## STATEMENT FROM THE JUDICIAL CONDUCT INVESTIGATIONS OFFICE

**Recorder Adrian Reynolds**

A spokesperson for the Judicial Conduct Investigations Office said:

“The Lord Chief Justice and Lord Chancellor have issued Recorder Adrian Reynolds with a reprimand after he was disqualified from driving for six months after receiving four speeding convictions, and for failing to report earlier convictions in line with guidance to the judiciary. In reaching their decision, the Lord Chancellor and Lord Chief Justice took into consideration that Recorder Reynolds promptly reported his disqualification and had a long record of valuable service to the courts in his area.”
