Coming into Operation -  
for the purposes described  
in article 2(1) ..... 1st January 1987  
for all other purposes ..... 1st April 1987

Whereas the Uttlesford District Council, acting pursuant to section 48(8) of the Local Government Act 1972 (a), has made recommendations to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England for proposals about parishes in the district:

And whereas in consequence of those recommendations the Commission has seen fit, pursuant to sections 47, 48(9) and 51(1) of that Act, to make proposals to the Secretary of State:

And whereas more than six weeks has elapsed since those proposals were made:

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to the proposals:

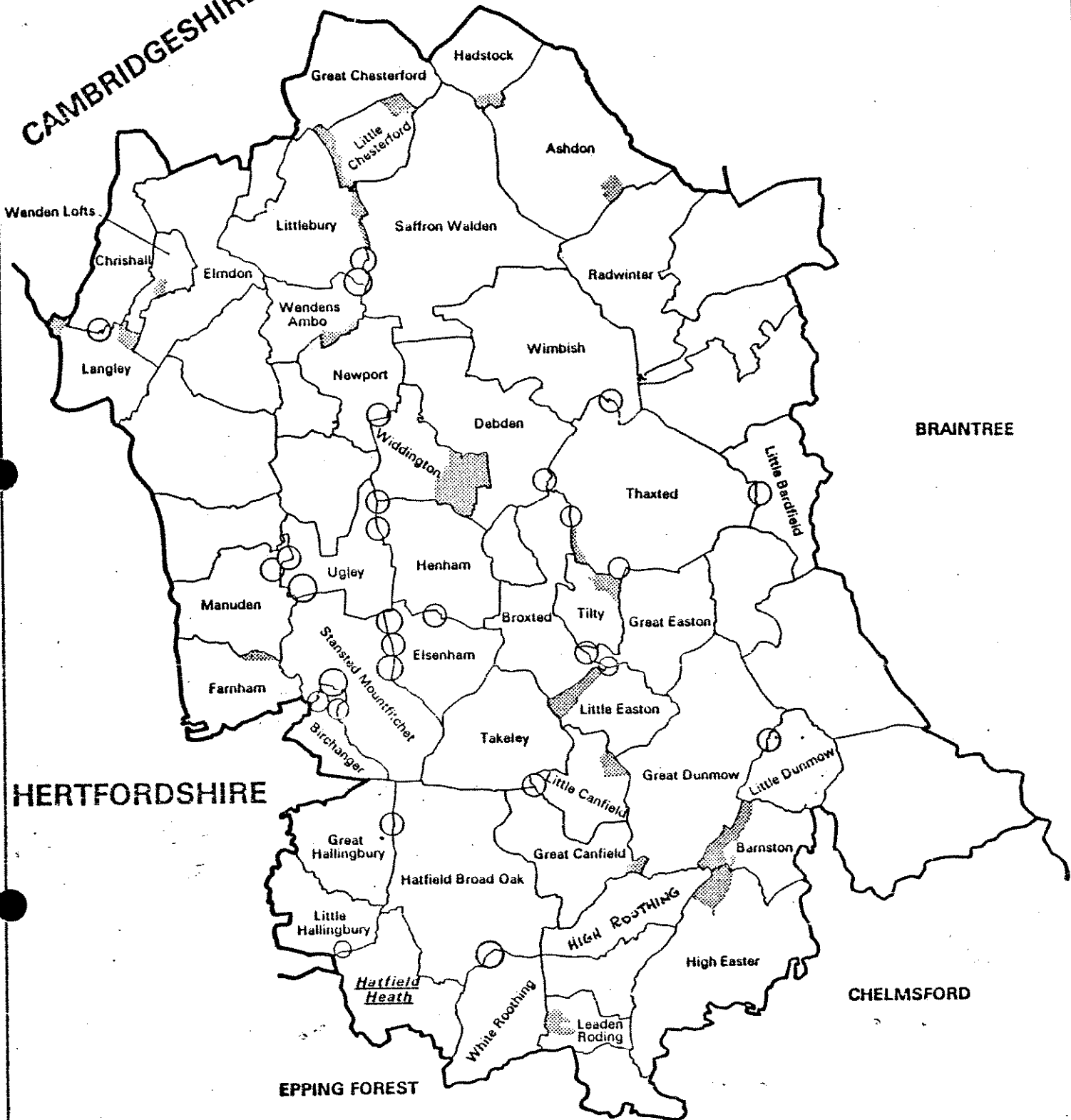
Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of that Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:-

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Uttlesford (Parishes) Order 1986.

