

ROMAN POTTERY BIBLIOGRAPHY

Edited by R. P. Symonds

This is the first edition of what is hoped will be a permanent feature in the Journal, a bibliography of recent publications which in any serious way contribute to the study of Roman pottery in Britain. When the present editor was appointed by the Roman Pottery Study Group to bring the idea to fruition it was decided that the first issue would attempt to cover all the relevant material from "1982 to the present," although "the present" has advanced somewhat since then. The bibliography which follows has actually been compiled by a number of contributors, whose names appear at the beginning of each county for which they have been responsible. Just over half the counties of England are represented in this first edition; the time required of the various contributors, and the limitations of space in the *Journal* are such that it is unlikely that all counties (plus Scotland, North and South Wales, and national journals and books) will be represented every year, but every effort will be made to ensure that no county is omitted two years running. It is hoped that beginning next year there will be a further heading of "foreign publications" (with reference to Roman pottery studies in Britain).

Most of the contributors have used a standardized sheet on which to record their entries, a facsimile of the latest edition of which appears on the following page. This is certainly not yet a complete list for any of the encoded categories: the counties not covered this year will undoubtedly contribute new pottery types to next year's edition, and contributors are encouraged to add new listings whenever they are referred to. The purpose of the codes is to shorten the actual entries to a manageable length: to facilitate the use of the bibliography by readers wishing to trace occurrences of particular types of pottery, an index is provided at the end by fabric types. (If there is sufficient interest this will be extended to the other encoded categories in the next issue).

The bibliography is arranged by authors, which usually means the author(s) of the pottery-related part of an entry. It has been difficult to be wholly consistent in the manner of presentation of articles or books which include a number of specialist reports on specific pottery types, because in some instances the specialist reports appear to be deserving of an entry to themselves, where elsewhere it may be more appropriate merely to list their presence, and refer the reader to the main entry. In either treatment the page numbers for the specialist reports are contained in the main entry. In an entry which is solely "the pottery" in a larger article in a periodical, the page numbers of the larger article appear in brackets, followed by those of the pottery report itself. Following the publication details are two lines of codes: the first of these is strictly in the order:

subject matter / site type / date range / qualifications

The second line of codes is that of the fabrics. These may occasionally include some qualifications, such as dates, which do not appear in the index.

Following the codes are the comments, if any, of the contributor, and the location, if known, of the pottery reported on.
