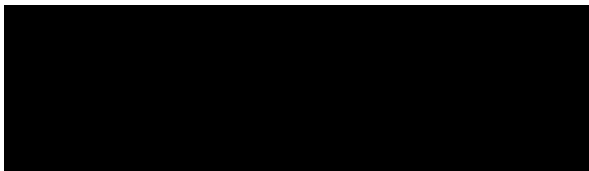

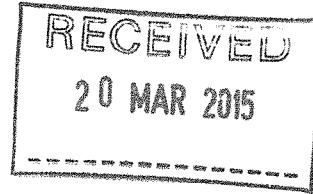

Dear Sirs

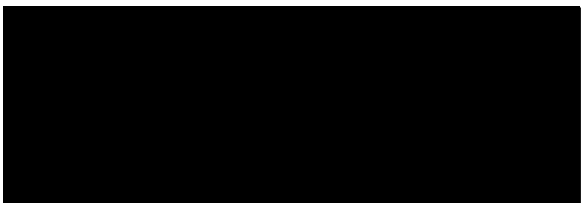
I am given to understand that you are about to mess about with the boundaries of the Kingsweston Ward here in Bristol.

Many moons ago, having been brought up there, when my mother died the house in Westbury on Trym came to me. I promptly sold it at well below the going rate to some solicitor since I had no desire to live among the [redacted] of Westbury or to own anything in that area.

I have lived in Sea Mills for over half a century which was built for, and is still occupied by, the working classes in the main.
