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2019 Highlights

2019 highlights

Strong operational performance with significant distributions to shareholders

- Average gross production in 2019 of 32,883 bopd in line with guidance
- Robust safety performance during a period of increased operational activity
- Progress on 55,000 bopd expansion restart of drilling activities,
 successful workovers, facilities expansion, full crude export by pipeline
- Achieved capital expenditures, operating costs and G&A costs guidance
- Maiden dividend and share buyback programmes returned US\$79 million to shareholders; plus US\$20 million buyback in Q1 2020
- ESG programme in place targeting to reduce emissions by >50% by 2025



The story of 2020 so far

Decisive actions to preserve liquidity and protect value

- Unprecedented volatility and uncertainty
 - COVID-19 pandemic and macro-economic deterioration
 - Brent oil price down over 70% since start of year, reaching sub US\$20/bbl
 - Delay in payments from KRG
- Concrete steps to preserve liquidity and protect value
 - Cash balance of US\$164 million⁽¹⁾
 - Drilling and expansion activities stopped team demobilised
 - Were on track to deliver 55,000 bopd in Q3 2020
 - Targeting Opex and G&A savings of at least 20%; 60% expat workforce decrease
 - Guidance suspended
 - Monitoring market dynamics ready to take further action
- KRG commitment to pay for production by 15th day of following month
 - Started with March 2020 production, paid mid-April
 - Dialogue with the KRG to collect outstanding invoices for November 2019 to February 2020 (total US\$73 million net to GKP)

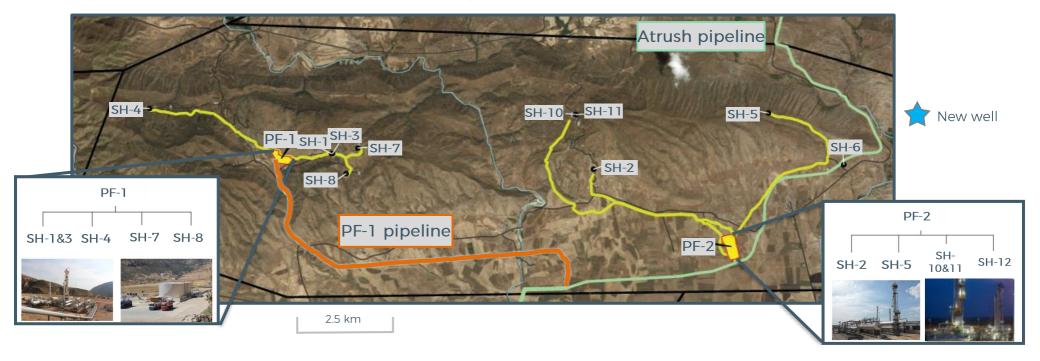




Operational Review

2019 activity at Shaikan

Strong momentum toward 55,000 bopd in Q3 2020



- Debottlenecking activities nearly completed at PF-1 and PF-2
- Completion of PF-1 pipeline marking the end of export by trucking
- Tubing workovers on SH-1 and SH-3 wells resulted in material production uplifts
- SH-12 drilled and brought online in November
- SH-9 well, originally designed to test the reservoir crest, ultimately completed as an oil producer
- Drilling of SH-13 and other expansion activities suspended in March 2020