2. - (1) 1st January 1987 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 (a).

(2) For all other purposes, this order shall come into operation on 1st April 1987.

### Interpretation

3. In this order -

"boundary maps" means the 25 maps prepared by the Department of the Environment, marked "Maps of the Uttlesford (Parishes) Order 1986", duly numbered for reference, and deposited in accordance with regulation 5 of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976;

"county electoral division" means an electoral division of the county of Essex;

"district council" means the Uttlesford District Council; and

"district ward" means a ward of the district of Uttlesford.

### Creation of new parish

4.- (1) There shall be created in the district of Uttlesford a new parish of Hatfield Heath, which shall consist of -

(a) that part of the parish of Hatfield Broad Oak which is marked D1 on boundary map 1; and

(b) that part of the parish of Little Hallingbury which is marked D2 on boundary map 1.

(2) In consequence of the creation of the new parish, the area named in paragraph 1(b) above and the areas marked DW2 and DW3 on boundary map 1 shall be transferred to the Hatfield Heath district ward, and the area marked DW1 on boundary map 1 shall be transferred to the Hatfield Broad Oak district ward.

Parish council for the new parish

5. - (1) There shall be a parish council for the new parish of Hatfield Heath.

(2) From 1st April 1987 until the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1987 the parish council for the new parish shall consist of the parish councillors representing the Hatfield Heath ward of the parish of Hatfield Broad Oak immediately before 1st April 1987. Thereafter it is to consist of 7 parish councillors.

(3) The proper officer of the district council shall convene -

the first annual meeting of the parish council for the new parish; and

the first assembly of the parish meeting for the new parish.

If in the new parish the first assembly of the parish meeting is held before the first annual meeting of the parish council, the parish meeting may appoint a person to take the chair, who shall have, for the purpose of that occasion only, the powers and authority of a chairman.

(4) In the financial year beginning on 1st April 1987, the district council shall levy rates in the new parish, and make payments to the parish council, as if that parish council had issued a precept to the district council requiring the payment of a sum equal to the product of a rate of 2 pence in the pound calculated on the total rateable value of the new parish as set out in the valuation list at the beginning of that financial year.

Electoral arrangements for the parish of Hatfield Broad Oak

6. From 1st April 1987 until the fourth day after the ordinary day of elections in 1987 the parish of Hatfield Broad Oak shall be represented by the parish councillors representing the Hatfield Bush End and Hatfield Broad Oak wards of that parish immediately before 1st April 1987. Thereafter the parish ward of Hatfield Broad Oak shall include that part of the Hatfield Heath parish ward not contained within the new parish of Hatfield Heath, and shall be represented by 6 parish councillors, and the Hatfield Bush End ward shall be represented by 1 parish councillor.

Transfers between parishes

7. - (1) Each area marked on the boundary maps as shown in columns 1 and 2 of the Schedule hereto shall be transferred from the relevant parish named in column 3 to that named in column 4.

(2) Where in column 5 there is mentioned in relation to any area -

- (a) a parish ward;
- (b) a district ward;
- (c) a county electoral division; or
- (d) a petty sessional division;

that area shall additionally be transferred to that ward or division.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order.)

This order affects parishes in the district of Uttlesford by -

- (a) creating a new parish of Hatfield Heath from part of the parish of Hatfield Broad Oak; and
- (b) transferring areas between parishes.

A parish council is established for the new parish.

The map forming part of this note (page 11) gives a general guide to the areas affected by this order as from 1st April 1987.

Prints of the detailed boundary maps which are referred to in article 3 may be inspected at the offices of Uttlesford District Council, and may be inspected at or purchased from the Department of the Environment's Map Library, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB.

The new parish of Hatfield Heath will have approximately an area of 1,088 hectares, a population of 1,550, and a rateable value of £201,000.

Consequential changes to local government electoral areas are made.

The Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976, mentioned in articles 2(1) and 3, contain further provisions about the effect and implementation of orders such as the present one.
