## LOCAL GOVERNMENT, ENGLAND

The Aylesbury Vale (Parishes) Order 2000

Made..... 17<sup>th</sup> November 2000*Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2)*

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 14 and 23 of the Local Government and Rating Act 1997(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order which gives effect, with modifications, to recommendations made to him by Aylesbury Vale District Council, following a review conducted by them in accordance with Part II of that Act, for the alteration of the area of parishes, the amalgamation of two parishes and for the constitution of three new parishes within the district of Aylesbury Vale:

**Citation, commencement and interpretation**

1.- (1) This Order may be cited as the Aylesbury Vale (Parishes) Order 2000.

(2) It shall come into force –

(a) for the purposes of this article, articles 2 and 3 and proceedings preliminary or relating to elections of parish councillors to be held on 3rd May 2001, on the day after that on which it is made;

(b) for all other purposes, on 1st April 2001.

(3) In this Order –

“the new parishes” means the parishes of Aylesbury, Coldharbour and Watermead constituted by article 2;

“the map” means the map prepared by the Department of the Environment, Transport and the Regions, marked “Map of the Aylesbury Vale (Parishes) Order 2000” and deposited in accordance with regulation 6 of the Local Government (Parishes and Parish Councils) Regulations 1999(b); and

any reference to a numbered sheet is a reference to the sheet of the map bearing that number.

### **Constitution of new parishes**

2.- (1) New parishes comprising the areas numbered 1, 2 and 3 and delineated by blue lines on sheet 1 shall be constituted within the district of Aylesbury Vale.

(2) Of the new parishes constituted by paragraph (1) –

- (a) the name of that numbered 1 shall be Aylesbury;
- (b) the name of that numbered 2 shall be Coldharbour; and
- (c) the name of that numbered 3 shall be Watermead.

### **Direction to establish parish councils and consequential provision**

3. - (1) The Aylesbury Vale District Council are hereby directed to establish a parish council for each of the new parishes.

(2) For the purposes of the Local Government (Parishes and Parish Councils) Regulations 1999 –

- (a) 1st April 2001 is the order date; and
- (b) the council of the new parish of Aylesbury is the parish council referred to in paragraphs (2) and (3) of regulation 16 (charter trustees).

### **Transitional provision**

4. - (1) Until the councillors elected to the council of the new parish of Aylesbury at the elections to be held on 3rd May 2001 come into office, the parish shall be represented by those persons who are the elected councillors holding office immediately before 1st April 2001 for the district wards which include the area of the parish.

(2) Until the councillors elected to the council of the new parish of Watermead at the elections to be held on 3rd May 2001 come into office, the parish shall be represented by those persons who are the elected councillors holding office immediately before 1st April 2001 for the district wards which include the area of the parish.

(3) Until the councillors elected to the council of the new parish of Coldharbour at the elections to be held on 3rd May 2001 come into office, the parish shall be represented by those persons who are the elected councillors holding office immediately before 1st April 2001 for the parish of Stone with Bishopstone and Hartwell.

### **Parishes of Luffield Abbey and Lillingstone Dayrell**

5. - (1) The parish of Luffield Abbey shall be abolished.

(2) As a consequence of paragraph (1) the area marked "S" on sheet 2 shall become part of the parish of Lillingstone Dayrell, which shall thereafter be known as the parish of Lillingstone Dayrell with Luffield Abbey.

**Alteration of other parish areas**

6. Each area shaded in blue and designated by a letter on sheet 2 and specified in column (1) of the Schedule shall cease to be part of the parish specified in relation to that area in column (2) and shall become part of the parish so specified in column (3).

EXPLANATORY NOTE  
(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order gives effect, with modifications, to recommendations by the Aylesbury Vale District Council. It creates three new parishes of Aylesbury, Coldharbour and Watermead, in the district of Aylesbury Vale, and abolishes the parish of Luffield Abbey and transfers areas between parishes. The modifications relate to minor boundary changes which address anomalies in parish boundaries. A map forming part of this note gives a general guide to the areas concerned.

Article 2 creates the new parishes of Aylesbury, Coldharbour and Watermead.

Article 3 directs the Aylesbury Vale District Council to establish parish councils for the new parishes. 1st April 2001 is specified as the order date for the purposes of the Local Government (Parishes and Parish Councils) Regulations 1999, which make provision of general application in relation to orders such as this Order. The council of the new parish of Aylesbury will inherit the rights and obligations of the Aylesbury Charter Trustees which will be dissolved in accordance with regulation 16 of those Regulations.