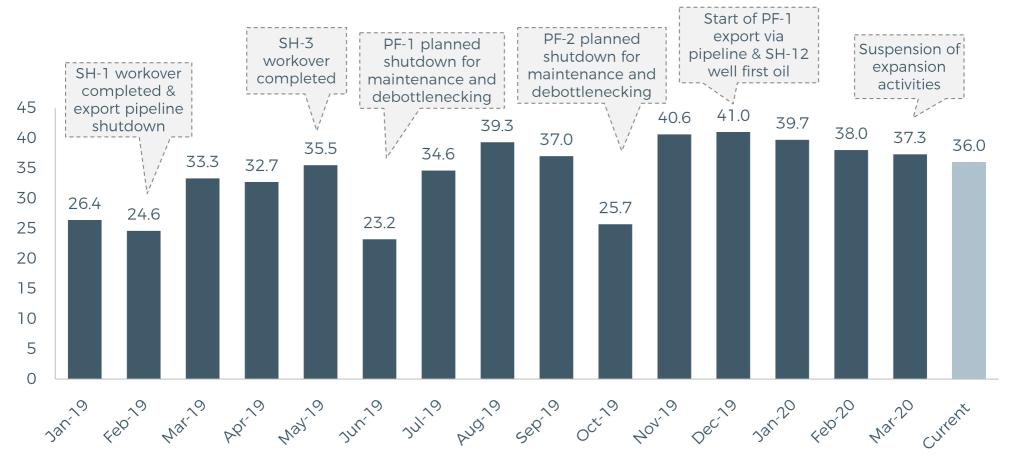


Shaikan production

Continued production with strong focus on cost reductions

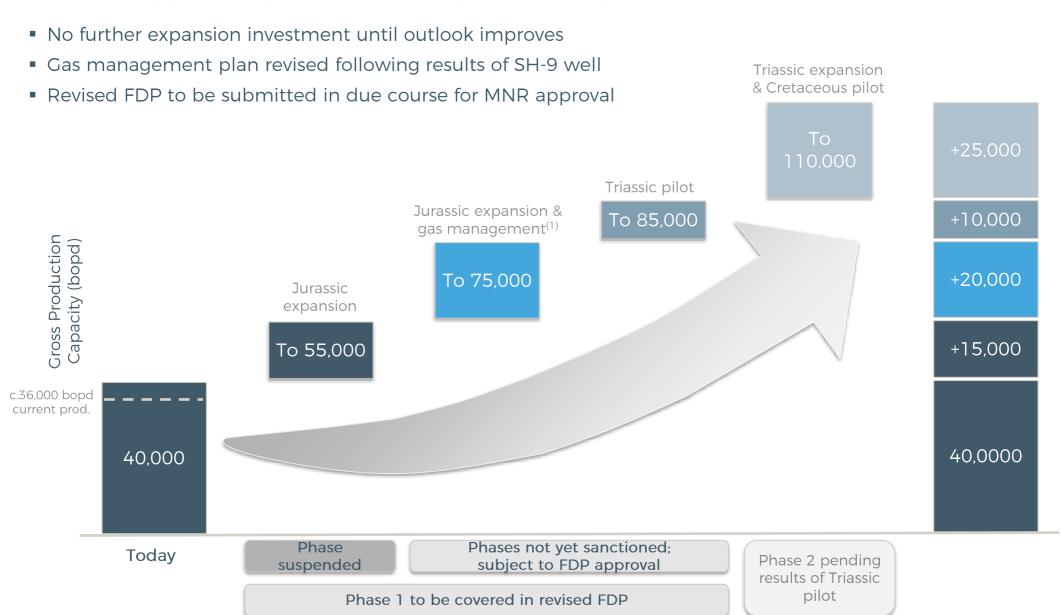
- Average gross production in 2019 of 32,883 bopd, in line with guidance

- Reduced development and maintenance activity has impacted recent production rates

- Detailed policies and practices in place to ensure Board and managerial decisions are in the best interests of the Company and its stakeholders



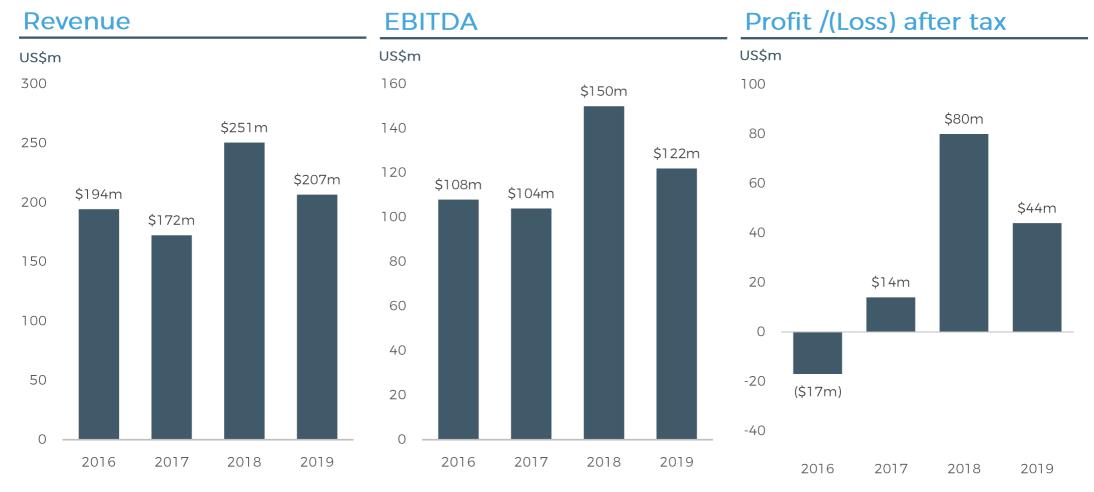


Financial Review

2019 financials

Solid operational performance offset by oil price decline

 Despite growth in production, key financials down y-o-y as Brent oil prices averaged US\$64/bbl in 2019 (vs. US\$71/bbl in 2018)



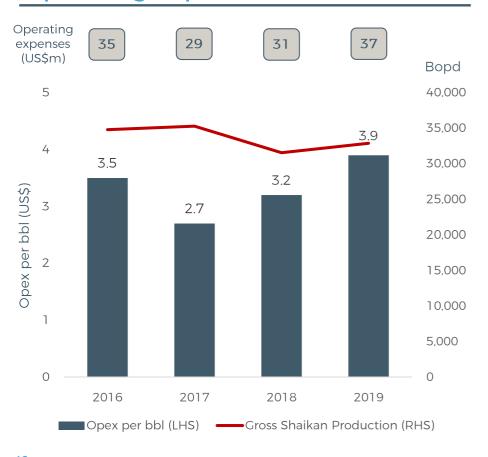
Continued focus on costs

2019 Opex and G&A at low end of guidance

- Well placed to navigate through these challenging macro-economic conditions
- 2020 costs reduction initiatives targeting Opex and G&A savings of at least 20% and reduction of expatriate workforce by c.60%

