


Introduction


ThinCats conducts an annual survey of 2,000 SMEs to better understand sentiment of business leaders throughout the UK, the challenges they are facing and their outlook for growth. This latest survey was conducted between 15 and 20 October 2025.


The following report is split into two sections, the first outlining views on the economic environment in the UK, government policy and general business confidence. The second section explores uptake and use of external funding and access to finance.

















Business Confidence





Net: % confident




- 3 in 4 businesses are confident that their business will grow over the coming year. A slight decrease from 81% who reported feeling confident in 2024.
- Confidence differs widely by sector.
- Businesses in London are more confident than the rest of the UK – with the South West the least confident.
- Younger respondents and businesses tend to be more confident about future growth.

Q2. Which of the following are the greatest challenges to your business's growth?



Growth Challenges

(Split by size of business)




- Inflation, skills shortages, balancing investment and global tariff uncertainty are challenges being felt far more acutely among businesses operating in the mid-market.
- Access to finance and higher borrowing costs are slightly bigger challenges among smaller businesses – particularly sole traders.
- While general economic conditions are a significant challenge across the SME spectrum; it is only the most frequently cited challenges among firms with fewer than 10 employees.



Business Environment







- Only 39% of SMEs are confident that the current government is creating an environment for business growth – this is down from 49% in 2024.
- Older respondents are far less confident than younger generations.
- Mid-sized firms are far more confident than microbusinesses and sole traders.
- Men are more confident than women.

Impact of Autumn 2024 Budget




- Only 39% of SMEs believe that the measures introduced in last Autumn's Budget impacted their business finances positively.
- Conversely, 35% feel the changes had a negative impact.
- Older respondents are far less likely to state that the changes had a positive impact on their business finances.
- The same is true for sole traders and micro businesses, while there are also sectoral and geographic differences.

Impact of Autumn 2024 Budget


Q5. And in which of the following ways have the changes impacted your business?



- Of those stating that the previous Autumn Budget announcements negatively impacted their business – the key impact has been on paused recruitment (40%) and negative impact on growth (35%).
- Pausing on recruitment, planned investment and planned acquisitions is felt more acutely among mid-sized firms.
- Conversely, negative impacts on growth and higher borrowing costs are felt more acutely among sole traders.

Q6. Which have you implemented as a direct response to the additional costs placed on firms in last year's Budget?




Q7. Which of the following policy measures do you think would be beneficial to see in the upcoming Autumn Statement?

Q8. When, if ever, was the last time your business secured external debt funding?




Purpose of External Funding

Q9. What was the business purpose for the external funding you secured?







Q12. How likely, if at all, are you to seek further debt funding in the next 12 months?








Influence of Previous Barriers
