Dear Sirs

I write on behalf of Rawdon Parish Council who represent the residents of Rawdon, Leeds. Rawdon Parish Council was established in November 2012 following a community governance review initiated by residents.

The Parish Council has examined the proposals for ward boundaries in Leeds and wishes to make the following comments:

The Council firmly believes that ward boundaries should be based on communities not the number of electors. The Parish of Rawdon should not be divided across more than one city ward, which it is at present and preferably should be in a one councillor ward based on its individual community boundary. At present the Parish is split across two city council wards with a section of the natural parish boundary being contained within a third ward and excluded from the parish boundary.

In addition the northern boundary of the ward requires minor adjustment so that land and properties south of Bayton Lane and east of the A658 are within the one ward rather than being included in Otley & Yeadon.
