STATEMENT FROM THE JUDICIAL CONDUCT INVESTIGATIONS OFFICE

Judge Viney Jung

A spokesperson from the Judicial Conduct Investigations Office said:

‘Judge Viney Jung, a fee paid judge of the First Tier Tribunal Health, Education and Social Care Chamber, was subject to an investigation after the Solicitor’s Regulation Authority (SRA) formally rebuked her for failing to report improper conduct by a former employee at her firm of solicitors. The Judge also failed to promptly report the SRA proceedings to her Chamber President. The Lord Chancellor and Lord Chief Justice found that Judge Jung’s actions amounted to misconduct and have issued her with a reprimand. In reaching this decision, they took into consideration mitigation offered by the Judge and that the SRA had not made any findings of dishonesty against her.’
