VAT liability of charges to overseas customers for non-elective treatment.

(The issue of *elective* (non-urgent) treatment is considered to be business activities that are exempt healthcare.)

HMRC opinion on VAT treatment of these supplies

HMRC accepts that the provision of non-elective (urgent and necessary) treatment to overseas visitors is provided under a duty to treat and are charged for under restrictions that the NHS are legally obliged to enforce. They are therefore non-business activities that are outside the scope of VAT.

HMRC does not consider this a change of policy

Claims for refunds of VAT and COS VAT

Some NHS Trusts will have interpreted the guidance published by DHSC that the income stream was exempt from VAT and accounted for it accordingly.

Customers reviewing their treatment of these supplies may seek a refund of tax from HMRC. Any claims under VATA S41 (3) must be made within the COS time limits. (HMRC guidance in VATGPB 9720 applies)



Any claims for Input Tax are subject to the normal time limits (Notice 700/45 refers).
