STATEMENT FROM THE JUDICIAL CONDUCT INVESTIGATIONS OFFICE

Judge Jeremy Lewis

A spokesperson for the Judicial Conduct Investigations Office said:

“Judge Jeremy Lewis, a fee paid judge of the Employment Tribunal, has been issued with a warning for accumulating 14 points on his driving licence, which resulted in a six-month driving ban. The Senior President of Tribunals and the Lord Chancellor considered that his behaviour together with his failure to report an earlier offence, despite previous guidance to do so, fell below the standards expected of a judge”.
