The Braintree (Parishes) Order 1999

Made - - - - 10<sup>th</sup> December 1999

*Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2)*

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 14 and 23 of the Local Government and Rating Act 1997(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order which gives effect (without modification) to recommendations made to him by the Braintree District Council following a review conducted by them in accordance with Part II of that Act, for the constitution as a parish of an area within the district of Braintree and for the alteration of the area of the parish of Black Notley:

**Citation, commencement and interpretation**

1. - (1) This Order may be cited as the Braintree (Parishes) Order 1999.

(2) It shall come into force on the day after that on which it is made.

(3) In this Order –

“existing” means existing on the day on which this Order is made;

“the map” means the map prepared by the Department of the Environment, Transport and the Regions, marked ‘Map of the Braintree (Parishes) Order 1999’ and deposited in the offices of the Secretary State and at the offices of the Braintree District Council; and

"the new parish" means the parish of Great Notley constituted by article 2 of this Order.

**Constitution of new parish**

2. - (1) A new parish, comprising the area delineated by a blue line on the map, shall be constituted within the district of Braintree.

(2) The name of the new parish shall be Great Notley.

**Direction to establish parish council**

3. - (1) The Braintree District Council is hereby directed to establish a parish council for the new parish.

(2) 1st April 2000 is the order date for the purposes of the Local Government (Parishes and Parish Councils) Regulations 1999(a).

**Alterations of parish areas and consequential provision**

4. - (1) The area of the new parish shall cease to be part of the existing parish of Black Notley.

(2) The Black Notley Village and Black Notley White Court wards of the existing parish of Black Notley are abolished and any statutory instrument establishing those wards is revoked to that extent.

(3) The areas marked "A1", "A2" and "C1" on the map shall cease to be part of the parish of Black Notley.

(4) The areas marked "B", "C2", "C3" and "D" on the map shall become part of the parish of Black Notley.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

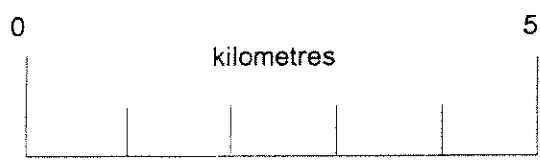
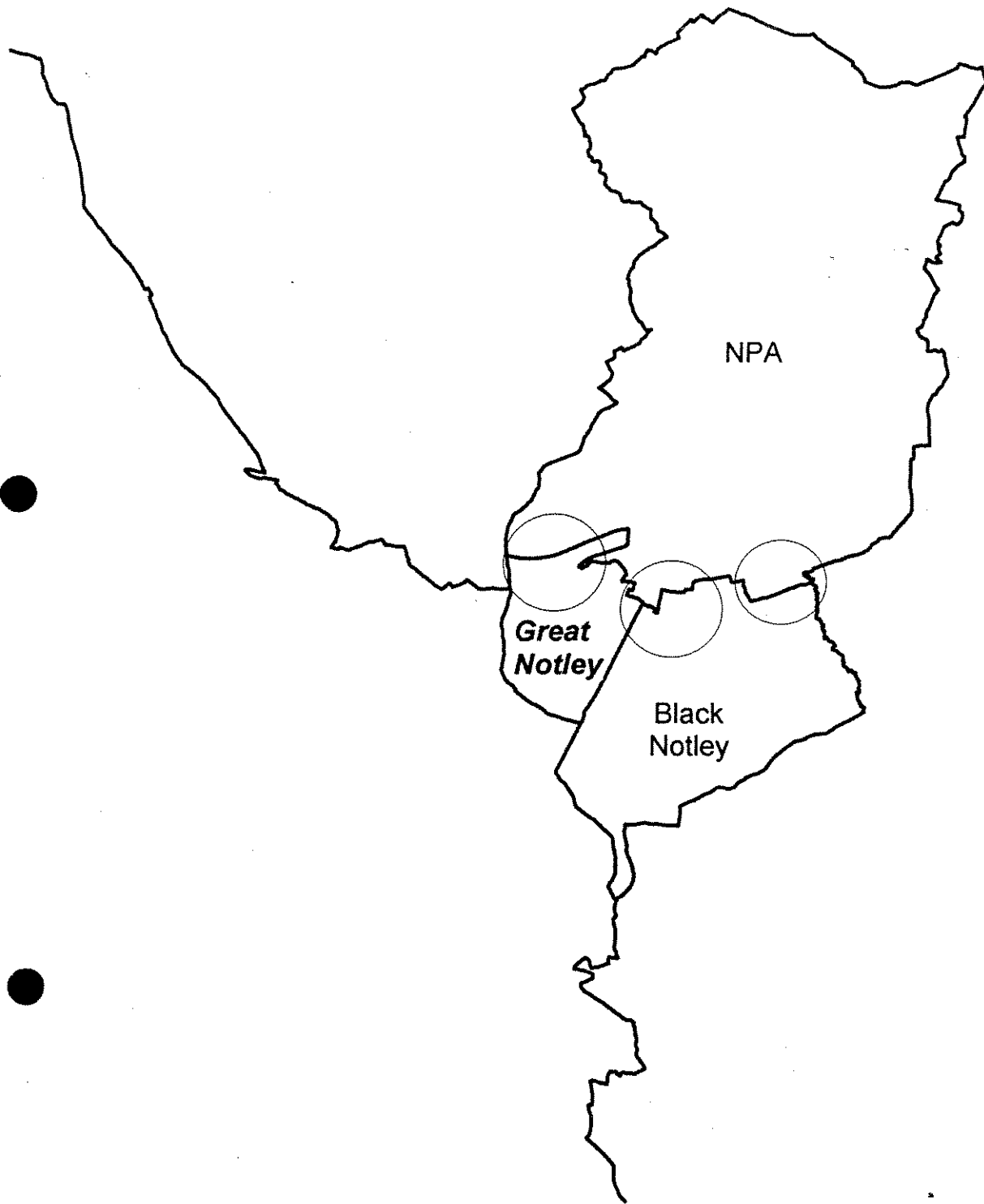
This Order gives effect to a review sent to the Secretary of State, for the creation as a parish of an area within the district of Braintree, the establishment of a parish council for that area and for consequential alterations to the parish of Black Notley. A map forming part of this note gives a general guide to the area concerned.

Article 2 creates the new parish, to be called Great Notley. The new parish comprises the area delineated by a blue line on the Order map.

Article 3 directs the Braintree District Council to establish a parish council for the new parish. 1st April 2000 is specified as the order date for the purposes of the Local Government (Parishes and Parish Councils) Regulations 1999 which makes general provision in relation to orders such as this Order.

Article 4 removes the area of the new parish from the parish of Black Notley and revokes the previous warding arrangements for that parish. It also makes minor alterations to the area of the parish of Black Notley.
