

## Notice of temporary closure of Ridgeway Lane

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Early works for HS2 are carried out by LM - a joint venture between Laing O'Rourke and J. Murphy & Sons.

#### Works planned near the Grand Union Canal

Over the coming months, we'll be working near the Grand Union Canal to construct an ecological mitigation site at Longhole. This part of works to provide new habitats for wildlife along the length of HS2 contributing to creating a 'green corridor'. We will also be improving the road surface along Ridgeway Lane, including filling in pot holes.

#### Whats involved?

LM will be temporarily closing a section of Ridgeway Lane to vehicle traffic in order to construct this ecological mitigation site and road repair work. This will also help to create a safe working area for our workers.

The closure will be in place 24 hours a day, seven days a week for around three weeks (subject to site and weather conditions) in the area shown in the map on the next page. While this section of road is closed, a diversion route will be in operation along Welsh Lane, Fosse Way and the A425.

Pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders will still be able to use the roadway while the closure is in effect. Traffic Marshalls will escort non-motorised users safely through the works if required.

#### Why we're doing this work?

We need to prepare as much of the route as possible between October 2019 and March 2020. This will ensure that our main construction work can commence on time. It is also important to complete this work during this time of year as it is outside of key periods in the ecological calendar and helps to minimises our impact on local wildlife.

You might see us working on site during the day.


#### What we will do

Road closure will be in operation 24 hours a day from the week commencing 27<sup>th</sup> January for three weeks, subject to site and weather conditions.

Pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders will still be able to use the roadway while the closure is in effect. Traffic Marshalls will escort non-motorised users safely through the works if required.

Our working hours will be between 8.00am and 6.00pm from Monday to Friday, and between 8.00am and 1.00pm on Saturdays. We might be on site for up to one hour before or after to set up or pack up.

#### **About our Community and Business Funds**

The CEF is designed to give communities the opportunity to share in the benefits of HS2. It is an allocated fund that communities are able to apply for, to help to support local projects that aim to improve their local area.

The BLEF is designed to support local economies that may be disrupted by the construction of HS2. BLEF grants are for local business support organisations and local authorities to help maintain business activity in local communities.