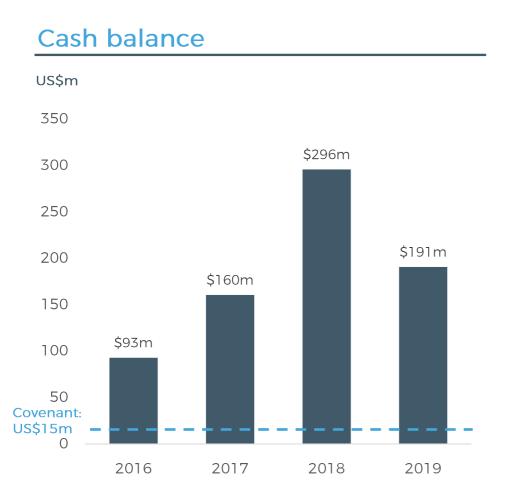


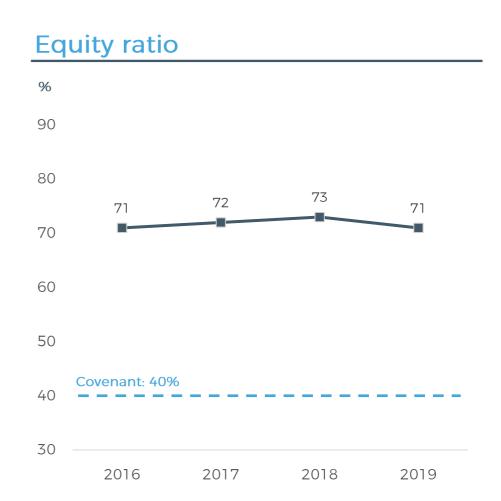


Strong balance sheet

Continued focus on maintaining a strong financial position

- Limited capital commitments and low-cost structure
- No repayment of US\$100m bond until July 2023; significant covenant headroom
- Cash balance of US\$164 million⁽¹⁾

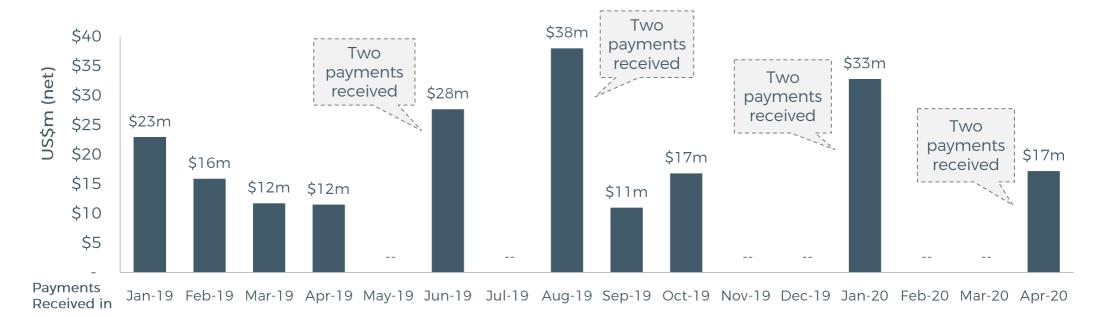




Crude oil payments

Outlook

Preserving liquidity and positioning to exploit long-term Shaikan value

Robust financial position

- Cash balance of US\$164 million⁽¹⁾
- Targeting major costs reductions to preserve liquidity
 - c.50% y-o-y reduction in 2020 net Capex of US\$40-48 million
 - Opex and G&A savings of at least 20%
 - Reducing expatriate workforce by c.60%

Focus on value preservation

- Adapting operations in response to the challenging environment
 - Continue to closely monitor market dynamics ready to take further actions
- Resumption of expansion activity once macro-economic conditions improve and resolution of outstanding payments from the KRG

Sustainable approach

- Once MNR has approved FDP and investment programme restarts, gas management plan activities will start with preparation for FEED
- Target to gradually halve CO₂ emissions by 2025



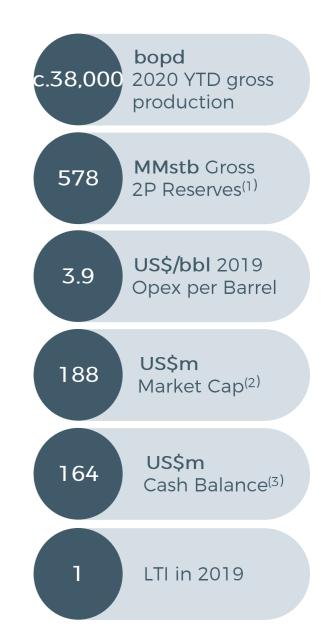
