*I live on Upper Park Road and I am very interested in understanding why a small number of houses on Upper Park Road currently sits in Lower Belvedere but the large block of flats opposite houses on Upper Park Road, the houses behind and those houses on Fremantle Road sit in Belvedere Village; all these houses are neighbours and share property lines. I find this very strange as the line seems to skirt around a number of properties on Upper Park Road then goes down the middle of Upper Park Road to encompass properties across the road from Upper Park Road into Belvedere Village.*

*The boundary seems very strange to me and as such I would like to understand why this is the case as I would have thought a line straight across the road from the bottom of the buildings incorporated into Belvedere Village would have been a better way to section this area encompassing those house on Upper Park Road into the same boundary to allow residents to have the same councillors rather than neighbours having different ones. I appreciate that you have probably followed Fremantle Road as the boundary line, but given the unique way houses have been built in this area and the sharing of property lines, it does not seem to be the fairest way to divide these areas, especially as the line takes in buildings that also front onto Upper Park Road.*

*I do feel that this is very unfair in regards to councillors as lower belvedere is such a large ward and neighbours on the same road, or next door neighbours with similar issues will have different councillors representing them. Whilst I appreciate there needs to be a boundary somewhere, it looks rather a strange way to draw the boundary line by having half of the road in one ward and the other half in another with the boundary going down the middle of the road in front of houses on that road.*