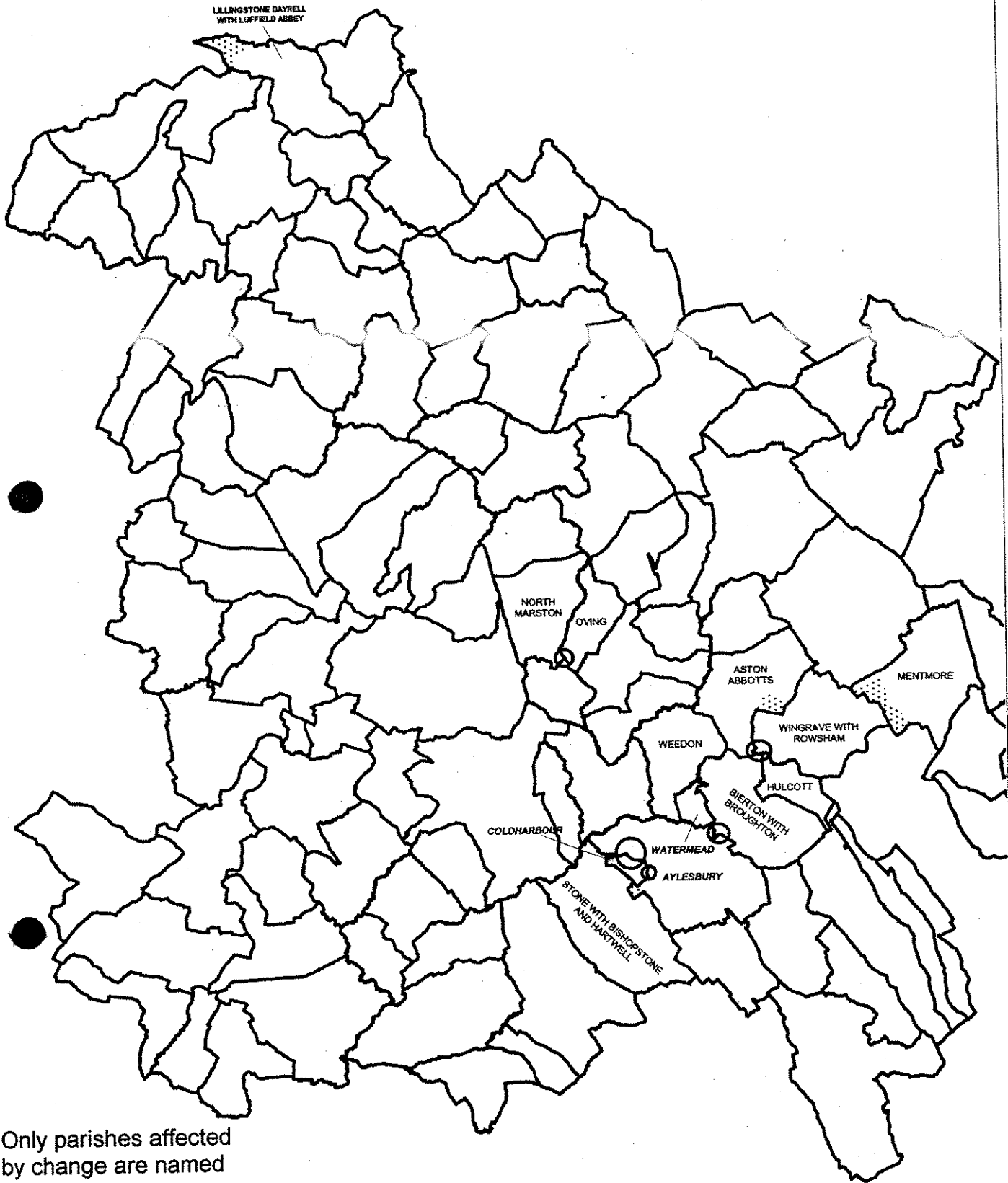
Article 4 provides for the parishes of Aylesbury and Watermead to be represented by the district councillors elected for the district wards which include the areas of the parishes until councillors for the parishes of Aylesbury and Watermead, elected at the election to be held on 3rd May 2001, come into office. It also provides for the parish of Coldharbour to be represented by the parish councillors elected for the parish of Stone with Bishopstone and Hartwell until councillors for the parish of Coldharbour, elected at the election to be held on 3rd May 2001, come into office.

Article 5 abolishes the parish of Luffield Abbey and adds its area to the parish of Lillingstone Dayrell. As a result of this change the parish of Lillingstone Dayrell is renamed Lillingstone Dayrell with Luffield Abbey.

Article 6 makes alterations to the areas of parishes. On 1st April 2001 each area specified in column (1) of the Schedule to the Order will cease to be part of the parish specified in column (2) and will become part of the parish specified in column (3).
