The Mid Suffolk (Parishes) Order 1981

Made - - - - 9th December 1981

Coming into Operation—
for the purposes described in article 2 - 1st January 1982

for all other purposes - 1st April 1982

Whereas the District Council of Mid Suffolk, under section 48(8) of the Local Government Act 1972(a), made recommendations to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England for proposals in relation to parishes in the district;

And whereas the said Commission, under sections 47 and 51(1) of the said Act, on 19th August 1980, made such proposals to the Secretary of State for the Environment;

Now therefore the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of the said Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Mid Suffolk (Parishes) Order 1981.

2. 1st January 1982 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purposes set out in regulation 4(1) (Coming into operation of order) of the Regulations.

For all other purposes this order shall come into operation on the appointed day.

Interpretation

3. In this order—

“the appointed day” means 1st April 1982;

“the county” means the County of Suffolk;

“the district” means the District of Mid Suffolk, and “the district council” means the council of the district; and

“the common parish council” means the Brome and Oakley Parish Council;

“the new parish” means the Parish of Brome and Oakley constituted by this order;

"the new parish council" means the parish council of the new parish; and
"the Regulations" means the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976(a) as amended by the Local Government Area Changes (Amendment) Regulations 1978(b).

The boundary maps

4. In this order—
"the boundary maps" means the 17 maps printed for Her Majesty's Stationery Office by Ordnance Survey, each such map being marked "Map referred to in the Mid Suffolk (Parishes) Order 1981" and with the number of the map; and
any reference to a numbered boundary map is a reference to the map described and numbered as aforesaid.

Changes in areas

5.—(1) The Parishes of Brome and Oakley shall be amalgamated to constitute a new parish to be known as the Parish of Brome and Oakley. The new parish shall remain part of the Hartismere No. 2 electoral division of the county, of the Palgrave ward of the district, of the Hartismere petty sessional division and of the Lowestoft coroner's district.

(2) The parts of parishes described in column (1) of the Schedule to this order and marked on the boundary maps as specified in column (2) shall, in so far as parishes, electoral divisions of the county and wards of the district are specified in respect thereof in columns (3) to (5), be transferred to or form part of such areas. The areas transferred to the Parish of Stowmarket shall form part of the North ward of the parish. The areas marked A4 and A28 on boundary map 4 shall form part of the Slow petty sessional division. The area so marked A29 shall form part of the St. Edmundsbury petty sessional division.

Dissolution of parish authorities

6. The common parish council and the Parish Meetings and Parish Trustees of Brome and Oakley shall be dissolved. For the purposes of any provision of the Regulations which refer to the residuary successor of a dissolved authority, the new parish council is hereby specified as the residuary successor of such authorities.

New parish council

7.—(1) There shall be a parish council for the new parish.

(2) The new parish shall be divided into two parish wards to be known as Brome and Oakley which shall respectively comprise the areas of the corresponding existing parishes. The number of councillors for each parish ward shall be 4.

(3) Any person in office at the appointed day as parish councillor for the Parish of Brome or Oakley shall represent the Brome or Oakley ward, as the case may be, of the new parish until the date on which he would have retired if this order had not been made. Any casual vacancy which exists at the coming into operation of this order or occurs before the appointed day in the office of councillor for either such parish shall (except where notice of the election has at the coming into operation of this order already been given) be deemed to have

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This order—

(a) amalgamates the Parishes of Brome and Oakley, in the District of Mid Suffolk, to constitute the Parish of Brome and Oakley;

(b) effects the transfer of parts of parishes, in the district, to other parishes.

The map forming part of this note (see folded sheet) shows the areas covered by (a) and (b). This map also incorporates a grid identifying the maps referred to in article 4 of the order.

The Parish of Brome and Oakley will have approximately an area of 895 hectares, a population of 420 and a rateable value of £43,180.

Prints of the maps referred to in article 4 of the order may be inspected at the offices of the district council. Prints may be purchased from the Department of the Environment's Map Library.

Incidental, consequential, transitional and supplementary provision in consequence of orders of the nature of the present one is contained in the Regulations defined in article 3 of the order.

(4) The annual meeting of the new parish shall be convened by the officer appointed for that purpose by the district council.

Parish meeting

8.—(1) The first assembly of the parish meeting for the new parish shall be convened by the officer appointed for that purpose by the district council.

(2) If such first assembly is held before the annual meeting of the new parish council, the parish meeting may appoint a person to take the chair, and that person shall have, for the purposes of that meeting, the powers and authority of the chairman.

