Northway Island before they take effect.

We will also install temporary 24-hour traffic lights on a short section of the A452 from Monday 24 May for one week.
