CHANGES IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS

The Peterborough (Parishes) Order 1984

Made	1st March 1984
Coming into Operation— for the purposes described in article 2(1)	5th March 1984
for all other purposes	1st April 1984

Whereas the City Council of Peterborough, acting pursuant to section 48(8) of the Local Government Act 1972(a), has made recommendations to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England for proposals about parishes in the city;

And whereas the said Commission has seen fit, pursuant to sections 47, 48(9) and 51(1) of that Act, on 13th October 1982, to make the recommended proposals to the Secretary of State:

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to those proposals without modification:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of the said Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Title and Commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Peterborough (Parishes) Order 1984.

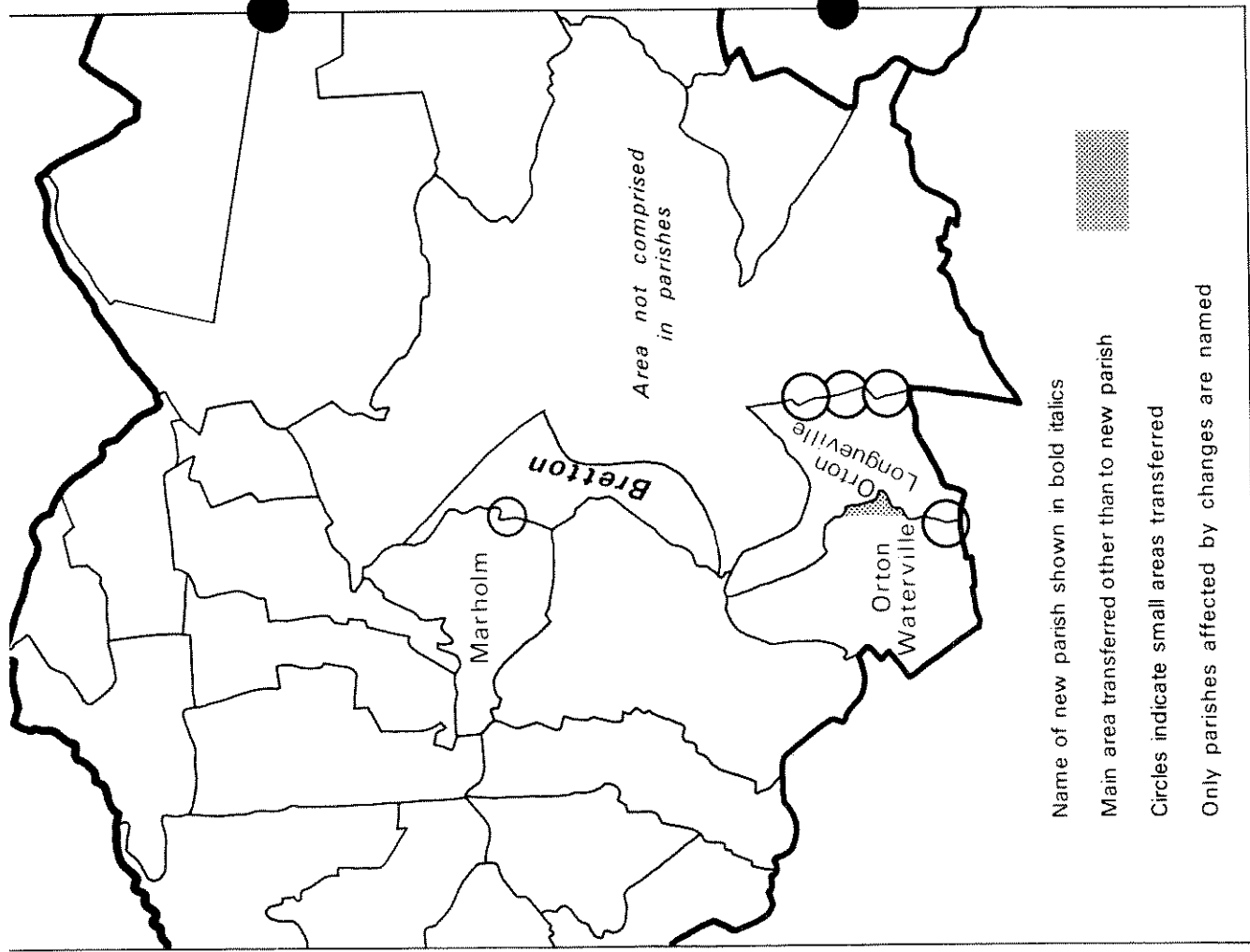
2.— (1) 5th March 1984 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Regulations as modified by paragraph (2).

(2) In the said regulation 4(1), item (e) shall not apply in relation to the constitution of the new parish council.