Expenses of new parish council

9. In the year beginning on the appointed day the district council may, if they think fit, levy rates in the new parish and make payments to the new parish council as if the new parish council had issued a precept to the district council requiring the payment of a sum not exceeding the product of a rate of 2p in the pound calculated on the total rateable value as set out in the valuation list on the appointed day.

Local Acts, orders and byelaws

10. The Parishes of Brome and Oakley are hereby specified in relation to paragraph (4) of regulation 41 (Local Acts, orders and byelaws) of the Regulations and the new parish is hereby specified in relation to such parishes.

Property, liabilities, contracts, etc., notices and proceedings

11. In relation to the areas marked A5 and A6 on boundary maps 15 and 17 the Regulations shall have effect as if the expression "parish authority for a parish" in the Table to Schedule 6 thereof included the Claydon and Whitton Parish Council.

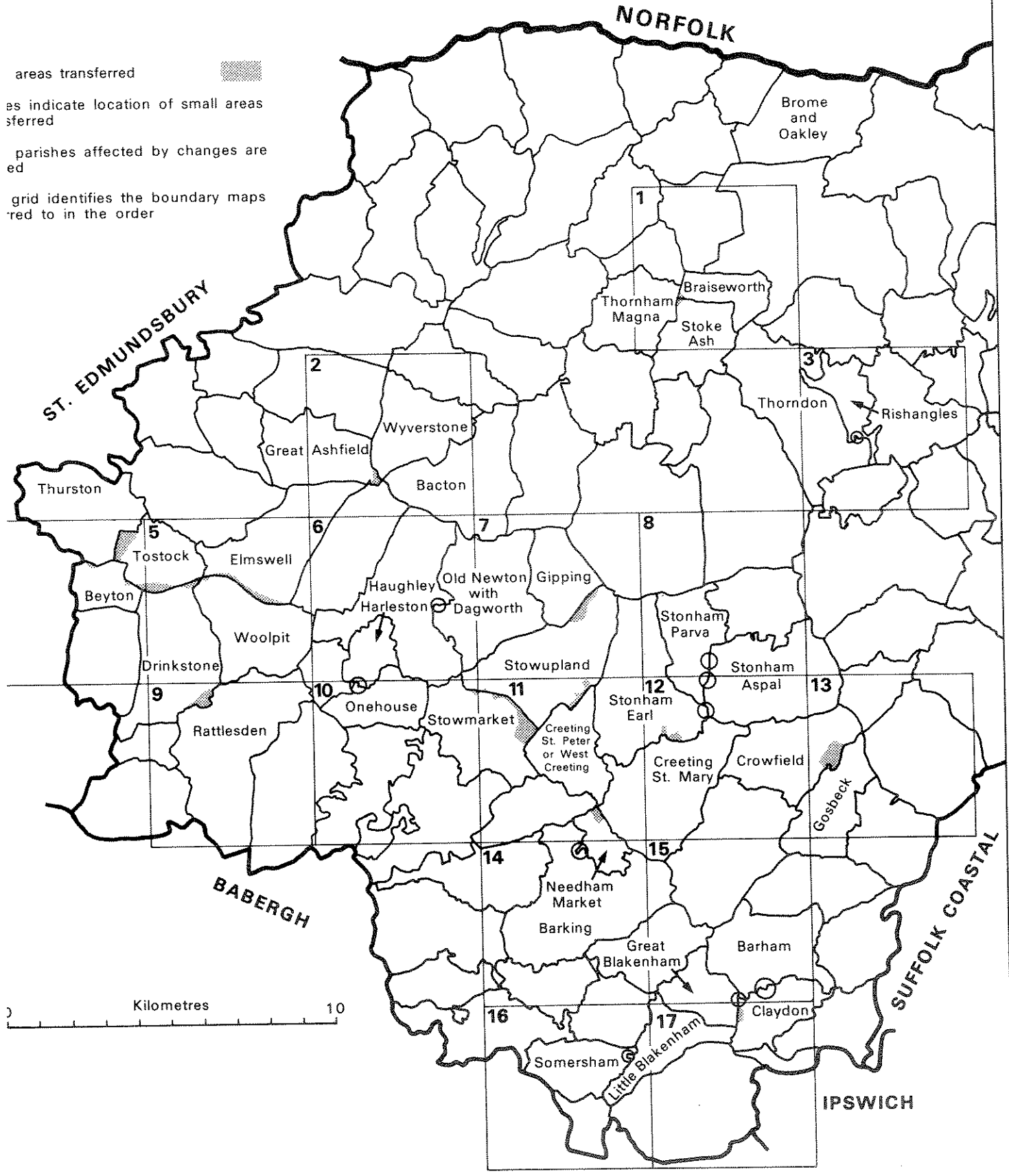