(3) Except as provided by paragraph (1), this order shall come into operation on 1st April 1984.

(3) Parish councillors for the new parish shall be elected on 3rd May 1984. Such elections shall be conducted in accordance with rules made under section 36 of the Representation of the People Act 1983(a).

(4) The persons elected as councillors as the result of the said elections shall come into office on 7th May 1984, and shall retire on the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1988.

Parish meeting for new parish

6.—(1) The first assembly of the parish meeting for the new parish shall be convened by the proper officer of the city council.

(2) If such a first assembly is held before the annual meeting of the parish council for the new parish, the parish meeting may appoint a person to take the chair, and that person shall have, for the purposes of that meeting, the powers and authority of the chairman.

Expenses of the new parish council

7. In the year beginning on 1st April 1984 the city council shall, as and when requested by the parish council, make payments to the parish council to defray its expenditure, the total payments not to exceed a sum equal to the product of a rate of 0.34p in the pound calculated on the total rateable value as set out in the valuation list on 1st April 1984.

City ward boundaries

8.—(1) That area of the city shown coloured blue on boundary map 1a shall be transferred to the Walton ward of the city.

(2) That area of the city shown coloured green on boundary map 1a shall be transferred to the Werrington ward of the city.

Statutory definitions of areas

9. In any application of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) (statutory definitions of areas) of regulation 40 of the Regulations, the areas to which article 4(2) applies shall be deemed to have been added to the area of the former urban district of Old Fleetton, and the area to which article 4(3) applies shall be deemed to have ceased to form part of such area, and that part of the parish of Marholm mentioned in article 4(1) shall be deemed to have been added to the area of the former city of Peterborough.

Interpretation

3. In this order—
“the boundary maps” means the 10 maps issued by the Department of the Environment in 3 sheets, each sheet being marked “Map sheet of the Peterborough (Parishes) Order 1984” and with the number of the map sheet, and each map being marked with a letter, any reference to a map by number and letter being a reference to the map so lettered on the sheet so numbered;
“the city” means the city of Peterborough and “the city council” means the council of the city;

“the county” means the county of Cambridgeshire;
“the new parish” means the parish of Breton constituted by this order;
“the parish council” means the parish council of the new parish; and
“the Regulations” means the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976(a).

Changes in areas

4.—(1) A new parish to be known as the parish of Breton shall be constituted, comprising those unparished parts of the city and that part of the parish of Marholm shown by a continuous red line on boundary maps 1a and 2a. The said part of the parish of Marholm shall be transferred to the Breton ward of the city. Save for that transfer, no changes are made by this subparagraph to the boundaries of any ward of the city or electoral division of the county. The new parish shall remain or form part of the Peterborough petty sessional division and of the Peterborough coroner’s district.

(2) Those parts of the parish of Orton Longueville shown coloured pink and marked B1 and B2 on boundary maps 3a, 3b and 3c shall cease to form part of any parish, but shall form part of the Fletton ward of the city and of the Old Fletton No. 1 electoral division of the county.

(3) The unparished part of the city shown coloured green and marked C on boundary maps 3b and 3c shall form part of the parish of Orton Longueville, of the Orton Longueville ward of the city and of the Peterborough No. 9 electoral division of the county.

(4) The parts of parishes described in column (1) of the Schedule hereto and marked on the boundary maps as specified in column (2) shall, in so far as parishes, electoral divisions of the county and wards of the city are specified in respect thereof in columns (3) to (5) thereof be transferred to or form part of such areas.

(5) The annual meeting of the parish council for the new parish for 1984 shall be held in May 1984 and shall be convened by the proper officer of the city council.

(6) From 1st April 1984 to 7th May 1984, the parish council of Breton shall consist of the councillors for the Breton and West wards of the city.

New parish council

5.—(1) There shall be a parish council for the new parish.

(2) As from 3rd May 1984, the new parish shall be divided into the four

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order.)

This order affects parishes in the city of Peterborough. It—

- (a) constitutes a new parish called Breton from unparished parts of the city and part of the parish of Marholm;
- (b) transfers areas as between the parish of Orton Longueville and the unparished parts of the city; and
- (c) transfers areas as between parishes.

The new parish will have approximately an area of 419 hectares a population of 12,370 and a rateable value of £1,537,531.

The order establishes a parish council for the new parish.

The map forming part of this note (page 6) shows the areas affected as from 1st April 1984. Prints of the boundary maps referred to in article 3 of the order may be inspected at the offices of the city council, and purchased from the Department of the Environment’s Map Library.

Incidental, consequential, transitional and supplementary provisions for orders such as the present one is made by the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 (see article 3).
